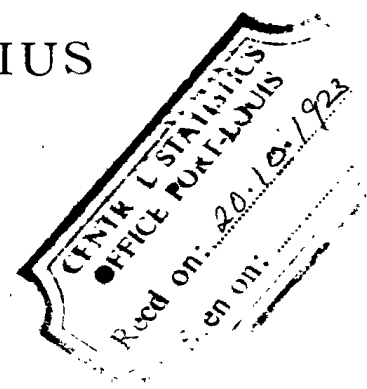

ON THE NIGHT OF THE 21st MAY, 1921.

Introductory

1. The Census of Mauritius and its Dependencies was taken under the provisions of Ordinance No. 41 of 1920, on the night of Friday the 20th of May 1921.

2. Owing to the circumstances referred to in Chapter III on Census Administration, the final report on the enumeration has been unavoidably delayed. A Preliminary report was submitted on August 3rd, 1921 and a short summary of the final results on June 16, 1923. The present report contains the full statistical tables under all the main heads of Enumeration and although completed in August, 1924 was not sent to press until all the tables had been printed so that reference to them might be more effectively controlled.

3. The general plan of this final report is as follows:—

CHAPTER I contains statistical summaries from previous Censuses and other sources under the principal heads of enumeration—class, sex, age, civil condition, birth place, occupation and religion—and under their main classifications bearing on the composition and evolution of the population.

CHAPTER II gives summaries of the results of 1921 Census.

CHAPTER III deals with the Administrative methods for enumeration and compilation.

CHAPTER IV deals with some considerations on the graduation of the age distributions and the errors which inevitably occur in the Mauritius and other Census enumerations.

The detailed statistical tables are given in the Appendices—Appendix I includes details under the principal heads of Enumeration for each district. Appendix II contains details, for the whole Colony, of certain industrial occupations and extended tables of population under class and age groups as well as mortality returns. In Appendix III is given the references to those villages which, for administrative purposes had to be divided up for enumeration.

4. A large amount of information in Manuscript has been prepared and will be deposited for Safe keeping at the Archives, until such time as it is considered advisable to constitute a permanent Census Office in Mauritius. This is the first Census in which this step has been taken. The absence of full details of compilation in previous Censuses has been found extremely annoying when comparative statements are required under headings for which extended tables were not printed.

5. Two special investigations have been published as Nos. 4 and 5 of the series of Studies in Mauritius Statistics.

No. 4 Agricultural Labour.

No. 5 Overpopulation and Pauperism.

CHAPTER I.

Origin of the Population

6. In order correctly to interpret the statistics of population in Mauritius a brief sketch of the History of the Colony is essential as otherwise it is difficult, if not impossible, to understand the manner in which the present population has been built up and appreciate at their full value the sources from which it has been drawn.

For this purpose it is not necessary to consider the conditions prior to the French occupation in 1721. The act of possession has been carried out in 1715 by Mr. Dafresne, Captain of the Chasseur, but no French settlers landed on the Island until 1721 September 23.

These settlers appear to have come, in the first instance, from among the French families in the neighbouring Island of Reunion and it is to be presumed that they brought with them a certain number of slaves originating from the African Continent.

7. Statistics of Population are not numerous previous to the British occupation but it has been possible to extract, principally from Baron d'Unienville's excellent statistical works on Mauritius, certain details bearing on this question which are given in subsequent paragraphs.

The statistics from previous reports are not so complete as it was desired, as they were no funds from which clerical assistance could be paid. A complete and authoritative statistical abstract is much needed.

8. The principal channels through which the population has come are :—

- (1)—The French Emigrants,
- (2)—The slave population principally of African origin,
- (3)—The Chinese trader,
- (4)—The Indian immigrant or Indian merchant,
- (5)—The British official merchant or planter,

of the minor influxes the most important come from Madagascar and Ceylon.

9. The great part of the intermixture of the European and African races undoubtedly occurred during the slave regime. The Chinese trader has also intermarried or cohabited with the African, Indian or mixed-races, but as they have always formed a very small minority of the total population the effect is not marked.

10. It is extremely difficult in a Census Enumeration to deal with a question of a nature which, in a Colony like Mauritius, is so extremely delicate as the classification of the population under the various mixed races, but there is no doubt that on the whole the proportion derived from direct intermarriage or cohabitation is small as compared with the total population of the present day and the greater part of the mixed races of to-day derive their origin from intermarriage among themselves. The African type is still to be found in a peculiarly strong manner in the non-Indian coloured population round the coast and in Rodrigues, and it would be a matter of some considerable interest to secure the anthropological measurements of some of the most marked types after two centuries of the new and exceptional environment, if only to serve as a comparison at some future date. The sub-classification of Africans was abandoned after the 1901 Census and the Commissioner of that year commented as follows on the return of 512 males as 131 females classified as Africans.

