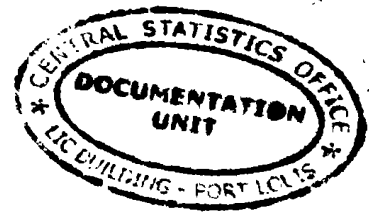


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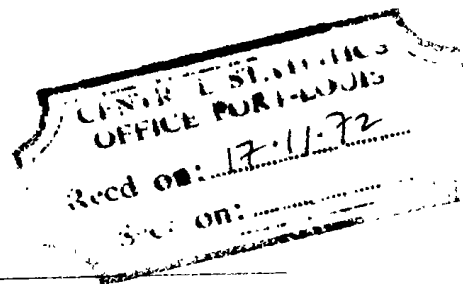

May it please Your Excellency,

Having been appointed to take a Census of Mauritius and its Dependencies under the provisions of Ordinance No. 3 of 1871, I entered on the performance of that duty on the 1st February last, and I now beg to submit to Your Excellency the first part of the Report which Article 17 of that Ordinance requires me to lay before the Council of Government.

Report divided into two parts.

2.—I am unable as yet to bring forward the whole of my Report, having still to wait for the Schedules of some of the Dependencies.* But as the tabulations which refer to the Island of Mauritius itself have long been ready, and the time within which the information still wanted from the Dependencies may be received is quite uncertain, I have resolved on submitting at once the results hitherto ascertained, and for that purpose have divided my Report into two parts.

Contents of Part I.

3.—In the part now presented, I purpose to give a brief description of the preliminary arrangements adopted for the whole Census, and a succinct analysis of the results elicited by it, so far as they concern the Island of Mauritius. The Census of the Dependencies will thus be left to be reported upon separately.

By various arrange-

4.—The preparations for the Census were commenced as speedily as possible after the passing of the Ordinance which determined its objects. The first step taken was to subdivide the existing territorial divisions of the Island into Sections, with the view of placing each of them under a special Enumerator. The subdivisions thus formed were as follows :—

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Enumerators.

5.—A staff of 104 Enumerators had thereupon to be enlisted, each of whom it was necessary to train for the discharge of his duties.—Difficult as it seemed at first to find immediately so large a number of persons competent for the work which had to be gone through, and disposed to undertake it, the whole staff was easily organised, no less than 360 candidates having at once come forward for the appointments which had to be filled up.

6.—To ensure a proper supervision over the work of the Enumerators as many Superintendents were appointed in each District as its area and population seemed to require.*

Superintendents.

7.—Printed instructions were issued to the Superintendents and Enumerators regarding their duties, and verbal explanations were besides given by me to each of the former as to the manner in which those duties were expected to be performed.

Circulars to Superintendents and Enumerators.

8.—Each Superintendent was supplied with a map shewing the boundaries of his division of the Island, and those of each Enumerator's Section comprised within it. For the preparation of those maps I am indebted to the Surveyor General and the Officers of his Department.

Maps.

9.—The boundaries of Port Louis were laid down without any trouble, as they are distinctly defined by law ; but those of the rural districts were not so easily traced out.

Boundaries of Districts.

10.—While the legal limits of some of the country-districts are quite indistinct and uncertain, those of others have by common consent been changed, without the sanction of the Legislature. It is obviously desirable that all such changes should be confirmed by law, and that all doubts as to the lines which separate the territorial divisions of the Island should be authoritatively removed.

11.—In order that the Enumerators might become thoroughly familiarised beforehand with their respective Sections, a preliminary enumeration of all houses was ordered to be gone through by them within the first 12 days of the month of March. The results were reported to me through returns, printed forms for which were sent to them together with their circular instructions.

Enumeration of Houses.

The word *house* was taken in the sense attached to it at the London Session of the International Statistical Congress. Every distinct building, whether inhabited or not, was reckoned as a house. A distinction was however made with reference to *Out-houses*, i.e. kitchens and other small structures not intended to be inhabited and which are generally considered and used as *dependencies of habitations* : these were separately enumerated.

12.—Householders' Schedules printed in English and French were then sent to the Superintendents for distribution.

Householders' Schedules.

13.—On the 31st March, each Enumerator was directed to deliver at every inhabited house borne on his Return of Houses,

as many of such Schedules as were necessary for the enumeration of all its inhabitants, furnishing all the requisite information as to the manner in which the forms had to be filled up.

Postponement of day of Census.

14.—It was at first intended to take the Census on the 4th April, enumerating the population of the previous night;—but as the Mahomedan festival called the Muharram* was to last till the 3rd it was thought proper to postpone the enumeration to the following Monday.

Collection of Schedules.

15.—The collection of the Householders' Schedules was consequently put off to the 11th April.

Where the Schedule was returned filled up, the Enumerator had to examine its entries, and rectify those which were incorrect; wherever the form was not filled up he had to fill it up himself obtaining the necessary information from the principal Householder or his representative.

Sub-enumerators.

