SUMMARY

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FOREWORD

This third part of the Census Report deals in the main with the buildings of Mauritius, both those destined to residential usage and those which are appropriated for non-residential purposes.

The residential buildings have been examined from the several aspects of size, structure, type of construction, tenure, number of occupiers, convenience attached, etc.

The non-residential buildings have been classified in respect of the type of activity which is carried out in them.

In a final table, all the economically active establishments and enterprises—agricultural, industrial, commercial, professional or otherwise—have been listed in conformity with the appropriate major grouping of the International Classification.

XVI.—Total Number of Buildings by Category

In Table XXXII all the buildings enumerated on the Census Second Schedule in the districts and towns of Mauritius have been listed by category of utilisation. The residential buildings found unoccupied at the time of Census have been separately classified (as far as it was possible to do this from the indications available), into vacant dwellings, the ones only temporarily unoccupied, the buildings of incomplete construction or undergoing repairs and the uninhabitable ones.

RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS

Structural types

Table XXXIII (a) gives a classification of the residential buildings into nine structural types, broadly defined as follows:—

- (1) *Residential estate*.—a large mansion house, with extensive gardens, pavilions, outhouses, etc.
- (2) *Bungalow or country house*.—a permanent structure in which there is only one self-contained dwelling.
- (3) *Cottage*.—a small but neat dwelling, usually a small country or village residence.
- (4) *Flat*.—an apartment dwelling in a big block, which has its own separate and independent entrance from the outside by means of a stairway.
- (5) *Mixed tenement*.—a structure used in part for dwelling purposes and in part for business, as store, shop, commercial or industrial undertaking.
- (6) *Hovel*.—a small dwelling, cheaply built, in a bad state of repair.
- (7) *Hut*.—a small dwelling made of cheap and flimsy materials like bamboo, ravenal, straw, with thatched roof.
- (8) *Barrack*.—consists of a long single-storey building divided into one or two room apartments, with separate entrance to each apartment.
- (9) *Sea-side bungalow*.—the rustic dwelling by the sea, usually known in Mauritius as “campement”.

It will be observed that the proportion of hovels in the total of occupied dwellings is less in the rural districts than in the urban areas, while on the other hand, the proportion of huts is very considerably larger in the rural districts.

Tenure of Dwellings

In Table XXXIV, the occupiers of dwellings are grouped according to the type of tenure. A distinction is made between the occupiers in the rural districts and the occupiers in the urban areas. For ease of comparability, the distribution has been converted to a constant figure of 10,000 for each district and town as hereafter.

This lower table reveals that 50 per cent of the occupiers in the rural areas own their dwellings, as against only 27 per cent in the urban areas. The proportion of free tenants in the rural districts is nearly double that in the urban areas. This peculiarity is probably due to the fact that a large number of estate employees are provided with free quarters.

Number of Households in Dwellings

In Table XXXV, the dwellings are distributed by the number of households they contain; for easier comparability, the numbers have been converted to a total of 10,000 dwellings in each district and town.

It emerges from this table that in the rural districts, over 78 per cent of the dwellings shelter not more than one household, while in the urban areas the proportion is sensibly lower (63 per cent). In respect of mixed tenements, the corresponding proportions are 88 per cent in the rural districts and 68 per cent in the urban areas.

Households in relation to accommodation

In the next tables, the households are distributed by size and by the number of (a) living rooms and of (b) bed rooms which they occupy. Here, again, for comparability, the original distribution has been converted to the figure of 100,000 households for each of two broad ethnical groups, the small number of Chinese having in this case been included in the General Group of the population.

Vegetable Growing and Poultry Breeding

Table XLI below gives the number of market gardens and kitchen gardens, enumerated in each district at the time of Census. An attempt made during the house to house enquiry to determine the number of householders who take to poultry breeding has yielded the results shown in the table below.

The information in respect of the size of kitchen gardens and of the extent of poultry breeding is perforce of a vague and approximate character but usefully indicative, from an economic point of view, of the activities in these directions.
