



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

Introduction

1. Historical background

Mauritius has a long experience in population census taking.

The first census was taken in 1846 and was followed by another one in 1851. Since then, up to 1931, a census has been taken regularly every ten years. With the outbreak of the Second World War, the one which was due in 1941 had to be postponed to 1944. The next one was taken in 1952. As from then, censuses have again been carried out at intervals of ten years.

The 1972 Population Census is the 14th one that has been taken in this country.

2. Legal basis

The census was taken according to provisions laid down in Ordinance No. 11 of 1951 (the Statistics Ordinance). The census questionnaire was prescribed in regulations published in Government Notice No. 44 of 1972.

A copy of the questionnaire is appended at the end of the report.

3. Recommendations of the United Nations

The recommendations made by the United Nations in the statistical paper "Principles and Recommendations for the 1970 Population Censuses" (Series M. No. 44) have been followed as far as possible. The concepts and definitions published in the paper have been extensively used with slight modifications, where necessary, to suit local conditions.

The concepts and definitions used in the census follow this introduction.

4. Population enumerated

The count was made on a "de facto" basis. All persons alive in Mauritius at midnight on census night, 30th June - 1st July 1972, were enumerated, whether they were residents or not.

Passengers and crews of ships lying at anchor in the harbour were also enumerated. They numbered 224 but have not been included in the figures published in this report.

5. Place of enumeration

All persons were enumerated at the place where they spent the census night, whether it was their place of usual residence or not. However, a question was asked of households on their usual address and when entire households did not spend the night at their usual address, they were, as far as possible, transferred back to their usual place of residence.

6. Preparatory work done at the Housing Census

The housing census commenced 3 months earlier and was completed a fortnight before the population census.

For the housing census the country was divided into 21 census districts which were further subdivided into 370 enumeration areas with approximately 400 to 500 households each.

The demarcation of enumeration areas was done with the help of maps of municipal areas that were then available and of the 1: 25,000 map from the Ministry of Housing, Lands and Town and Country Planning.

At the housing census, while buildings were being enumerated, a list of all heads of household and their addresses was compiled. The list served as frame for the population census. All buildings that were vacant or under construction were included in the list.

7. Enumeration Procedure

At the housing census each enumeration area was covered by a chief enumerator. For the population census each chief enumerator had between 5 and 7 enumerators to carry out the census in his area.

As from mid-May, the enumerators received intensive training from their supervisors and the senior supervisors. They were also taken on reconnaissance rounds by their chief enumerators and were given a small plan showing how the buildings had been numbered at the housing census in the area they had to cover.

The office staff had, in the meantime, numbered and addressed a census form for each household that had been registered by the chief enumerators at the housing census. Forms were also prepared for buildings that were either vacant or under construction at the time of the housing census.

The census forms were delivered by the enumerators to households from the 26th to the 29th June.

Collection of the census forms started on the 1st July. While collecting the forms, the enumerators had to record information on economic activity in columns 16 to 23 of the forms themselves. There were instructions on the forms asking households not to fill in these columns as this was to be done by enumerators only. The latter had also to fill in completely forms for households who had not been able to do so.

By the 9th July, almost all census forms had been collected.

8. Topics covered by the Census

9. Population by locality

Legal boundaries exist for geographical districts, electoral districts, municipal areas and village council areas. However, villages and hamlets whether falling within or outside the limits of village council areas do not have legal or fixed boundaries, and, quite often consist of clusters of houses. They usually expand and sometimes merge with neighbouring ones. It therefore becomes very difficult and even impossible to identify the localities which have merged and were previously known under different names. Some of the localities listed in 1962 could not therefore be identified at this census. On the other hand, some new localities have sprung up since 1962. Besides, it is possible that boundaries used for the enumeration of localities have differed from one census to another.

10. International classifications used

The International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC) - Series M No.4, REV.2, Add.1 - has been used to classify the branches of economic activity in which the economically active persons were engaged.

Occupations have been classified according to the International Standard Classification of Occupations (revised edition, 1968) of the International Labour Office.

11. Field staff

The field staff recruited for conducting the housing census was reinforced by 2,100 enumerators for the population census, bringing the field enumeration force to 2,503, consisting of :

1 Deputy Census Commissioner

4 Senior Supervisors

22 Supervisors

376 Chief Enumerators

2,100 Enumerators

The chief enumerators who had performed the enumeration of buildings at the housing census, supervised the work of the enumerators in their enumeration areas. They were specially responsible for ensuring that every household in their areas filled in a census form. They had also to check the forms for completeness. In cases of serious omissions, the forms were returned to the enumerators who had to obtain the missing information from the households.

