THE Commissioners appointed under Ordinance No. 81 of 1851 to make a Census of Mauritius and its Dependencies, have the honor herewith to submit to your Excellency a series of tables, exhibiting the results of the enumeration, which was taken in this Island on the 20th November 1851, and in the several Dependencies at periods approximating as nearly as could be arranged to that date, together with their Report upon the principal facts of interest exhibited in these tables.

2.—The mode of taking the Census in this Island was nearly the same as that adopted on a similar occasion in 1846, except that in the town of Port Louis, instead of the town being divided into six sections, and the inhabitants being required to fill in, and deliver at fixed stations, the forms which had been previously left at their dwellings by the distributors, the town was divided into 20 sections, and the distributors, being increased in number to the same extent, were required to call for and recover the forms filled in at the dwellings where they had left them. The Commissioners believe that this change has conduced much to the accuracy of the results.

3.—In the Country Districts the Census was conducted in the same manner as in 1846. Each District was divided into a convenient number of sections. A Distributor was appointed for each, and the forms were collected and examined by the Civil Commissary.

4.—The boundaries of the sections established on this occasion are the same as those fixed in 1846, in all the districts except Grand Port, in which a change was considered convenient; in Savanne, where one of the sections which was undertaken in 1846 by a single distributor, has been divided into two; and in Plaines Wilhems, from which a portion (about two thirds of a square mile) has been separated and included within the boundaries of the Municipality of Port Louis. The portion of South Pamplemousses similarly included in the town on this occasion is too small to affect the results.

5.—In the Dependencies, where no Census has been taken since the abolition of slavery, different means of obtaining the Returns have been necessarily employed. In the principal Islands of the Seychelles group, paid enumerators have been employed, under the direction and superintendence of the Civil Commissioner. In some of the smaller islands of that group, and in other detached dependencies of the colony, that officer or the undersigned Commissioner have obtained Returns from the proprietors, who have in every instance afforded a ready assistance to the Commissioners. In Rodrigues, the enumeration was made under the directions of the Resident Police Magistrate.

6.—There is, therefore, every reason to believe that not only in this Island, but in its Dependencies, a complete Census has been made, and the results of the enumeration, together with the Report under the direction of the Commissioners, have been submitted to submit the principal results of the Census.

1st—MAURITIUS.

7.—The total population of Mauritius on 20th November 1851 was as follows:—

8.—In August 1846 the number of the resident population was 158,462, and of Military and Crews of shipping 2,627, making a total of 161,089. The increase of the resident population has been 22,361, equal to 14 per cent, but this consists almost exclusively of Immigrants introduced from India during the interval.

9.—The same threefold division of the Population into

 Ex-apprentices and their Families,

which was made in the last Census, has been maintained in the present. The number and proportions of each class on the two occasions were as follows:

It is almost superfluous to add that the disproportionate increase in the latter class has been caused by Immigration.

11.—The Population of Port Louis amounts to 49,909, (exclusive of the Military quartered there, who amount to 1,350, and the shipping, whose crews amounted to 1,159, making a total of 52,418,) which is equal to 28. 5 per cent of the whole population. In 1846 the proportion was 29 per cent. The actual increase of the resident population, exclusive of the Military and Shipping during the interval has been 4,897, or 10 per cent, consisting entirely of Indians. An increase of 1,350 in the Military population, has been counterbalanced by a decrease of 1,159 in the ex-apprentices.

The proportion in Flacq and Black River has considerably increased; in Moka it has slightly increased; while in Port Louis, Rivière du Rempart, Plaines Wilhems, and Pamplémousses North it has decreased.

17.—The above two statements may have been affected in some degree by a difference in the original classification made by the enumerators, although the phenomena which they exhibit are consistent with the disposition evinced during this period by Ex-apprentices to migrate from the Town of Port Louis, in which they congregated immediately after the emancipation, and from the richer districts in the North of the Island, where they were living at that period, to the more wooded and less cultivated districts of the Island, in which they can purchase plots of land at a cheaper rate, or find it easier to occupy them without doing so. The above figures indicate a considerable increase in Port Louis, probably of Old Indians, with an increase in the districts of Flacq, Black River, and Moka, in which the cultivation of Sugar is on the increase. The relative proportion in the other districts has been affected by this increase, for in all of them there has been a positive numerical increase.

19.—The disproportion of the sexes, noticed in the Report on the Census of 1846 still continues to exist, but it has diminished in the classes of Ex-apprentices and Indians.

20.—From Appendix No. 2 it appears that the mortality among the Ex-apprentices, which had averaged between 1835 and 1846 3.2 per cent annually, had diminished to 1.3 per cent from 1846 to 1851: The decrease in number was 7,021, the increase by births in the same class, exclusive of some females who by marriage may have merged into the class of General Population, and not have declared themselves as belonging to the former class was 5,986. The total decrease in the class was 1,035 or only 0.4 per cent annually.

21.—Appendix No. 3 furnishes a statement of the Population in each section of the several Districts, which, when compared with the corresponding table of 1846, will show in what sections an increase or decrease has taken place.

22.—Appendices Nos. 4 and 5 exhibit the ages of each class in

each District, and in the whole island, distinguishing the sexes. The same differences in the proportions of young and old, which were noticed in 1846, continue to exist, but in a less degree, as will be seen by the following table:—

23.—The excess of males over females in the class of Ex-apprentices has decreased from 6,919 in 1846, to 4,976 in 1851. The proportion of males above 40 in this excess has also decreased, but in a smaller ratio, viz: from 6,193 in 1846 to 4,934 in 1852.