“I am bound to report that, in my opinion, the return given under the heading (b) Africans appears to be much under-estimated and that the officers have taken a very liberal view and have included under (a) “Europeans, whites, mixed and coloured” many hundreds of persons who, to all intents and purposes, bear the racial characteristics of pure Africans. My reasons for this opinion are as follows :—

“In my short references to the Censuses of 1846 and 1851, it was shown that, at these dates, the ex-apprentice class numbered 49,365 and 48,330 respectively, and although intermixture then and since the latter date has largely diminished the number of pure Africans by descent, it is difficult to believe that it has been so complete as to leave only 643 persons of that class remaining.”

“I estimate that there are probably between 2,000 and 3,000 persons, who, by racial class, should be included under the heading of Africans and deducted from the number returned under the heading Europeans, whites, mixed and coloured.”

“In the report of 1851 the classification “Ex-apprentices” gave 48,330 and it was already decreasing year by year owing to a certain number having become merged into the class of General Population.”

11. The great predominating influence of civilisation has undoubtedly been French and practically all the Census work is conducted either in the French language or the creole Patois. The Indian element use either their own vernacular or the Patois, but very rarely English.

The civilising and christianising influence of the French element on the non-Indian coloured races in Mauritius is well worth a very close and detailed study. It has persisted with but little external interference for nearly two centuries and although it is difficult to examine in detail in an official report, it is evident that this influence cannot be ignored in dealing with administrative questions. Any statistics which will help to estimate it at its true value are in consequence important.

12. The composition of the original population of the Colony was described by D'Unienville in his excellent statistical summary in Mauritius as follows :—

“Des militaires retirés, des marins de tous grades, et des employés de la Compagnie, composèrent pendant longtemps la majeure partie des habitants de cette colonie. Depuis la guerre de 1778, la population s'accrut successivement de Français, attirés par l'espoir de la fortune et par les récits enchanteurs que faisaient de cette île, les officiers de terre et de mer qui en revenaient.

“La Revolution determina encore des emigrations a l'île de France : ceux qui prévoyaient les troubles de la France, ceux qui déjà en avaient été les témoins, arrivèrent les premiers, et furent suivis, après la paix d'Amiens, par ceux qui, ayant perdu leur fortune et cherchant les moyens d'en acquérir, tournèrent les yeux sur les colonies. Les Antilles souffraient, St. Domingue n'était plus... ! L'île de France célèbre par sa conduite ferme et prudente de ses habitants, fixa tous les regards.

“Depuis la conquête, nombre d'anciens colons qui ont quitté l'île, y ont été remplacés, soit par les Anglais qui sont venus s'y établir, soit par les Français, encore attirés par l'espoir de la fortune, ou par le désir du repos.”

and again in the statistical table 10 of the Volume III :—

“La population qui occupe l'île Maurice offre la réunion d'hommes de presque toutes les contrées de l'univers ; elle se divise en trois classes bien distinctes :—

“La population blanche, composée de Créoles, de Français de naissance de presque toutes les provinces, mais particulièrement de celle de Bretagne, de

“Provence et de Guyenne, d’Anglais, d’Ecosais, d’Irlandais, de quelques Allemands et d’autres Européens, maintenant en petit nombre.

“La population de couleur est formée de mulâtre et de noirs nés libres, ou affranchis depuis plus ou moins longtemps, d’Indiens et de Chinois.

“La population esclave est mélangée de natifs de l’île, dits créoles, de natifs des différentes contrées de l’Afrique, de Madagascar de l’Inde et de quelques Malais.

“Les Africains sont sinon les plus intelligents, du moins les plus nombreux et les meilleurs.”

13. The following table gives a summary of the population under the main classes as they existed at the dates to which they refer.

15. It will be seen from this table how the Indian element has grown to become the dominating factor, numerically, in Mauritius and it is a matter for interesting speculation to determine whether the influence of the European element on the Asiatic races in Mauritius will follow the same trend as it has in the case of the African element.

16. The early history of Indian Immigration is summarised in Chapter IV of the Frère Williamson Report. Although the introduction of Indian labourers commenced before the abolition of slavery in 1834, the steady influx from India did not begin until after the regime of forced labour ceased. Organised immigration must therefore be considered a consequence of the abolition of slavery, in spite of the contrary statement made in the Frère Williamson Report.

The earliest record of Indian labour is to be found in Bernardin de St. Pierre’s voyage à l’île de France where it is stated that in 1769 Indians from Malabar coast, mostly from Pondicherry, came to Mauritius and let themselves out as free labourers for a certain number of years.

17. The commercial aptitude of the Indian population which has been a feature of the Indianisation of the Colony since their introduction manifested itself at a very early date, and may in fact be looked upon as one of the causes of the oft recurring agricultural labour difficulties. Even the convicts established themselves as small shopkeepers and quickly became prosperous traders.

18. “The first occasion on which the aid of Government was sought in support of emigration from India was in 1829” but the system of immigration under exclusive Government Agency did not commence until the year 1844, the first contingent, consisting of 138 men 56 women and 33 children, arriving in April 24th on the “Appoline.” The numbers introduced each year from 1834 onwards are given in the accompanying table.

