

F O R E W O R D

This is the first report showing the results of the 1983 Housing and Population Census for the Island of Rodrigues. It is Volume V in the series presenting the census results. However Volume IV has not yet been published because of delays in the preparation of the complete list of tabulations. Hence, although both Volumes IV and V were scheduled to appear at the same time, it is now thought preferable to release Volume V rather than wait for the completion of Volume IV. The original labelling of the different reports is being kept to maintain uniformity and avoid confusion.

Unlike the previous two reports for the Island of Mauritius, the present volume includes data collected not only at the population census but also at the housing census. It was thought convenient to bring together most of the information for Rodrigues in one volume for ease of reference. The first fifteen tables present demographic data obtained at the population census whilst the remaining tables contain information on buildings, housing units and households, collected at the housing census. Because of the time lag between the housing and the population censuses there may be slight discrepancies between some tables.

The figures presented here have been obtained directly from compilations of the raw data collected on the census forms. Like all census data they may contain some inaccuracies and inconsistencies. A detailed evaluation and analysis will be carried out and published later. However, it is expected that the level of accuracy is likely to be high for most of the topics covered here. Data on economic characteristics are not presented because it is believed that the reported information may be seriously in error since many persons known to be working have insisted on being entered as unemployed on the census questionnaire. The data will be published in an analysis report after an appraisal of their quality has been completed.

I would like here to thank all persons and organisations, both in the Island of Mauritius and in Rodrigues, who have contributed to the success of the census and the preparation of this report. My special thanks go to the Clergy in Rodrigues without whose help the fieldwork would have been a most difficult task. It is again with pleasure that I express my gratitude to the United Nations Fund for Population Activities and to the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa for financial and technical assistance.

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Housing and Population Census questionnaires

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Introduction

1. Background

In 1983 Mauritius successfully conducted its fifteenth census of population according to provisions laid down in the Statistics Act 1951. The count was made on a "de facto" basis. All persons alive in the State of Mauritius at midnight on the night of 2 - 3 July 1983 were enumerated irrespective of whether they were residents or not. Generally speaking, persons were enumerated in the household, whether private or institutional, in which they were present on census night. A list of such households had been compiled at the Housing Census taken about three months earlier than the Population Census.

2. Census fieldwork

At the previous census in 1972, the Island of Mauritius had been divided into 376, and the Island of Rodrigues into 12, enumeration areas of about 500 households each. These areas were further sub-divided in 1983 to meet certain specific needs in town and country planning and to provide clusters of roughly the same size for future sample surveys. Thus, for the 1983 census, there were about 2700 new enumeration areas in the Island of Mauritius and about 100 in Rodrigues. Each contained roughly 80 households in the rural and 100 households in the urban regions.

The fieldstaff consisted of 4,271 officers of whom 2 Chief Supervisors, 9 Senior Supervisors, 85 Supervisors, 607 Chief Enumerators and 3,566 Enumerators.

At the Housing Census, each Chief Enumerator was assigned a number of enumeration areas in which he had to enumerate all buildings, housing units, households and commercial and industrial establishments. After completion of the Housing Census, an addressed population census form was prepared for each household identified, each vacant housing unit and also for housing units under construction.

At the Population census each Enumerator was given a list of about 70 such households and housing units together with the corresponding census questionnaires. The Enumerator was also supplied with a number of unaddressed blank questionnaires for new households that might have been formed, or that might have moved into the housing units since the Housing Census.

Census night was the night of 2 - 3 July 1983. The questionnaires were distributed to households by Enumerators from 25 to 30 June. Heads of households were requested to complete all items, except those on economic characteristics, in respect of every person who spent census night on the premises, or who joined the household or institution on 3 July without having been counted elsewhere. The questionnaires were collected from 3 to 8 July. Enumerators had to check the entries made by households, complete the columns on economic characteristics, and also complete all questionnaires and columns which the household had not been able to fill in.

Specimens of the Housing and Population Census questionnaires are to be found inside the backcover of the report.

3. Data processing

The editing and coding of the census data was done by a team of about 68 officers recruited at clerical officer level. Processing of census data is the responsibility of the Data Processing Division of the Ministry of Finance. Data were transferred to discs through key-edit stations and stored on magnetic tapes. Validation, creation of data files and tabulation are being done on an ICL ME 29 - 37 computer.

4. Census budget

Government expenditure on the census project is estimated at about 12 million Rupees, inclusive of costs attributable to existing infrastructure and services not paid for from the census budget. Thus the cost per person enumerated is 12 Rupees. Furthermore, the United Nations Fund for Population Activities has contributed about 700,000 Rupees for strengthening the capability of the Central Statistical Office and the Data Processing Division. The census project has also benefitted from the advisory services of the Economic Commission for Africa.

5. Publication programme

The programme for the publication of census results has been further delayed because of problems concerning the reproduction of tables. The revised publication plan now stands as follows:

It will be noted that the present volume is being published earlier than Volume IV. The reason is that both Volumes IV and V were originally planned for April 1985, but because of the unavailability by that date, of the complete list of tabulations for Volume IV, it has not been possible to meet this target. Furthermore, it is thought preferable to publish Volume V right away rather than wait for the completion of Volume IV.

6. Analysis and evaluation

In the past, evaluation of census data has been done by United Nations experts. This time the exercise will be done by local staff who will, however, work under the guidance of a United Nations expert with international experience in Demographic Analysis. A series of analysis reports covering demographic characteristics, education, fertility, mortality, housing, manpower and migration will be published as and when they are completed. The first analytical report covering the evaluation of basic demographic data for the Island of Mauritius is almost ready and will be published shortly. As regards, the Island of Rodrigues, it is proposed to publish only one analysis report covering all topics for ease of reference.

7. Concepts and definitions

The concepts and definitions used at the census are in accordance with the recommendations of the United Nations, as contained in the Statistical Paper entitled "Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses". Sometimes slight modifications have been made to suit local conditions.

Although the census enumeration was essentially on an individual basis, the count of individuals was made within the framework of households in housing units. A household was either a person living on his own and making his own provision for food and other essentials for living, or a group of two or more persons, whether related or not, who lived together and made common provision for food and other essentials for living. Varying degrees of common housekeeping were resolved by considering as one household if there was a regular arrangement to share at least one meal a day. The head of household was the person acknowledged as such by the other members.

In hotels, or institutions such as convents, hospitals and prisons, the guests or inmates were considered as members of what may be termed an institutional household. The person in charge of the hotel or institution at the time of the census was considered as the head.

The tables presented in this report are self-explanatory. However, a brief note is necessary in connection with the data for localities. The exact boundaries of localities are often ill-defined, and sometimes the expansion of villages makes it difficult to delimit one village from a neighbouring one. Furthermore, it is possible that the boundaries of localities may have changed from one census to another. Hence, it may be necessary for some purposes to look at a locality not in isolation, but as part of a group of adjacent localities.


