Budget 2022 / 2023

The National Budget for Financial Year (FY) 2022/2023 was presented on 07 June 2022.

The budget of SM has increased from an amount of Rs 314 M to Rs 477.5 M in 2022/2023 to finance both its capital and recurrent expenditure. The increase is mainly due to expenses related to the 2022 Housing and Population Census and the implementation of the SM E-Business Plan. It also includes the expenses of forthcoming surveys in 2023 such as the Continuous Multi-Purpose Household Survey (CMPHS), the Household Budget Survey (HBS) and the Census of Economic Activities (CEA).

The number of funded positions in the new Budget is at 247 compared to 229 in the previous Budget.

Statistics Board under new Chairmanship

The Statistics Board welcomed its new Chair since November 2021 in the person of Mr Joseph E. Charles CARTIER, to replace Mr Gilbert GNANY.

Mr Charles CARTIER, who is presently the Managing Director of Accenture Mauritius, has several years of experience at General Management and Corporate Executive levels within international firms such as TNT Business Solutions and Accenture. Additionally, Mr Charles CARTIER has served as Director on the Board of Directors of the Bank of Mauritius and was the first Chairman of the Economic Development Board from 2017 to 2020.

The Statistics Board conveys its appreciation to Mr Gilbert GNANY who served as the Chairperson of the Statistics Board from February 2020 to June 2021. His invaluable support and advice throughout his tenure is highly regarded.

Training for Temporary Statistical Officers

Since August 2021, some 40 new Temporary Statistical Officers (SO) have been recruited. According to the scheme of service for the post of Statistical Officer/Senior Statistical Officer, candidates are usually appointed on a temporary capacity for a period of one year. During this period, Temporary Statistical Officers have to follow an on-the-job training as well as an in-service Training Course in Basic Statistics. It is on successful completion of the training that they will then be considered for appointment as Statistical Officer/Senior Statistical Officer in a substantive capacity.

In this regard, a Memorandum of Understanding was signed with the University of Mauritius (UoM) on 13 June 2022 for the latter to run a Training Course on Basic Statistics for the 40 Temporary Statistical Officers. The training, which will cost around Rs 400,000, is expected to being in July 2022 and will last until September 2022, with examinations scheduled for October 2022.

It is recalled that previously, Officers used to follow, at their own costs, a course leading to the Ordinary Certificate in Statistics from the United Kingdom Royal Statistical Society (UK RSS). However, as the UK RSS no longer conducts any of its examinations as from May 2017, it became imperative for SM to mount a tailor-made in-service Training Course in Basic Statistics to enable future entrants in the grade of SO to successfully follow such course prior to their substantive appointment in the grade.