The note on page (lxxxviii) of Appendix 1 was written before a copy of the Frère Williamson report became available. It is possible therefore that some very old Indians do still exist in the Colony.

19. These Indians were recruited from various parts of India but principally from Madras, and the United provinces. Statistics of the relative numbers are not easy to procure but judging from the fairly even distribution of the Madras and Hindustani dialects these two elements appear to have been about equally divided. The central recruiting bureau in Northern India was at Benares while, during the later years up to 1910, the principal source of labour must have been Madras.

20. This resume of the Economic development of the population in Mauritius would be incomplete without some reference to the question of land tenure which has played such an important part in the settlement of the Indian in the Colony and of his influence on the slowly but gradually awakening sense of a Mauritian entity,—towards which everything appears to be tending in Mauritius—to which reference is made in paragraph 60 Chapter II when dealing with the difficulties of classification by names in the 1921 Census. The following summary of the ownership of land so far as the records in Mauritius permit, illustrates very clearly the trend of evolution of the Indian land tenure.

21. It is a matter for serious consideration whether the time has not come to revise the classification of

“European” being reserved entirely for those born in Europe or whose father and mother were born in Europe. “Mauritian” referring to all those who at present are classed in the General Population and those whose association with the Colony and its aspirations are sufficiently developed to lead them to voluntarily insert in their own Census schedule the classification “Mauritian,” whether they be of European, or Indian or Asiatic descent. At all events the arbitrary classification of more or less efficient enumerators would be checked and the growth of a “Mauritian” entity directly measured. As is pointed out in paragraph 60 Chapter 11, some change will be necessary in the near future as the classification by names is becoming misleading, unless a change of name is to be considered an indication of voluntary absorption in the “Mauritian” class.

Proportion of Males to Females

22. From d’Unienville’s Statistical abstracts returns of Males and Females are given for the years 1817 and 1825 from which it will be seen that the disproportion between the sexes in Mauritius is of long standing.

In 1817 the males exceeded the females by 26785 to 1825 by 19694.

23. On the opening of Indian Immigration the balance between the sexes was still further disturbed. This balance has been steadily re-adjusting itself during the course of 100 years by a perfectly natural process, as is evident from a consideration of the following hypothetical population, death rate and birth rate which approximates to Mauritian conditions.

24. If we consider a population of 150,000 persons with a birth rate and a death rate of 40% respectively, in the first year 6,000 will die and 6,000 be born, the population will remain stationary: but if the males amounted to 100,000 and the females to 50,000 the males will decrease by 4,000 from deaths and increase by 3,000 from births, while the females will decrease by 2,000 from deaths and increase by 3,000 from births. At the end of the year the population will stand at 99,000 males and 51,000 females, and this process will continue so long as there is any disproportion between the sexes.

25. The total number of males and females, not distinguishing the class of the population, at each census year is given below.

26. The influence of the sex distribution on the material and moral evolution of a community does not require to be emphasized. Some of the facts given in various reports on immigration, not only in Mauritius but in other Colonies, do not form pleasant reading and it is easy to understand the consistent and determined effort which has been made by the authorities to mitigate an evil which could only be entirely removed at the expense of the Industrial interests of the Agricultural Colonies which were in need of labour.

27. With the equalisation of the sexes in Mauritius has developed, as has been pointed out in other reports, a strained labour condition giving rise to difficulties which appear to vary inversely as regards the prosperity of the Sugar Industry. Female workers can never efficiently replace the male workers except in the lightest tasks and even then it brings with it many problems of child welfare and care of the workers, which are demanding attention on the part of the administration.

28. In Mauritius it is evident from the tables of statistics given above that the discrepancy between the sexes has ceased to become a problem for re-adjustment and before many years are over normal equality will be established.

Age Distribution of the Population

29. In the following tables the age distribution, as enumerated at successive Censuses, is given. There has been considerable irregularity in the presentation of these returns which renders them difficult of interpretation for general statistical purposes. Previous to 1891 the ages were collected under the two main class distributions—Indian and General. As the immigrants in the Indian population are considerable, and variable at certain epochs, it is evident that their inclusion in a general age table has introduced an indeterminate frequency superposed on the normal age frequency. Further, in the 1901 Census, for some unaccountable reason, the grouping was altered; the first year of the age being given independently and followed by quinquennial groups 1-5, 6-10 &c., instead of 1-4, 5-9, &c., It becomes difficult, in consequence, to establish comparison between successive Census returns.

In the tables which follow, the age distributions are shewn under sex only from 1851 to 1921.

The distributions under class and sex for the 1911 and 1921 Census Enumerations are given in Chapter II para. 67.

