International Travel and Tourism - 1st Quarter 1996

Passenger Traffic

(i) Total

During the first quarter of 1996, Mauritius registered a total of 144,500 passenger arrivals against 152,500 departures, i.e. an excess of 8,000 departures over arrivals. Compared to the first quarter of 1995, these figures represented an increase of 12.1% in arrivals and 7.6% in departures.

(ii) Mauritian residents

International movements of Mauritian residents represented 16% of total arrivals and 17% of total departures, the respective figures being 23,100 and 25,900 respectively. These figures, compared to the first quarter of 1995, showed increases of 4% in arrivals and 2% in departures.

The major country visited was Reunion Island which accounted for 29% of total departures. Other major countries visited were, in order of importance: United Kingdom (13%), France (13%), India (10%), Republic of South Africa (10%), Singapore (7%) and Australia (4%).

Tourist Arrivals

Total tourist arrivals for the first quarter of 1996 numbered 115,300 compared to 102,200 for the corresponding period of 1995, i.e. an increase of nearly 13%. Besides, about 2,600 excursionists or "same day" visitors, i.e. those arriving and leaving on the same day, visited the country during that period.

"Holiday tourists" accounted for 93.1% of the total tourist arrivals, while 3.3% were attributed to business purposes and 2.6% to transit passengers.

Arrivals from Europe recorded an increase of 17.4% during the first quarter of 1996 compared to 1995. Nearly all European markets witnessed double-digit growth. Major markets such as France (+13.4%), United Kingdom (+7.2%) and Germany (+10.6%) registered encouraging performances during that period. Arrivals from Switzerland went up by 29.6% and from Italy by 19.7%. However, arrivals from Spain were fewer (-24.8%).

Among the minor and emerging European markets, arrivals from Austria nearly doubled (+97.9%) while those from Belgium and Sweden increased by 74.8% and 71.4% respectively.

Tourist arrivals from Africa rose by 4.6%, contributed mostly by a 24% increase from the Republic of South Africa. Positive performances were also recorded from two minor and neighbouring markets: Malagasy Republic (+53.6%) and Seychelles (+44.7%). On the other hand, fewer arrivals were registered from Reunion Island (-4.5%), our major short haul market.

The Asian market grew by 8.9% with favorable performances from all countries except the People's Republic of China (a decline of 183 in tourist arrivals). The number of arrivals from India grew by 9.3%, from Hong Kong by 46.5%, from Malaysia by 32.1%, from Japan by 7.6% and from Singapore by 5.7%.

Oceania recorded a remarkable growth of 41.2% with an increase of 42.3% in arrivals from Australia.

Tourist arrivals from North America have shown signs of improvement in the first quarter of 1996 compared to 1995: the U.S. market went up by 16.6% while the Canadian market expanded by 23.4%.

Tourist Nights

Total tourist nights spent in the country during the first quarter of 1996 is estimated at 1.2 million, representing an increase of 13% over the corresponding quarter of last year.

Hotel Statistics

At the end of March 1996, there were 95 registered hotels in operation, with a total room capacity of 6,450 and 13,300 bedplaces.

The average room occupancy rates during the first quarter of 1996 were estimated at 69% for all hotels and 78% for large hotels. Corresponding figures for bed occupancy rates were 61% and 69% respectively.

Gross Tourist Receipts

Gross tourist receipts for the first quarter is estimated at 2,318 million rupees, i.e. an increase of 28% over 1995. The average expenditure per tourist was around Rs. 20,100 compared to Rs. 17,800 (+13%) for the first quarter of last year.

Forecast

Based on the favourable growth registered in tourist arrivals during the first quarter, indications are that arrivals for the year 1996 will be around 470,000, (+11%)with a total gross receipts of the order of 9,000 million rupees.

Explanatory Notes

1. Tourist

A tourist is defined as a non-resident staying in the country for more than 24 hours but less than a year and is not involved in any gainful occupation during his/her stay.

2. Transit

Transit passengers are those who stop over in the country for flight connections to other destinations. There are two types of transit passengers:

Type I: Passengers who do not leave the transit area of the airport or the port.

Type II: Passengers who leave the airport or port and stay in the country for more than 24 hours for only flight connection purposes.

Only Type II transit passengers, as defined above, are included in the definition of "Tourists".

3. Excursionist or Same-day Visitor

An excursionist is a non-resident who stays in the country for less than 24 hours, other than those who do not leave the airport.

4. Tourist Nights

Tourist nights are the total number of nights spent in the country by tourists during the period under review.

5. Large Hotels

Large hotels are well established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms.