16.—As upwards of 30,000 Schedules had to be collected, and no less than 19,642 of the Householders could not fill up theirs, it became necessary to strengthen the staff of Enumerators, by the enlistment of 162 Sub-enumerators

The number of Householders who could not fill up their forms had been ascertained by the Enumerators when they went through their enumeration of Houses.

Revision of Schedules.

17.—When the Schedules were returned to the Superintendents, it became their duty to examine the entries made in them. Each Superintendent had to satisfy himself that the enumeration had been accurately gone through in his Division; and after rectifying all errors and repairing all omissions, he had to forward his Schedules to the Census Office with a summary statement of the numbers of the population of his Division.

Shipping.

18.—Special Schedules were prepared for the Shipping in the Harbours and Roadsteads of the Island, and their distribution and collection were left to the charge of a special Enumerator.

Troops.

19.—The Schedules relating to Her Majesty's Troops in the Island were addressed to His Honor Major-General Smyth who kindly had them circulated through the military cantonments and filled up with all the information wanted.

Dependencies.

20.—The forms requisite for the Seychelles Islands were forwarded as soon as practicable to the Civil Commissioner of those Dependencies; those of Rodrigues to the Magistrate in charge of that Island; and those of the other Dependencies to their respective Proprietors, or their Agents.

Houses in Port Louis.

21.—The information obtained through the Returns of Houses is given in Appendix 4 and may be summarised as follows:

In Port Louis the occupied houses, of all sizes, amounted to 6071; the unoccupied to 667. The latter number includes Stores

24.—No account of the Houses in the Colony having been taken at any previous Census, no comparisons can be established with the numbers of Houses returned by this year's Enumerators.

25.—The total Population of the Colony on the 10th April last, including the Military and all persons on board of vessels in the harbours and roadsteads of the Island, amounted to 317,069. At the three previous Censuses the Total Population was as follows :—

Division of the Population into two classes.

27.—As was done in 1861, the Population was divided into two classes distinguished by the following designations:—

- (1.)—The Indian Population.
- (2.)—The General Population.

In order that this classification might be carried out without difficulty and on a uniform system throughout all the operations of the Census, the following rule was laid down:—that the term *Indian Population* was to be held as comprising not only *Indians born in India*, but *all persons of unmixed Indian origin* whatever their birth-place or nationality; and that *all the other inhabitants of the Island* irrespective of descent, birth-place or nationality, were to be considered as belonging to the *General Population*.

AGES AND SEXES.

Appendix No. 9 refers to the Population not on the Sugar-Estates ; No. 10 to the Population on the Sugar-Estates ; and No. 11 to the whole Resident Population. In each of them the Indian Population is distinguished from the rest, and the results of the enumeration are exhibited with reference to each District separately, as well as collectively in regard to the whole Island.

For the purposes of comparison the ages have been divided as they were in the Reports on the previous Censuses of Mauritius.

45.—In India, wherever ages have been enumerated with sufficient accuracy to allow them to be compared with those of other countries, the percentage of children has been found to be in excess of the European average. The two following facts are referred to generally as the causes of that excess :—1st. that the majority of women in India are married ; 2ndly. that they marry much earlier than in Europe.

Lowness of the proportion of children in Mauritius.

46.—In Mauritius, the lowness of the proportion of children relatively to the averages of India and Europe, is due without any doubt to the comparative paucity of female adults in our population. The disparity of numbers between the sexes is not so great now as it was in 1861 ; yet, as will be remarked by the tables appended to this report, the equalisation of the sexes is far from having been effected yet. (*Vide Paragraph 53.*)

This proportion is somewhat below that of England, which in 1851—60 was 1048 per thousand.

According to the “*Annuaire de la Statistique*” the average preponderance of Males in Births may be taken to be about 53 per thousand, in France.

In India, the preponderance of the male sex in Births is supposed to be still larger than in Europe. It is stated to be so in most of the Census-Reports which have been published in India ; but I have not as yet met with any figures regarding the matter, with which any reliable comparisons could be made.

Large excess of Males in Deaths.

53.—The large difference shewn in paragraph 52 between Males and Females, in the mortality of the last ten years, is attributable, if not altogether, at all events chiefly, to the inequality of the sexes in the Population. They stood as follows on the 10th April last :—

As the figures above given shew, the proportion is highest in children under 10 ;—it then falls gradually till it attains the middle of life ; whence it increases till it reaches Octogenarians ; above whom there is again a diminution of females.

In the figures above given there is one remarkable feature which can hardly escape notice : that is, that except in the case of Belgium, the preponderance of Females goes on gradually increasing from South to North, *i. e.* as the distance from the Equator becomes greater. Thence we may infer that the proportion of the sexes is affected by climatic influences and that the result of these is a larger proportion of Females in the higher latitudes than in the lower.

57.—In the Official Reports on Indian Censuses I find the following proportion of Females to Males of all ages :— *Proportion of Females in India.*

Whence it appears that while the proportion of Females to Males in our Total Resident Population is very nearly equal to that of Calcutta, it is 9 per cent above the proportion of the Town and Island of Bombay. *Mauritius proportion of Females compared to that of Calcutta and Bombay.*

Females living in concubinage.