31. It will be seen from the above statement that a decrease in the number of aged Indians has occurred during the last decade. This was anticipated in the previous Census Report and is the natural consequence of the cessation of Indian Immigration which produced, first an increase in the middle ages, (which progressed to the higher ages of the other Indians) and finally a decrease in the higher ages as the older immigrants died off and the Indian population, as a whole, assumed the characteristics of a stable population, controlled by natural causes, and without the disturbing effects of immigration. The vital statistics of the Colony during the past 40 years (and, if immigration is resumed to any extent, in the next decade also) demand very careful interpretation and correction for changes in sex, age and class distribution.

32. An examination of the returns for each year of age shows the same tendency to errors in the 5's and 10's due to stating the ages in round numbers as was noted in 1911 and it is evident that a reasoned graduation is essential if these figures are to be used efficiently in the correction of death-rates, etc., but this can only be done by a permanent statistical office and qualified staff.

33. As no consecutive table of population statistics under class, sex and age has hitherto been published except in the Mauritius almanac, it has been considered advisable to re-establish the population figures in this report, corrected for errors of registration. Matters of public hygiene are occupying the attention of all classes in the Colony at the present time and an official statement of the population under class, sex and age for each year is essential if correct mortality rates are to be established. Future statistics will call for a much higher degree of accuracy than has been attained in the past if the effects of the measures to improve the general sanitary conditions of the Colony are to be judged correctly.

34. Because the general statistical problem in connexion with improved hygiene is not easily understood and because, in a Colony like Mauritius, data on which to establish rigorous comparison from year to year and between differing localities are not easily procured, there is a tendency to adopt a policy of *laissez-aller* in such matters and all attempts to place this important question on a scientific basis have so far proved unsuccessful.

35. The Colony is considered too small for a central statistical bureau and the work is relegated to officers who have other duties to perform and whose training in statistical science has not been along modern lines.

36. The result is that comparison is effected between district rates the climatic conditions of which often overlap and vary from sub-tropical to the temperate climate of early spring in the South of Europe; no correction for age or sex distribution has been attempted either between districts or over long periods of time: the exact localities for which registration is made is in many instances but vaguely known and total deaths or births are referred to areas the population of which is indeterminate.

37. This table of adjusted population returns is published in Appendix II. It has been derived as follows:

“The returns as published in the Registrar General's report and in the various Census Reports, were plotted on square paper and the yearly registration errors assumed to be constant during any given intercensal period. Making due allowance for these errors the continuous curve for each class and sex was drawn passing through the points obtained from the Census Returns. The ordinates of the curve were then read off to the nearest hundred of population. The values refer to the middle of the year [June 30th] and not to the beginning of the year as in the official returns in the Registrar General's reports. This was done as the mortality returns refer to the Calendar year and hence should be considered in connexion with the population statistics for the middle of each year.

38. The method of correcting the crude death-rates in order to obtain the rates referred to a standard population is indicated in Chapter IV where the question of eliminating the errors in the age distribution is also dealt with.

39. The population figures under ages [Table 11, Appendix II] for each year of age, two main classes and sex are based on the Census returns. This table is reproduced from the Mauritius Almanac where it was first published. It has not been brought up to the date of the 1921 Census for the reasons stated in para. 144. The age group adopted is the quinquennial age group thus eliminating, in a measure at least, the errors in the yearly age groups. It is possible that these figures may have to be modified if the more scientific method of graduation referred to in Chapter IV is ultimately adopted; but for all general purposes the figures given in table 4 Appendix II may, I consider, be used.

40. A complete summary of population returns as published in the Registrar General's reports together with the deaths in the two main classes and under sex in the selected age groups is also given in Appendix II Table 2 and 5. These estimated population figures do not of course agree with the re-computed values as based on successive revised Census returns. (Tables 3 and 4.) The administrative departments must exercise discretion in using one or the other of these population returns according to the objects they have in view.

41. The question of the Standard population to be adopted is also considered in Chapter IV.

Other statistics bearing on the Social and Economic condition of the Population

42. Other statistics bearing on the social and economic condition of the population are to be found in the statistics of birth-places and religions and these have been collected so far as the returns and absence of staff permit from previous Census reports.

43. There is evidence of remarkable stability in the returns of religions, the proportions of christian and non-christian having remained practically stationary for the last 40 years. The small variations which occur must be looked upon with suspicion as they may be ascribed to different methods of classification. It is not always easy to control the returns from an illiterate population. The slight increase in the Roman Catholics of the general population is to be found almost entirely amongst the Chinese due, in the majority of cases, to the fact that they have taken to themselves creole women who have brought up their offspring in their own faith. The decrease in the Anglicans and other Christians should be read in conjunction with the Birthplace table where it will be seen that the Europeans (persons born in Europe) have decreased from 2850 in 1861 to 425 in 1921. There is no indication whatever that the gulf between Christians and non-christians is breaking down or that the Western religions, of whatever persuasion, are influencing permanently the growing Asiatic population. As has been pointed out above the slight variations evidenced in the table are not significant owing to the difficulties of Census registration.