The supervisors trained enumerators and chief enumerators for the census and supervised the taking of the census in their districts. They had also to deal with cases where households refused to respond and to give assistance to enumerators who had any difficulties in the field.

The deputy census commissioner and the senior supervisors supervised the training of the staff and controlled the whole operation.

12. Financial and technical assistance from the United Nations

The United Nations Fund for Population Activities kindly accepted to finance part of the cost of the housing and of the population censuses. It has contributed towards the rental of the computer, the cost of punch cards and other supplies for the computer, the salaries of a systems analyst and of punch and verifier operators.

It has also financed the assignment of a demographer to assist in the evaluation and analysis of the census data.

Mr. Z. Rajakovic, Regional Adviser in Demographic and Social Statistics of the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa and Mr. B. G. Bantegui, Population Programme Officer of the United Nations Development Programme gave very useful advice on the planning and conduct of the census during their respective visits to this country.

13. Publication of results of the census

In this report are published the preliminary results of the census for the island of Mauritius. Those for Rodrigues are published in a separate report.

More detailed results will be published subsequently.

The preliminary results of the housing census have been published in another report.

The data from the population census are now being matched with those from the housing census on a computer to analyse the relationship between the characteristics of dwellings and the economic and demographic characteristics of people living in them. The results of the analysis will be published in a subsequent report.

14. Acknowledgements

We wish to thank all members of the office and field staff who were engaged in the census. The success of the census was to a large measure the result of their sustained efforts at all stages of the census.

CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS1. Household

A household is either :

- (a) A person who makes provision for his own food or other essentials for living; or
- (b) A group of two or more persons related by ties of kinship or not, who make common provision (i.e. who share the expenses) for food and other essentials for living.

Two families living in a housing unit constitute one household if they have common housekeeping arrangements, but are considered as separate households if they have separate housekeeping arrangements.

- (c) In case of varying degrees of housekeeping, a group of persons who share at least one meal a day is regarded as one household.

2. Age refers to completed years of age at the census date and has been calculated from the date of birth given in col. 4 of the questionnaire.

3. Marital Status

- (i) Single persons are persons who have never married (i.e. bachelors and spinsters).
- (ii) Married persons include persons who are currently married religiously and civilly, married religiously only and married civilly only.
- (iii) Consensually married persons are those living in a union but not married religiously or civilly.
- (iv) Widowed persons are those who have not remarried since their spouse died.
- (v) Divorced persons are those who have not remarried after divorce.
- (vi) Separated persons include those who are separated legally or not and have not remarried.

4. Linguistic group refers to the language spoken by the person's forefathers.

5. Usual language means the language usually or most often spoken by the individual in his home. For children who were not yet able to speak, the usual language of the parents was adopted.


"Créole patois", a vernacular derived mostly from French, has been accepted as a language for the purposes of the census.

6. Economic Activity

Population covered : The statistics on economic activity refer to the enumerated population aged 12 and over, excluding the persons on visit to Mauritius, whether on business or on holiday.

Type of Activity

Columns 16 and 17 of the questionnaire allow for the classification of the population into those economically active and those economically inactive and further into those in and out of employment among the economically active.



Economically active persons are those aged 12 and above, who furnished the supply of labour for the production of economic goods and services at any time during the month of June 1972. They comprise persons in employment and persons out of employment who have been looking for work.

Persons in employment are those who,

- (a) At some time during the month of June,
 - (i) have worked for pay or profit or have performed work in anticipation of money earnings to be received at some future date or have helped without pay a member of the same household in his enterprise for at least 3 hours each working day or for six full working days which need not be consecutive. Enterprise includes: workshop, shop, plantation, cow-keeping, cattle rearing, dairying, fishing, handicrafts, etc;
 - (ii) although being old age or retired pensioners or engaged in household duties, have been working for pay or profit or have helped without pay in a family enterprise as mentioned in (a) above;
 - (iii) although receiving a regular wage or salary were attending a training course;
- (b) had a job but were on sick or local leave during the whole month of June.

Persons not in employment and looking for work are those who,

- (a) had not worked during the month of June and had been looking for work during the month of June or previously.
- (b) were out of work during the month of June and could not look for a job because of temporary sickness.