63.—There is not the least doubt that amongst the Indians there is a large number of females who are living in concubinage. One of the causes of their doing so is their not being allowed by the laws of the Colony to marry before they reach the age of 15, unless they obtain a *special dispensation* from the Governor. ‡

Under the Indian Marriage Act of 1855, females whose age exceeds 13 years, are allowed to contract marriage. It might be worthy of consideration whether the same limit of age should not be fixed here for that beyond which matrimony should be permissive, at least to Indian Females.

64.—The religious ordinances of Hindoos enjoin “*the betrothal of girls at the age of 10 or before;*” and their marriage is consummated immediately after they reach the age of puberty. According to Mahomedan law “*a girl should be married when she arrives at the age of puberty.*” And it is a well known fact that there are few girls in India of the Hindoo and Mahomedan creeds who are not married at the age of 13.

65.—The proper question to consider seems to me not to be whether early marriages such as those which, under the sanction of social customs and religious ordinances, are contracted in India, are, from an exclusively physiological point of view, preferable to later marriages : there could be no reasonable hesitation in answering such a question with a decided negative. The point deserving consideration appears to me to be rather this : can we by statutory prohibitions effectually prevent matrimonial connexions at the ages we consider too little advanced,—when we have to deal with Indians ? — Is the indirect and certain result of

the attempt to do so not to drive them into concubinage? Does such a result not lead to consequences the very opposite of those we aim at realising? Does the withholding of the sanction of the law from the early matrimonial alliances of Indian Females not frequently engender Crime?—Is a wider diffusion of the lights of science, and of the teachings of civilisation and christianity, not a surer and safer means of attaining the ends in view?—I do not take upon myself to solve these questions; I merely put them forward because my experience leads me to believe that they are worthy of serious consideration.

66.—The employments of the Population in 1871 and 1861 are shewn in Appendix No. 19. I have thought it right to divide them, as recommended by Dr. Farr, into the six following classes:—

68.—I have multiplied the subdivisions of every Class of Employments, so as to present all possible distinctions between them. A more restricted classification having been followed in 1861 comparisons between that year and 1871 are not easy in regard to every occupation, but the occupations at the date of the last Census have unquestionably been more fully described.

Whereas the Attorneys-at-law and Notaries, who were enumerated together in 1861, only amounted then to 55 in all, in 1871 there were 61 Attorneys-at-law, and 14 Notaries.

While Physicians, Surgeons, and Dentists, numbered together, only amounted to 53 in 1861,—in 1871 there were 62 Surgeons and Physicians, and 7 Dentists.

Decrease in Christian Ministers of Religion.

70.—While Priests not belonging to any of the Christian denominations have increased, as above shewu, from 31 in 1861 to 60 in 1871, Christian Ministers have decreased in number :—the latter, enumerated together with the Scripture-Readers and Catechists belonging to their respective creeds, amounted to 95 in 1861, and only to 83 in 1871. Of these 83, 27 were Catechists.

Fewer Actors and Actresses.

71.—The number of professional Actors and Actresses fell from 78 in 1861 to 12 in 1871.

Photographers & Painters.

72.—While no Painters have been returned as Artists in the last enumeration, 21 persons are stated to be practising Photography as a profession.

The Professors, however, I believe, include a few professional Painters of Portraits and Landscapes, who devote their time rather to the teaching of their Art than to its practice as a profession.

DOMESTIC CLASS.

73.—The totals of the various orders of the Domestic Class were nearly the same in 1871 as at the previous Census :

75. Livery-Stable Keepers, who fall under the Domestic Class according to Dr. Farr's principles, have increased from 25 in 1861 to 118 in 1871. Of these, 101 men and 3 women were Indians.

COMMERCIAL CLASS.

Merchants and Shopkeepers, Hawkers and Pedlars.

76.—Merchants and Commission-Agents, who were numbered together in 1861, formed a total then of 271; in 1871 there were only 170 Merchants and 23 Commission-Agents. The number of Shopkeepers likewise fell from 4071 in 1861 to 2725 in 1871. On the other hand the number of Brokers rose from 38 in 1861

to 64 in 1871; and the number of itinerant traders (hawkers and pedlars) from 1641 to 3961. Porters and Messengers likewise increased from 193 in 1861 to 298 in 1871.

77.—Whereas 98,042 persons were engaged in agricultural pursuits in 1861 (96,959 males and 1,083 females), only 76,131 persons were returned as belonging to that Class in 1871 (75,243 males and 888 females). The decrease chiefly took place amongst agricultural laborers, whose numbers stood thus:—

78.—These figures shew that, on the whole, less labor is now bestowed on the cultivation of the soil than there was formerly. Considering this general result, in connection with the fact that the production of Sugar may be regarded as not having materially declined, although it has fluctuated according as the seasons have been more or less favorable to the plantations, the deduction seems to be warranted that greater economy is now practised on the Sugar-Estates and that the methods of cultivation and manufacture now in use are better than those which were formerly followed.*

79.—That the working of the Sugar-Estates is carried on with greater economy is further evidenced by the subjoined figures :

80.—On the other hand the number of Sirdars increased from 1779 to 1929, in the above mentioned period, which indicates a greater scarcity of labor at the close of that period than at its commencement. It is a noticeable fact that the gangs of laborers whose engagements expire divide themselves into more numerous sections, and that the number of Sirdars increases faster, when labor is scarce than when it is comparatively less so.