44. The comparative returns of Civil condition shewn in the above table present no features of special interest as the classification previous to the 1921 Census are not significant. A crude classification of non-married and married—if limited to civil marriage—gives no real information concerning the habits and customs of an Eastern community. The classification adopted in the 1921 Census is dealt with at length in Chapter II (§ 10—69 et seq) where the signification of the subclassification—Civil and Religious, or Concubinage and single are explained.

45. The only columns in the summary given above which demand some explanation are those headed "divorced" and "not married". Previous to 1911 the former do not appear to have been returned and the latter were made to include all those under 10 years of age. In the column "not—married" above, the figures, as taken from the Census reports, have been diminished by the aggregates under 10 years. They are in consequence comparable from year to year.

CHAPTER II.

In this chapter results under the main heads of enumeration are considered more fully in their relation to the period 1911 to 1921 and by comparison with the 1911 Census.

Certain portions of the report on the Census Summaries of June 16, 1923 are reproduced here for the sake of continuity and in order to render this report complete.

Positions and dimensions of districts, Islands, and dependencies.

46. The following list of Islands forming the Colony of Mauritius, with their positions and areas is taken from the report on the 1911 Census Enumeration. The total population and number of persons per square mile of each is that returned at the Census of 1921.

The total area of the main island is 716 square miles.

54. In the extended tables (table I) appendix I shewing the distribution of the population, certain villages have been divided up for the reasons stated in paragraph 101, Chapter III. In order to facilitate the work of administrative officers who desire the total population a table has been added of these villages and a reference inserted in the index. Care must in consequence be exercised and reference made both to the index and this table, as well as to the chart, if the total population of any locality is being sought.

55. The limits of the villages and townships, other than those referred to above, are nowhere clearly defined. There is an ordinance dealing with this question and a schedule of limits, but it appears to demand some radical revision at the present time.

56. The limits of two important townships—Vacoas and Phoenix have been taken to include the following charted numbers in the 1921 Census.

For details in the different districts reference should be made to Table II, of Appendix I. These returns show a continued and very marked falling off in the Estate population.

58. This radical change in the distribution of the population has been greatly accentuated since the coming into effect of the new Labour Ordinance (1922) so that the returns as shown above do not apply at the present time (May 1923). The effect of this change on the economic condition of the Indian population is likely to be considerable during the next decade, but it is a matter which cannot be dealt with in the Census Report.

Constitution of the Population in 1921.

59. The majority of the population consists mainly of Indian Immigrants and their descendants who constitute at the present time about 70% of the population.

The remainder is composed of persons of pure European descent the offspring of connexions or marriages between the different races which have at various times been introduced into the Colony and Chinese. The classification of the population is effected principally by means of the surnames; this method does not permit differentiation of the general population into those of African, Indian or European descent. In the case of the Indians and Chinese, as pointed out in paragraph 13 of the last Census report, no serious error has so far arisen. As was stated there, some further control will probably be necessary even in the case of the Indian population, and it became very evident, during the work of compilation, the influence of inter-marriages and Christian Baptism has already become a serious disturbing influence in the accuracy of classification by names.

It is, however, evident that this process is a very slow one. As far back as 1881 the Census Commissioner wrote in this connexion that "the day is not far distant when such a distinction will be next to impossible unless the parties themselves give their origin"

(paragraph 21 Census report 1881) and further on in the same paragraph "The same difficulty arose 20 years ago (*i.e.* 1861) when the population was divided into three classes

- (1)—General Population
- (2)—Ex-Apprentices
- (3)—Indians

The Census Commissioner of 1861 solved the problem by absorbing the class formerly called Ex-Apprentices into the bulk of the General Population."

60. An attempt was made during the 1921 Census to Estimate the extent to which one of the factors referred to—intermarriage—has affected the population. In the summarised statements the offspring, in the case of mixed marriages, have always been classified under the heading of the class to which the father's name appears to indicate that he belongs. Sub-classifications were then made for the offspring when the Indians appeared to have married or co-habited with creole women, creoles with Indian women or Chinese with either Indians or creoles. The following table gives a summary of the sub-classifications and it seems evident from the work in the present Census, and from general economic considerations, that there is a distinct tendency to develop a Mauritian entity, which future commissioners will have great difficulty in classifying otherwise than "Mauritian." With regard to the class-Indian Immigrant—there was even more reason during the recent Census than in the previous Census for designating them—"Indians* born out of the Colony"—as the returns of immigrants were altogether defective. It is difficult to estimate how far this is due to inattention on the part of the enumerators or to unwillingness or want of interest on the part of the members of the Indian population themselves.

The tendency to change of name as the Indian becomes absorbed into the General Population is unfortunate. A suggestion for re-considering the question of classification has already been made in paragraph 21 Chapter I.