24.—It was remarked in 1846 that the proportion of young persons under the age of 20 was much smaller among the class of Ex-apprentices than among the general population, but that it was gratifying to notice a favorable increase among children under 5 years of age. The same remark holds good, and the approximation to the general population is still more striking in the present returns.

25.—The Indian Population, owing to the continual influx and departure of Immigrants cannot be submitted to the same comparison, but it is gratifying, in a physiological and political point of view, to observe that the proportion of children under 5 years of age to the number of women in this class is greater than in either of the other two, viz:

Allowing for the excessive proportion of women between the ages of 15 and 45 among the Indians, as compared with the other two classes, which is 61 o/o instead of 47 and 48 o/o respectively, the proportion of children under 5 years old to the number of males is only one per cent less than in those classes, which appears to justify the inference, that the disproportion in the number of the sexes in this class has no material influence on the proportion of births to the females capable of bearing children.

26.—Appendix No. 6, which shows the Country of Birth of the population, exhibits the same results as in 1846 with regard to the inhabitants of European origin, who still constitute 2 per cent of the whole number,—the British out numbering those of French origin;—together with this further result, that the number of persons born in the United Kingdom, and in France is less in 1851 than in 1846, the decrease being greater among the former.

27.—The number of Ex-apprentices born in Africa and Madagascar has diminished by 2,908; their proportion to the total of their class is reduced from 25 to 20 per cent.

28.—Appendix No. 8 shows the distribution of persons of European and American origin in the several districts. The small increase in this class (occasioned by Births) is apparent in Port Louis only. The number in the Country Districts remains almost the same. There has been a change however, in the number in different districts, viz: an increase in Rivière du Rempart, Flacq, Savanne, and Moka, and a decrease in Grand Port, and Plaines Wilhems.

29.—No attempt has been made on the present occasion to distinguish those Indian Immigrants who had completed their five years of Industrial residence, or those who arrived in 1834-39. In 1846 the attempt failed, and the information, if required, can be obtained with sufficient accuracy from the Registers of the Protector's Office.

30.—Appendices Nos. 9 and 10 furnish statements of the occupations of the population in the whole Island, and in the several Districts, classified in the same manner as in 1846, upon the system adopted in abstracting the Census of Great Britain in 1841. The following abstracts of these voluminous Tables exhibit the No. and proportion of each class of employment :

31.—With regard to these tables it is necessary to point out that, as in 1846, all persons describing themselves as proprietors, without any other specification, are classed as Independent; and that the "Residue of the Population" includes children, and all persons following no occupation, or to whom none was assigned in the Returns.

32.—These tables exhibit the following results :

33.—2o. Agriculture gives direct employment to 43.5 per cent of the male population; Commerce Trade, Manufactures, and other kinds of labour to 19.3 per cent. The relative proportions of these two classes in 1846 were 41.6 and 18.5 per cent.

34.—3o. Of those engaged in Agriculture 86.9 are employed on Sugar Estates, and 6.4 on other properties.

These proportions in 1846 were respectively 33.6 and 8 per cent.

The most remarkable features in this table are the increase of those employed in Commerce &c., and on Sugar Estates ; the decrease of laborers and Domestic Servants ; the decrease also of persons professing to be "proprietors" without any occupation, who are classed as "Independent ;" and the increase of the unemployed, which may be chiefly owing to the increased proportion of children, noticed in Par. 22.

To prevent mistake, it must here be noticed that although the proportion employed on Sugar Estates has decreased, as was to be expected from the large number of men whose period of industrial service has expired since 1816, the actual number of Indians so employed has increased from 34,342 to 41,887.

In Rivière du Rempart, North Pamplemousses, and Grand Port there has been a slight increase; in Flacq, Black River, and Moka, there has been a large increase, corresponding to the large increase in the population of those Districts, noticed in Par: 18; and in Savanne, Plaines Wilhems, and South Pamplemousses there has been a small decrease.

41.—30. There has consequently been a considerable change in the relative extent to which persons are employed in the cultivation of Sugar in the several districts, since 1846, as derived from Appendix No. 12.

42.—40. In the report of 1846 it was stated, that, in order to ascertain approximately the proportion of Persons engaged in Agriculture, otherwise than on Sugar Estates, it would be neces-

sary to add to those who are classed under that head a large portion of those classed as "Independent," and also, as far as the country districts are concerned, of those classed as "Laborers." The results are exhibited in the following table :

The proportion in every District is less than in 1846, excepting in Grand Port, where it may arise from some defect in the classification of the former Census. Indeed the similarity of the general results in the two years, notwithstanding the great inequalities in the details of 1846, which are not observable in those of the present Census, confirm the Commissioners in their opinion of the correctness of the union of the three classes in the above table, in order to arrive at a view of the population employed in petty Agriculture.

43.—50. The number of Boatmen, and Fishermen, classed under the head "Naval," has increased, but disproportionately in different Districts. The proportion to the rest of the population being too small to be shown by the per centage, the numbers have not been given.

44.—60. Of the professional persons, amounting in all to 235,—the number in 1846 was 190,—163 reside in Port Louis. Of other educated persons, amounting in all to 1,597, (in 1846 there were 1,422), 1,271 reside there.

Of the total number, 8,011 are males and 2,582 are females ; 6,250 are employed in Port Louis, and 4,343 in the Country.

63.—In conclusion, the Commissioners trust that the fullness of the details contained in this Report and its Appendices, and the engrossing nature of the other official avocations of the Commissioners, will be received as a sufficient explanation of the delay in the presentation of the Report.