Larger number of Sirdars.

81.—A new occupation has been introduced into the table of employments—one which had not been taken notice of specially at any previous Census: that of the *Job-Contractor*. There were 192 men following that occupation in April last: their number is likewise liable to increase as labor becomes scarcer.

82.—Hewers of wood were fewer: the numbers being 527 in 1861 and only 371 in 1871: this decrease is probably in some measure due to the forest-area of the Colony having itself undergone a great reduction within the last ten years.

Great reductions in numbers of Sempstresses, Tailors and Bag-makers.

86.—The very large falling off shewn in the number of Sempstresses, Dressmakers and Tailors is doubtless to be attributed to larger importations of ready-made clothes, and to the greater use now made of sewing-machines. The very large decrease in the number of makers of bags is probably due also to more extensive importations of bags made abroad, and to the more limited cultivation of the vacoa-tree*

* The *Pandanus Utilis*, which supplies the leaves with which sugar-bags are made.

87.—The Engineers ought to have been placed in the Professional Class ; but I have not been able to do so because no distinction was made by most of the Enumerators between them and Mechanics. In future enumerations detailed instructions ought to be issued in regard to the distinction to be made between the Skilled Engineer and the ordinary Artizan.

Engineers.

88.—In the last class, called the *Indefinite and Non-productive*, there were 1648 Independent Proprietors, Annuitants, and Fundholders : 1087 males and 561 females. In 1861 they had amounted to larger numbers :—1908 males, 969 females ; total 2877.

INDEFINITE AND NON-PRODUCTIVE CLASS.
Independent Proprietors and Annuitants.

89.—Whereas there were only 117 Jobmen in 1861, their number increased to 955 in 1871. Most of these are time-expired Indian Immigrants who, instead of entering into contracts of service, or labouring continuously at any trade or calling on their own account, prefer working *for daily wages or by the job*.

Jobmen.

90.—No less than 155,688 persons were returned as *Unemployed* ; and 7,664 others as having no specified employments.

Persons unemployed.

The Unemployed, compared to the total resident population, stand in the proportion of 492 per 1000. They include the Sick in the Public Hospitals, the Infirm and Insane in the Public Asylums, Prisoners, Pensioners, Dependents on Relatives, and all Females and Children who follow no regular trade or calling.

91.—It is presumable that Deserters, Vagrants, and others liable to arrest kept aloof from the Enumerators, dreading the risk of being apprehended ; and I fear that many besides, looking upon the Census as only a means of preparing the way for the levying of the poll-tax which had been the subject of long discussions in the Legislative Council shortly before, likewise avoided declaring themselves, notwithstanding all the endeavors made to re-assure them.

Deserters and Vagrants.

Dread of taxation.

92.—Appendix No. 18 shews how many persons of the Indian Population, and how many of the General Population were engaged in each separate employment.

Respective Occupations of Indian Population and General Population.

In the learned professions there were no Indians ; but out of 2913 Civil Servants, 442 were Indians, and there were 80 Indian Schoolmasters and Teachers amongst the 478 reported as the total number.

There were 5 Indian Priests professing Christian Creeds, and 60 others who were not Christians.

Amongst 27 Christian Catechists and Scripture-Readers, 15 were Indians.

Amongst the Clerks not engaged in commercial business, of whom there were 865 in all, no less than 125 were Indians.

93.—In the Domestic Class, Indians largely preponderated over the General Population ; the respective numbers were as follows :

The commencement of these increases being almost co-incident with the outburst of epidemic fever in the Colony, this visitation seems to be one of the causes, if not the only cause, of the gradual extension of the number of Insane since 1867.

Of the 134 Insane who were in the Asylum on the 10th April last, 45 were Indians : 30 males, and 15 females.

115. Of the 540 Deaf only 2 were described as both deaf and dumb. Both were males, and belonged to the General Population.

116. I endeavored to ascertain how many of the cases of cecity and mutism were *congenital*, and how many *accidental*; but the information gathered in that respect is too imperfect to be relied upon. All the inquiries made in regard to infirmities encountered the greatest indifference in the poorer classes, and a decided reluctance in the upper ranks of society to make any disclosure whatever. This hesitation to unveil family secrets, which almost always involve causes of deep affliction to those who are questioned, may easily be conceived. Wherever it was persistently manifested in spite of all explanations and all attempted re-assurances as to there being no risk of a violation of secrecy, the inquiries were waived.

121.—It has taken more than eight months to prepare this report and its appendices—a space of time which, to those who are unacquainted with the labor which had to be gone through, may seem long. But all who are familiar with the work of a Census, and who know the peculiar disadvantages under which it has to be carried out in this Island, will, I presume, not consider that more time has been spent upon the work than was absolutely necessary.