61. The ratios of the various classes to the total population at each Census have already been given in Chapter I. (14) In the following table the proportions in each district as returned at the Census of 1921 are given. This is of special interest for Comparative purposes from Census to Census, as it indicates not only the growth of the Central townships but the nature of the problem, in these townships and villages of the higher portion of the Island, which confronts the sanitary authorities.

The table presents some features of considerable interest and has revealed a district distribution of the population which has not, I believe, hitherto been completely realised. The predominance of the General Population in the towns is clearly indicated in the ratios for Port Louis and Plaines Wilhems.

63. The equalisation of the Sexes in Port Louis and the excess of females in Plaines Wilhems are the principal features of the above table. One peculiarity of the recent Census is that the increase in the population, as shewn by the Census returns, has been entirely amongst females.

Age distribution

64. In tables III & IV (Appendix I) a full statement of the Age distribution in each class of the population and in the various districts will be found. Comparison with the 1911 Census for each quinquennial age group is given in the following table:—

65. One or two points call for attention: in the General Population the group (0-4 is smaller than the group 5-9. The cause of this has been dealt with in Chapter IV in considering the methods to be adopted for graduation of the curve. The same phenomenon is exhibited in the Indo-Mauritian class. It is quite evident that these variations are significant and their cause must be sought in the variations in the total births from year to year. It is impossible to ascribe any other cause to them: errors of Census enumeration would not form a progressive curve, such as is clearly evidenced, over certain successive age periods and especially in the Indo-Mauritian class, while no marked tide, either of emigration or immigration, has been operative during the decade.

66. Moreover as is shewn in Chapter IV if the variations in the total births over one decade are discernible in the first 10 years of the life tables, there is no reason to doubt that these same waves will be observable in subsequent ages.

The totals are formed from combinations of over 200 separate enumeration areas and from 5 consecutive age groups, and any accidental errors of enumeration cannot fail to be eliminated.

67. Further light is thrown on the problem by tabulating the age groups in Sex and Class as is done below:—

68. It will be noticed that the general features of the previous table are reproduced in the Indo-Mauritian class. It is possible that the excess of the groups: 40-50 in 1921 are due to the inclusion in the Indo-Mauritian class of a certain proportion of Indians born out of the Colony.

Civil Condition of the Population

69. The returns of Civil Condition of the population in Mauritius present features of considerable interest in view of the over-lapping customs of eastern and western races.

Two principal factors appear to have been operative in producing the conditions which obtain at the present day. (1) The disproportion between the sexes which has been very fully dealt with in other paragraphs (2) the peculiarities of the marriage laws in Mauritius and the interaction of conflicting moral stand-points.

70. In connexion with this last factor it was hoped that it would be possible to secure, for inclusion in this report, a precis of the various marriage laws and regulations which have been in force at various periods.

- in (1) the slave regime
- (2) the Indian immigrants
- (3) Religious and Civil Marriage

but it appears that it is a more difficult matter than was anticipated.

References to the influence of the laws of the Colony on the Civil condition of the Indian Immigrant population will be found in the Frere Williamson report to which frequent reference has already been made in Chapter I. In any case Ordinance 28 of 1912 makes provision for the better registration of Indian marriages and reference to this may be of interest in relation to the Frere Williamson report and the following table.

71. During the Census Enumeration of 1921 special care was taken to distinguish between those married civilly and religiously under the head married, and those living in concubinage or single under the head "unmarried."

72. The large number of persons living in concubinage are not to be considered as living immoral lives according to their Eastern Standards; the unions are, to all intents and purposes, permanent ones, large families being born from them.

In the case of the General Population it arises very frequently from the difficulties of obtaining the necessary documents, birth certificates, &., and the general annoyance of official proceedings, as well as from an inheritance of indifference on the

the subject handed down from the days when legal marriage was forbidden under the slave regime.

On the other hand the Indian Community is undoubtedly influenced to a great extent by early marriages and caste prejudices. Widows cannot remarry and the different castes do not contract religious or civil unions among themselves. Moreover allowance must also be made for the widely differing moral stand-point of West and East.

73. The detailed statements under quinquennial age groups will be found in Tables III and IV of appendix I.

In the following summary the totals under each state are compared for each class and sex of the population.

74. From this table it will be seen that the number of persons—either males or females—in the general population living in concubinage is relatively small and less than 10% of the total General Population, whereas in the case of the Indian class it amounts to about 40%. Excluding from the total population those who are returned as living in a state of celibacy the proportion becomes 27% and 32% respectively.

In other words, of those couples living together as man and wife in the General Population about 72% have been through either a religious or civil ceremony and in the Indian Population 68%.

75. These returns, as stated in paragraph 72 above, cannot be interpreted as indicating a condition of immorality, although they should lead the most influential members of each community to exert their influence with a view to remedying a state of affairs which cannot do otherwise than reflect on the moral well-being of the off spring. The new legislation passed during the last decade gives facilities to all ministers of religion for fulfilling the formalities required by both the religious and civil authorities.

