SM celebrates African Statistics Day

18 November was African Statistics Day. This year's theme was *Quality Data to support African Progress*. As is the tradition now, SM celebrated this special day through a half day workshop which was held at Labourdonnais Waterfront Hotel, Caudan on 18 November itself.



Representatives of international organizations, government ministries and departments, the private sector, academia, NGOs and media were present. Aimee Cheung, SM Director gave the welcome address and Gilbert Gnany, Chairman of the Statistics Board proceeded with the workshop opening.

In the first part of the workshop, Set Fong Cheung, Principal Statistician gave a presentation on *Data quality initiatives*. In the second part on Household Budget Survey 2012, Statisticians Sanjev Bhonoo, Rajive Ajodhea and Chandranee Rughoobur presented on *Household income and expenditure, Household indebtedness* and *Poverty* respectively.

FAO supports Mauritius to conduct the Census of Agriculture

FAO is providing support to the Mauritian Government to conduct the Census of Agriculture in 2014. The aim is that the capacity of Government is strengthened to develop a sustainable Food and Agriculture Statistics System so that planning and policy decision-making are based on timely and reliable data.

To mark this collaboration, a project document was signed on 4 November 2013 by Mr. Patrice Talla Takoukam, FAO Representative and Mr. Ram Prakash Nowbuth, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Agro-Industry and Food Security (MAIFS).

The project will last from September 2013 to August 2015 and is being executed jointly by SM and MAIFS.