A person is considered as "looking for work" if he/she has made a positive effort, to find work by :

- (a) placing advertisements or answering advertisements;
- (b) writing letters of application;
- (c) registering with an employment exchange;
- (d) visiting prospective employers;
- (e) enquiring from other persons about existing vacancies; or
- (f) asking other persons to find a job for him/her.

Persons not in employment and looking for work have been classified into 2 categories:

- (a) "first job seekers" i.e. those who had never worked before, and
- (b) "employed before" i.e. those who were working previously, including self-employment and who were out of work during the month of June.

The Economically Inactive persons are those aged 12 and above who were neither engaged in gainful economic activity nor were on sick leave during the month of June 1972 and were not looking for work. These include housewives, wholly retired persons and rentiers not engaged in other gainful activity; children between ages 12 and 15 who were not at school and not looking for work; persons engaged in unpaid voluntary work and permanently disabled persons; full time students even if they have also been engaged in any paid activity or have helped in a family enterprise.

However, exception has been made in the case of inmates of resident institutions such as convents, mental and penal institutions, homes for the care of the aged or children who were engaged in producing goods of economic value and member of cloistered institutions who worked for the congregation. Such persons have been treated as economically inactive.

The residual category of persons who were neither engaged in gainful economic activity nor looking for work, who were not income recipients and did not fall under any of the categories mentioned above, is also included among the economically inactive.

Colonne 1—NOM ET PRENOMS

(i) Ménage

Un ménage peut être, soit:

- (a) un ménage composé d'une personne, c'est-à-dire une personne qui subvient elle-même à ses besoins essentiels, alimentaires et autres; ou
- (b) un groupe de deux ou plusieurs personnes apparentées ou non apparentées qui s'associent afin de pourvoir à leurs besoins alimentaires et à leurs autres besoins vitaux.

Deux familles vivant sous le même toit constituent un ménage si elles mettent leurs revenus en commun et ont un budget unique; mais elles doivent être considérées comme deux ménages si elles ont deux budgets séparés. Elles doivent alors être inscrites sur deux formulaires séparés.

Tous les membres du ménage présents la nuit du recensement doivent être comptés. *N'inclure les membres absents que s'ils reviennent le lendemain et s'ils n'ont pas été comptés ailleurs.* Doivent aussi être comprises les autres personnes, telles que des parents, des visiteurs, des pensionnaires ou des serviteurs, qui, quoique habituellement ne faisant pas partie du ménage, passent la nuit du recensement sur les lieux, ou arrivent le lendemain sans avoir été comptées ailleurs.

(ii) Nom de famille et prénoms

En inscrivant le nom d'une personne, écrire d'abord le nom de famille. Si le nom de famille est le même que pour la ligne précédente, inscrire 'ditto'.

(iii) Chef de ménage

Inscrire comme chef de ménage la personne qui est reconnue comme tel par les autres membres du ménage. Dans une institution ou un hotel, inscrire comme chef la personne qui détient l'autorité.

(iv) Institutions

Pour les institutions, inscrire les noms dans l'ordre suivant: chef, autres employés, pensionnaires, serviteurs. Les membres du personnel qui vivent seuls ou avec leurs familles dans un immeuble séparé de l'institution mais dans la même cour, doivent être comptés comme des ménages séparés et doivent être inscrits sur un formulaire séparé.

Colonne 2—LIEN DE PARENTE AVEC LE CHEF DE MENAGE

Désigner les autres membres du ménage selon leur lien de parenté avec le chef de ménage.

Si les membres d'un même ménage constituent une famille distincte de celle du chef de ménage—par exemple un fils marié, son épouse et ses enfants—tous les membres de cette famille doivent être accolés ainsi: , à la colonne 1.

Colonne 5—AGE

Pour les personnes âgées de plus d'une année, indiquer l'âge en années révolues au 30 juin 1972.

Pour les enfants de moins d'un an, indiquer l'âge en mois révolus au 30 juin 1972.

Il est important de donner l'âge exact. En cas de doute, consulter l'acte de naissance.

Colonne 10—COMMUNAUTE

Conformément au paragraphe 3 (4) de l'Annexe I à la Constitution, la population de Maurice est considérée comme comprenant une communauté hindoue, une communauté musulmane et une communauté sino-mauricienne, et, toute personne qui ne semble pas, par son mode de vie, appartenir à l'une de ces trois communautés sera considérée comme appartenant à la Population Générale qui sera elle-même considérée comme une quatrième communauté.