76. In the following table the civilly married persons in each class are shewn as a percentage of the total male and female population respectively and compared with the returns for 1911. A marked increase is shewn in the Indian population on the returns for 1911 and this must undoubtedly be ascribed to the greater facilities which the new Civil Status legislation referred to above afforded.

77. In addition to the above considerations there are some peculiar traditions prevailing which illustrate the working of a tendency to rebel against constraint in such matters. In questioning unmarried couples as to the reason why they do not contract regular union the answer has unvariably been in the creole patois on the part of the woman "lina plus pour content moi si nous pour marier," and in fact the cases of abandonment following regular marriage are too well known to demand enquiry to permit refutation. If the marriage tie is considered of so little moment as to give rise to the facile divorce laws among the nations where civilisation has been in progress for so many centuries, it should not be a cause for surprise that less annoying and more primitive methods prevail on the border-land between East and West—a position which characterises everything concerning the social and moral condition in Mauritius.

Occupation

78. The returns of occupations have been very fully dealt with in presenting the statistical summaries in Appendix I and II.

Tables of comparison between the 1911 and 1921 Censuses are given below.

79. In the general population the most notable variations which have occurred since the 1911 Census are a very marked increase in wood working and decrease in building operations. Job-Carpenters during recent years were earning as much as Rs. 4.50 or Rs. 5.—per day and this may account for an influx into this occupational class. On the other hand the classification "building &c", lost 2821 in 1921. It is true that building operations were at a standstill in 1922, but it is also evident, to anyone acquainted with local conditions, that these two industries overlap and it is an even chance that a creole workman would return himself as job carpenter or "charpentier de maison".

The professional services shew a decrease and the classes Transport, Commerce, and Public Administration—marked increases.

80. In the Indian Population changes of a more radical nature appear to have taken place. They may be found to be of a temporary nature due to the great prosperity of the Indian community on account of the sugar boom or they may in some instances prove to be permanent. The falling off of the "Agricultural" and increase of the "Transport and Communication" may be reversible, as also "Agricultural" and "undefined industries", but it is difficult to see how "Commerce and Finance" or "Public Administration" can revert to the more Manual work of Agriculture.

The liberation of the Indian land-owner from debt and the increased standard of living may quite reasonably be expected to divert the offspring of the Indians affected by it into the clerical and commercial occupations, and this appears to have occurred.

81 In considering the changes recorded in the more detailed occupational classifications, due allowance must be made for the difficulties of classification in a Colony like Mauritius. So many individual occupations overlap and a man who to day works as a carpenter may be come a cook, a house servant, a chauffeur or a mason if the occasion offers: it is to be regretted that some form of registration card cannot be adopted, even if a small tax were collected, to protect the genuine workers in the various industries as well as the employers of such labour.

CHAPTER III

CENSUS ADMINISTRATION

Introductory

82. The duty of taking the Census in Mauritius up to the year 1901 devolved on the Registrar General. In 1909 this department was combined with that of Poor Law Commissioner and in 1912 the Poor Law Commissioner's duties were transferred to the Protector of Immigrants while the department of Registration and Mortgage absorbed that of the Registrar General.

83. On account of these changes the Assistant Director of the Observatory was entrusted, in 1911, with the duty of taking the Census and in 1921 the Registrar General's duties were considered so heavy that he was unable to take the Census of that year, which was once more entrusted to the Census Commissioner of 1911, at that time Director of the Observatory, and who was also acting as Controller of Food, Trade and Commerce.

84. In January, 1922 the Food Control Department was abolished and the Census Commissioner was desired by the Government to act as Protector of Immigrants and Poor Law Commissioner.

85. In May, 1922 the Census Commissioner applied for three months sick leave which were spent in Reunion and on his return in September he was appointed Government delegate on the Immigration deputation to India, from which he did not return until April, 1923 when he was constrained to apply for long leave to be spent in Europe. These various administrative changes have caused inevitable delay in completing this final report. The dates of submitting the various preliminary reports on the Census will be found in paragraph 1 Chapter I.

86. The appointment of Census Commissioner was not made until 1920 November, about 5 months before the date proclaimed for the English Census. As all material had to be ordered from Europe and as, moreover, the date for the English Census fell within the hurricane season in Mauritius it was decided to alter the date of the Mauritius Census to May 21st, 1921.

87. A Secretary, Miss K. Rock, was appointed in December, 1920 with the proviso that she should undertake the duties of Superintendent of Compilation as soon as the active work of Census taking should be completed. She retired in May 1922.

88. The period for preparation was unusually short and the work of organising the preliminary details extremely arduous. The Colony was passing through a very difficult period; the cost of living was very high; the rates of wages had been increased by about 75% all over the Colony, and it was with great difficulty that suitable men could be obtained, at the salaries offered, for any of the preliminary work or for the final work of enumeration.

In the circumstances His Excellency the Governor permitted the Rangers of the Forest Department and some officers of the Police Department to assist and it is due entirely to these two departments and the excellent work performed by them in the least accessible localities of the island that the Census could be taken at all.