122.—I am, besides, not without hope that the efforts which have been made to render the results of the enumeration as comprehensive as possible, will be judged by Your Excellency not to have been altogether unsuccessful.

CENSUS OF 1871.

INSTRUCTIONS TO SUPERINTENDENTS AND ENUMERATORS.

(1.) INSTRUCTIONS TO SUPERINTENDENTS.

1.—On receiving notice of his appointment, each Census Superintendent will have to call at the Census Office, for a plan of his Sub-district, and for such verbal instructions as the Census Commissioner may have to give him.

2.—The Superintendent will first have to make himself thoroughly acquainted with the limits of his Sub-district, by a careful examination of the map of the District in the Surveyor General's Office, and by a personal inspection of the roads and other boundary-lines which circumscribe the Sub-district.

3.—He will have to confer with the Superintendents of the Sub-districts contiguous to his, so that a mutual understanding may be come to with them, in reference to the limits of their respective Sub-districts.

4.—He must next subdivide his Sub-district into as many Sections as the Census Commissioner may require, and describe the limits of each Section in a memorandum forwarded to the Commissioner; adding thereto, if possible, a plan of each Section.

5.—The Superintendent will have to call before him all the Enumerators appointed to his Sub-district, and assign to each his Section, explaining minutely and carefully what its boundaries are to be.

6.—He will then read and explain to them the printed "*Instructions to Enumerators*" issued by the Census Commissioner, and give over a copy of them to each Enumerator with a blank Memorandum-Book and two copies of form A, headed "*Return of Houses,*" and explain how the form has to be filled up.—In the first page of the Memorandum-Book given to each Enumerator the Superintendent will have to write a correct description of the boundaries of the Enumerator's Section.

7.—The Superintendent must see that on or before the

first of March next the Enumerators commence their tour of inspection, for the purpose of filling up the "Return of Houses,"—and must give them all the requisite directions for the proper performance of that important duty.

8.—When brought to him, the Returns of Houses must be attentively examined by him, and, if found incorrect in any particular, must be rectified. Doubtful points as to locality must be settled by the Superintendent by a personal visit to each place which has to be verified. On the 12th of March at latest, a copy of each Return of Houses, certified by the Superintendent to be correct, must be forwarded to the Census Commissioner.

9.—The Superintendent will then indut upon the Census Office for as many copies of the *House-holder's Schedule* (form B.) as he will require for his Sub-district;—and will distribute them to his Enumerators explaining fully how they are to be filled up.

10.—Special Schedules will be supplied for Sugar-Estates, Distilleries, Prisons, Churches, Asylums and other large Establishments, with special instructions respecting them.

11.—On the 31st March the Enumerators must be sent through their respective Sections, for the purpose of delivering a *House-Holder's Schedule* to each House-holder. Each Enumerator must then have in his possession his *Return of Houses* and his *Memorandum-Book*.

12.—On completing the delivery of his House-holders' Schedules, each Enumerator must present himself before the Superintendent, and report that he has performed that duty;—and, at the same time, he must submit his *Memorandum-Book* to the Superintendent.

13.—On the 4th April and the following day all the House-holders' Schedules will have to be collected by the Enumerators, and arranged by them in consecutive and numerical order.

14.—For the purpose of filling up the Schedules of those House-holders who cannot write, each Enumerator will have to be accompanied by as many Sub-Enumerators as the extent of the work to be gone through will require. The Superintendent will have to present a report to the Census Commissioner on the 1st April stating how many Sub-Enumerators are, in his opinion, necessary in his Sub-district,—and will act according to the instructions he will receive thereupon.

15.—When long distances have to be travelled over on the 4th and 5th of April, the Enumerators will also be

supplied with such means of travelling as the Census Commissioner will have previously authorised.

16.—When all the Schedules of his Sub-district will have been collected and delivered to him, with the Declarations required by Art 15 of Ord. No. 3 of 1871, it will be the business of the Superintendent to examine these Schedules and to see whether they have been completely and correctly filled up ;—if they have not, he will as quickly as practicable, cause every omission to be repaired and every inaccuracy to be rectified, as far as possible.

17.—No Enumerator will be entitled to his remuneration unless he present a Certificate from the Superintendent of his Sub-district, stating that the enumeration of his Section has been fully and satisfactorily gone through.

18.—After having examined all the Schedules and satisfied himself as to their accuracy, the Superintendent shall sign a Certificate to that effect and forward it to the Census Commissioner.

19.—The Superintendent shall thereafter make out a *Summary Report* of the results of his Schedules according to the special instructions he shall have received in that respect, and shall forward the said Summary Report and the Schedules to the Census Office, on or before the 13th April next.

20.—If any vacancy occur in the Staff of Enumerators, the Superintendent must immediately report it to the Census Commissioner with a view to the appointment of a new Enumerator. If there be no time for communicating with the Census Commissioner, the Superintendent may make the appointment himself—taking care in either case to furnish the newly-appointed Enumerator with directions as to his duties and to ascertain that he understands how to discharge those duties.

(2.) INSTRUCTIONS TO ENUMERATORS.