De plus, en vertu du paragraphe 5 (8) de la même Annexe, les résultats du dernier recensement officiel publié de toute la population de Maurice serviront à déterminer l'allocation des sièges additionnels à l'Assemblée Législative.

Colonnes 12 et 13—GROUPE LINGUISTIQUE ET LANGUE HABITUELLEMENT PARLEE

Colonne 15—NIVEAU D'INSTRUCTION

Pour les personnes qui, dans le passé, n'ont fréquenté que les écoles primaires, inscrire la classe (primaire) la plus élevée qu'ils ont passée. Ne mentionner 'la sixième' que lorsque la personne a, en fait, obtenu un certificat de la Sixième du Ministère de l'Education.

Inscrire 'L. Column 1—NAMES AND SURNAME

(i) HOUSEHOLD

A household may be either:

- (a) a one-person household, that is, a person who makes provision for his own food or other essentials for living;
- (b) a group of two or more persons who may or may not be related by ties of kinship, but who make common provision (i.e. who share the expenses) for food or other essentials for living. Two families living in one house constitute one household if they have common housekeeping arrangements, but should be considered as separate households if they have separate housekeeping arrangements and should then be entered on two separate census forms.

All members of the household who are present on census night must be counted. *Do not include those who are absent unless they come back on the next day and have not been counted elsewhere.*

Must be counted also other persons who, though not usually forming part of the household (e.g. relatives, visitors, boarders or servants), spend the census night on the premises or arrive the next day *without* having been counted elsewhere.

(ii) NAMES AND SURNAME

In entering a person's name, the surname should be written first. Where the surname is the same as on the line above, 'ditto marks' can be entered instead.

(iii) HEAD OF HOUSEHOLD

Enter as head of household the person who is acknowledged as such by the other members of the household. In an institution or hotel, enter as head the highest ranking officer or employee.

(iv) INSTITUTIONS

The names of persons belonging to the general institutional household should be entered in the following order: head, other officers or employees, inmates, servants. Separate households in one institution should be entered separately.

Column 2—RELATIONSHIP TO HEAD OF HOUSEHOLD

Describe other members of the household according to their relationship to the head of the household. Where members of the same household constitute a separate family from that of the head of the household (e.g. a married son, his wife and children), this separate family, while forming part of the same household, should be clearly shown by placing the members within brackets, thus: {, in column 1.

Column 5—AGE

For persons over 1 year, the age should be given in completed years as at the date of the 30th June 1972.

For children under 1 year, the age should be entered in completed months as at the date of the 30th June 1972.

It is important that the exact age be given. In case of doubt, the birth certificate should be consulted.

Column 10—COMMUNITY

According to paragraph 3 (4) of Schedule I to the Constitution, the population of Mauritius is regarded as including: "A Hindu community, a Muslim community and a Sino-Mauritian community and every person who does not appear, from his way of life, to belong to one or other of those three communities shall be regarded as belonging to the General Population, which shall itself be regarded as a fourth community".

Further, by virtue of paragraph 5 (8) of the same Schedule, the results of the latest published official census of the whole population of Mauritius shall be used to determine the allocation of additional seats in the Legislative Assembly.

Columns 12 and 13—LINGUISTIC GROUP AND USUAL LANGUAGE

For the purposes of the census only, 'créole patois' should be considered as a language.

Column 15—LEVEL OF EDUCATION

For persons who have, *in the past*, attended primary schools *only*, the highest standard passed should be inserted. VIth Standard should be inserted only for persons who have actually obtained the Primary School Leaving Certificate from the Ministry of Education.

For persons who have attended secondary schools *in the past* and who have *not* passed the Cambridge School Certificate or Senior Cambridge, or the General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) in at least 5 subjects, or the London Matriculation, or the Brevet d'Etudes du Premier Cycle (B.E.P.C.), insert 'L. S.' for Lower Secondary.

If a person holds any of the following qualifications, insert the *highest* certificate, degree or diploma obtained:

(a) Primary School Teachers' Certificate.

(b) Cambridge School Certificate or Senior Cambridge, G.C.E. 'O' level (in at least 5 subjects), B.E.P.C.

(c) Higher School Certificate, G.C.E. 'A' level, Inter B.A., Inter B.Sc., Baccalaureat.

(d) A university degree or diploma.

(e) Membership of a professional institution.

If there is any difficulty in deciding which of two qualifications held by a person is the higher, insert both.

For university degrees and professional diplomas, the qualification, the major subject or subjects and the awarding institution should be mentioned.