Duties before the 1st of March 1871.

1.—Every Enumerator, immediately after his appointment, must sign a document stating his acceptance of his office on the terms proposed to him. After such acceptance he will be considered bound to act as an Enumerator, and, in the event of any wilful default in the performance of his

duties, will be liable to the penalties prescribed by Ord. No. 3 of 1871.

2.—He must acquire a thorough and minute knowledge of the Section which he has undertaken to enumerate;—for which purpose he must make himself familiarly acquainted with its precise boundaries.

3.—He should also thoroughly familiarise himself with the various forms which will have to pass through his hands.

Duties between the 1st and 30th of March 1871.

4.—Within the first week of March next, every Enumerator will have to take a written account of all the houses situated within his Section, whether they be occupied or not, in a printed form which will be supplied to him by his Superintendent.

5.—On receiving that form, the Enumerator must apply to the Superintendent for full instructions as to the manner of filling it up.

6.—On the 9th of March next, a certified Copy of the form so filled up must be submitted to the Superintendent for examination.

7.—If any error or omission be discovered in the form, the Enumerator will have immediately to proceed to the part of his Section which has to be verified, and to rectify the form according to the directions of the Superintendent.

Duties after the 30th March 1871.

8.—On the morning of Friday the 31st March, the Enumerator will have to begin another tour through his Section for the purpose of depositing the Schedules which have to be filled up by the House-holders.

9.—He must call at every house within his Section, taking the houses in the order in which they stand in his verified *Return of Houses* (Form A).

10.—If any important changes have taken place in any house since the first visit, (such as the removal of its Principal Occupier or any of its inmates) he must note the change in his Memorandum-Book.

11.—Each Schedule must be *numbered* and deposited in the hands of the principal occupier; to whom the Enumerator must furnish all necessary explanations as to the manner of filling it up.

12.—Each House-holder must be *particularly reminded* that the Schedule has to be filled up on the morning of Tuesday the 4th April, and that it must be ready to be returned to the Enumerator on that day.

13.—Immediately after the delivery of all his Schedules, the Enumerator must report to his Superintendent that he has completed their delivery ;—and at the same time he must submit the notes in his Memorandum-Book, relative to the changes which have taken place within his Section since the Form A was filled up.

Collection of the House-holders' Schedules.

14.—Early on the morning of Tuesday the 4th of April, the Enumerator will have to begin the collection of the Schedules of his Section.

15.—If on inquiry for any Schedule it be returned to him *not* filled up, he must fill it up himself asking all necessary questions. He should, if possible, see the Head of the Family, and obtain the requisite information from him. In his absence any other member of the family may supply the necessary particulars.

16.—If the deposited Schedule be lost or mislaid the Enumerator must supply a fresh one.

17.—After having completed his entries on the Schedule, he must read it over to the Occupier or person in charge of the house and get the informant to sign it with his or her name or mark.

18.—The Enumerator must not omit to enter persons in any Schedule, because he cannot get all the required information concerning them. He must enter them,—mentioning the reason why any of the particulars is not inserted.

19.—Where there are several Occupiers in one House *i. e. distinct House-holders*, their Schedules, although they bear different Nos. should be pinned, tied or otherwise fastened together, and on the packet should be written the No. of the House in Form A.

20.—On the day of the collection of the Schedules, the Enumerator should take care to call at *every house in his Section*, whether it be described in form A as *occupied, uninhabited, or being built*.

General Instructions.

21.—The Enumerator must behave with the utmost courtesy towards every House-holder or other person with

whom he has to deal in carrying out his duties. Any breach of this rule will render the Enumerator liable to the forfeiture of his allowances.

22.—If any person refuse to make a written return, or to answer the questions which the Enumerator is authorised to put, or in any way obstruct the Enumerator in the discharge of his duties, he will be free to remind such person of the penalties prescribed by law against such offences, and may shew such person the following extracts from Ord. No. 3 of 1871 :

Penalty for re- 21.—The Superin-
fusing informa- tendants and Enu-
tion or giving merators employed
false answers. in the execution of
this Ordinance, shall
be authorized to ask all such ques-
tions as shall be directed in any
instructions issued to them by the
Census Commissioner, and every
person refusing to give an answer,
or wilfully giving a false answer to
any such question, shall, for every
such refusal or wilful false answer,
forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty
Pounds nor less than Twenty shil-
lings.

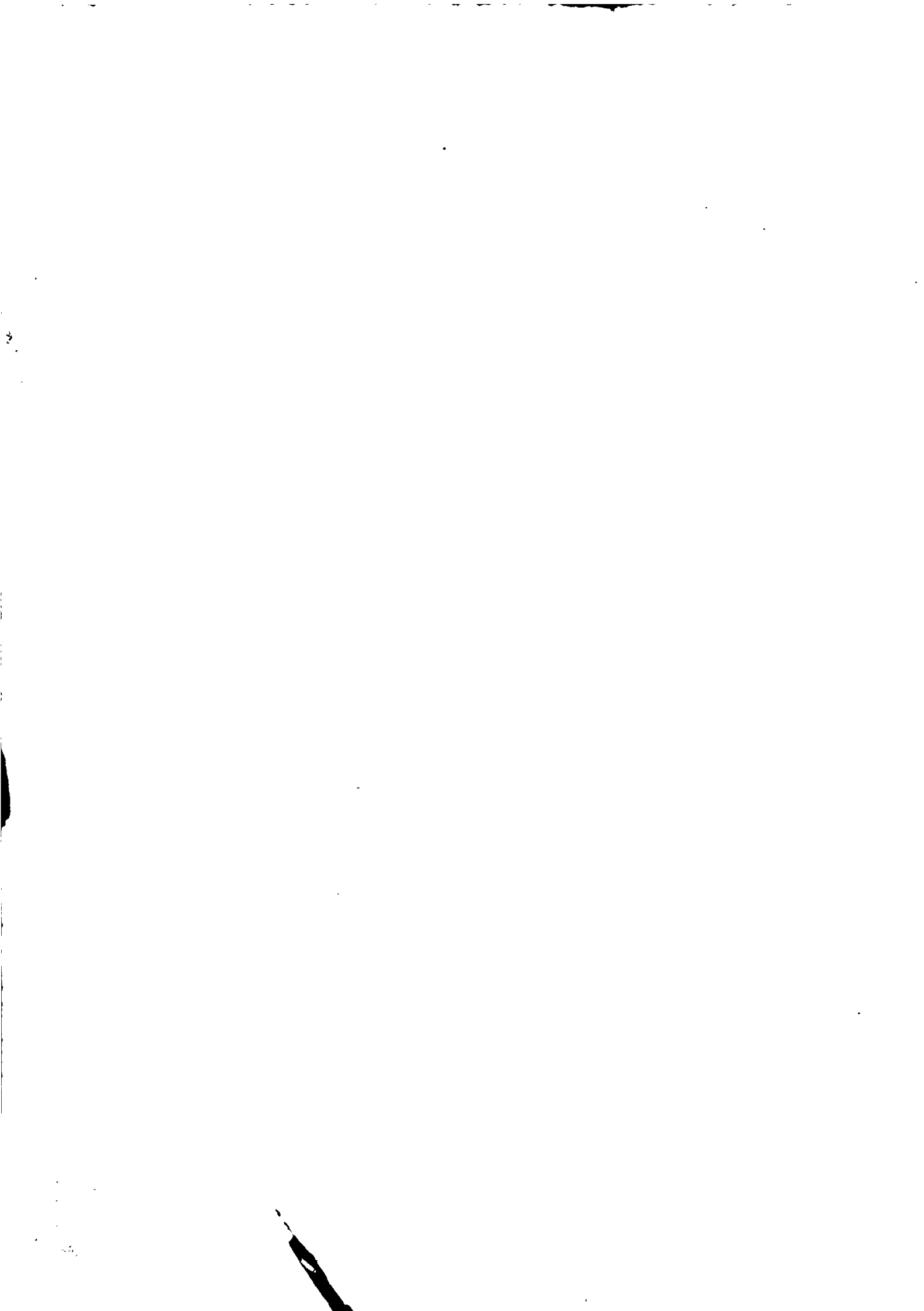
Penalty for 22.—Any person
obstruction, &c., obstructing, assault-
of Officers. ing or molesting any
Enumerator or other
Officer, while the latter shall be
performing any duty assigned to
him by this Ordinance, shall be
adjudged guilty of an offence, and
shall, upon conviction, be liable to
a fine not exceeding Fifty Pounds,
and in case of non-payment to im-
prisonment not exceeding Three
months.

est tenu de remplir cette forme.**

1.—Il faut inscrire dans cette forme toutes les personnes qui auront passé la nuit du 10 Avril 1871 sur votre établissement ou dans votre maison.

2.—Vous êtes prié de remplir cette forme d'après les instructions suivantes :—

Colonne marquée A.—Il faut inscrire les noms dans l'ordre suivant :—(1) Le chef de la maison ; (2) sa femme et ses enfants ; (3) ses autres parents ; (4) les visiteurs ; (5) les pensionnaires ; (6) les serviteurs.

Colonne B.—Déclarez si la personne inscrite est votre femme, votre fille, &c., ou si c'est un pensionnaire, un visiteur ou un serviteur.

Colonne C.—Vis-à-vis le nom de chaque adulte inscrivez M pour marié ; N. M. pour non marié ; ou V. pour veuf ou veuve.

Colonne D.—Insérez M pour masculin ; F pour Féminin.

Colonne E.—L'âge de chaque personne à son dernier anniversaire doit être correctement mentionné : celui des enfants au-dessous d'un an doit être donné en mois.

Colonne F.—La profession ou l'état doit être précisé autant que possible.—Ceux qui sont employés dans le commerce doivent déclarer s'ils sont Négociants, Banquiers, Courtiers, Boutiquiers, Colporteurs ; ou quel est le genre de commerce dont ils s'occupent. Les commis, les artisans et les ouvriers doivent préciser la branche dans laquelle ils sont employés.—En inscrivant les domestiques et les laborateurs il faut expliquer l'emploi particulier de chacun. A ceux qui sont employés à l'Agriculture, ajoutez Agr. Relativement aux enfants âgés de plus de 6 ans, il faut dire s'ils vont à une école du Gouvernement ou à une école privée, ou s'ils reçoivent de l'instruction chez eux ; ou bien s'ils n'en reçoivent pas du tout.

Colonne G.—Ajoutez N aux Nouveaux Immigrants et A aux Anciens.

Colonne H.—Quant aux Indiens, dites s'ils sont nés dans la Présidence de Calcutta ou dans celle de Madras ou de Bombay ;—et s'ils sont Immigrants. Pour les Immigrants ajoutez Im.

Colonne I.—Anglais, Français, Allemand, &c., selon la nationalité.

Colonne J.—Si la personne est née avec l'infirmité, ajoutez de *naissance*.

Colonne K.—Expliquez quant aux Chrétiens leurs croyances respectives ;—quant aux autres, dites s'ils sont Juifs, Hindous, Mahométans, Bouddhistes, Parsis, Sikhs ; ou bien à quelle autre croyance ils appartiennent.

Colonne L.—Cette colonne sera remplie par l'Énumérateur.

3.—Cette forme devra être remplie dans la matinée du Mardi 11 Avril 1871 ; elle vous sera réclamée le même jour ou aussitôt que possible après cette date.

4.—Les personnes qui refuseront de donner les renseignements qui leur sont demandés, ou qui donneront sciemment de faux renseignements seront passibles d'une amende n'excédant pas £ 20.

5.—Vous pouvez autoriser toute autre personne à remplir cette forme pour vous si vous ne pouvez la remplir vous-même ; mais comme vous serez, même alors, personnellement responsable de l'exactitude des renseignements fournis, vous aurez à les vérifier.

**Instructions for the guidance of M
has to fill up this Schedule.**

1.—You must enter on this Schedule all persons who will have passed the night of Monday the 10th April 1871, on your premises.

2.—You are requested to fill up this Schedule according to the following instructions :

Column marked A.—Enter the names in the following order :—(1) head of family ; (2) wife and children ; (3) other relatives ; (4) visitors ; (5) boarders ; (6) servants.

Column B.—State whether the person inserted is your wife, son, daughter or other relative ; or a visitor, boarder or servant.

Column C.—Opposite the name of every adult enter M for married ; U for unmarried ; or W for widower or widow.

Column D.—Enter M for males and F for females.

Column E.—The age of each person at his or her last birth-day must be accurately stated :—when under one year state it in months.

Column F.—The occupation or trade must be particularised as much as possible. Every person belonging to the commercial class should state whether he is a merchant, banker, broker, shopkeeper or hawkler ; or what else is his peculiar pursuit, calling or rank. Clerks, tradesmen and artisans should mention in what particular branch of business they are employed.—Referring to laborers and servants mention the peculiar calling of each : to those who are employed in cultivation, add Agr.—Referring to children above 6 years old, state whether they attend a Government or a private school ; or receive tuition at home ; or none.

Column G.—Add N to New Immigrants ; and O to Old.

Column H.—Referring to Indians, state whether they were born in the Presidency of Calcutta, Madras or Bombay ; and whether they are Immigrants or not. To Immigrants add Im.

Column I.—English, French, German, or whatever the Nationality may be.

Column J.—If from birth add Bru.

Column K.—If Christian, the denomination ; if not Christian, whether Jew, Hindoo, Mahometan, Buddhist, Parsee, Sikh or whatever the religion may be.

Column L.—This column will be filled up by the Enumerator.

3.—This form must be filled up on the morning of Tuesday, the 11th day of April 1871 ; it will be called for on that day or as soon after as possible.

4.—Persons who refuse to give information, or wilfully give false information, will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £ 20.

5.—Any person authorised by you, may write in the particulars if you are yourself unable to do so ;—if so, you must ascertain that the entries are quite correct, by having them read to you.

I have now the honor to submit the second part of my report : that which has reference to the Dependencies of Mauritius. The difficulty I experienced in communicating with some of them has been the cause of its not having been brought forward at an earlier date.

15.—The Insane not having been enumerated in 1861, whether Insanity has since declined or increased cannot be stated; but compared to the Census of 1851 that of 1871 only shows an increase of one case.

It has to be borne in mind that the figures returned only exhibit the number of cases existing in the Dependencies at the time of each Census; and that all Lunatic Paupers needing confinement have been transferred to the Lunatic Asylum in Port Louis.

16.—In the letter I addressed to the Honorable the Colonial Secretary when I sent him the first part of my Report for submission to Your Excellency, I made mention of the names of all the Census Officers whose assistance had proved particularly useful to me. I now think it further due to Mr. John B. KYSIE, of the Colonial Secretary's Office, that I should specially testify to the alacrity, intelligence and ability with which he has aided me throughout all my labors, from the devising of the preliminary arrangements for the taking of the Census, to the correcting of the letter-press of this last part of my Report.