The Census Office

89. At each Census, accommodation for the staff, storing schedules and papers has to be improvised. In 1911 one of the rooms at the Mauritius Institute was used. In 1921 the preliminary work was once more carried on there, but the difficulty of securing a suitable compilation staff in Port Louis, as well as the demand made by the Institute for the room for storing specimens, made it necessary to shift the head office up country. The Military Authorities put on of the Married Quarters, No. 29, at the disposal of the Census Commissioner at a monthly rental of Rs. 29 and the Census schedules were all transferred there from Port Louis by motor lorry in August 1921. A few months later (in October), while the work of compilation was in full progress, the staff was required to shift once more, this time to the Volunteer head quarters, also in the Camp at Vacoas. In March 1922, before the work was entirely completed, a third transfer was required by the military authorities to one of the large barrack rooms. This latter proved a most efficient and suitable accommodation. These frequent changes while the work either of enumeration or compilation was in full swing taxed an already difficult organization to its utmost and delayed the work to no inconsiderable extent.

In December 1922 all the records were again shifted and stored at the Observatory where they still are, although the accommodation is very restricted.

The Staff and their Work

90. The Census organization of Mauritius is regulated by an ordinance passed through the Legislature in the year preceding the Census. It provides for a Census Commissioner, Superintendent, Enumerators and sub-enumerators.

91. The usual custom previous to 1921 was to divide the Island into about 13 Census districts—the boundaries of one or more Census districts being made to coincide with the political districts—and to appoint a superintendent in charge of each. This officer was entirely responsible for the preliminary and final enumeration and was required to forward the schedules properly annotated to the Census Commissioner.

Under each Superintendent were a certain number of enumerators whose duty consisted of taking a preliminary enumeration of houses, and directing the sub-enumeration work. In 1911, 285 sub-enumerators were appointed.

92. In 1921 the number of superintendents was reduced to 4 and the number of enumerators increased to 74. The work was centralised so that it came more directly under the supervision of the Commissioner and the money economised was spent in travelling, by motor car, on the part of the Superintendents and Commissioner.

93. By this means every village and hamlet was visited several times over by the Commissioner whose visits were duplicated for control by the Superintendents.

The Commissioner came more directly into contact with the population and the interest shewn in Census Enumeration all over the island was greatly increased.

94. There is no detailed record of the exact methods of control and compilation adopted in previous Censuses in Mauritius and so those indicated in the following paragraphs have been devised and employed in the 1911 and 1921 Censuses respectively.

They are placed on record in this report for the first time for the information of future Commissioners who will, it is hoped, by this means be spared the difficult task experienced in 1911.

Preliminary Enumeration

95. Owing to the staffing difficulties already referred to in paragraph 88 an equal distribution of Enumeration was impossible in 1921 as forest rangers could not very well be expected to deal with areas which were not coincident with their official beats.

96. In 1921 the preliminary work was recorded on the following form and it will be seen that the information is fairly exhaustive and contains a great deal of detail which cannot in the absence of a permanent Census bureau be made use of.

97. Each enumerator carried with him, in addition to these forms, a small book of record destined to be used by his sub-enumerators on the final Census date. He was also required in the 1921 Census to paint a number on every house, giving consecutive numbers in each area so that a completely numbered area could be handed over to his sub-enumerators.

98. A summarised return was also sent in every fifteen days by the enumerators shewing the number of houses, the number of separate householders and the number of schedules required for the final work.

99. During the preliminary enumeration an attempt was made to collect some additional information for the department of Agriculture. For several reasons the results were not satisfactory. In the first place the enquiry raised considerable suspicion, as the demand for the number of cattle, land planted &c., led to the conclusion in certain localities that the

Census enumeration would be used for purposes of taxation. It could not, in consequence, be insisted upon without jeopardising the success of the population Census itself. It is not advisable at any time to combine the two enquiries. Moreover the Census officers generally visit the households when the head of the family is at work and the wives and female dependents do not care to answer all the queries about animals which it was desired to secure.

100. The preliminary Census provided, for the immediate use of the Control office.
- (1) a list of all houses with their painted numbers
 - (2) a very close approximation to the total population in each area and for the whole Island.

101. On this basis the sub-enumeration areas were selected and the hamlets villages or blocks divided up or combined, as the case might be, to give, as far as possible about 100 houses to each sub-enumerator.

102. The final Census Schedules were all numbered in the press consecutively. They were tied up in the central office in bundles corresponding to the number of separate householders in each sub-area and a record of all schedules issued was kept for reference.

Final population enumeration

103. A few weeks before the final date for taking the Census each enumerator was requested to attend at the Central Office—at that time in Port Louis—with his sub-enumerators and they were given detailed explanations as to the method of procedure. They practised Census taking on each other under the direct supervision of the Commissioner, his Secretary and their own superintendents.

104. Each sub-enumerator was given a chart of his area with the position of the inhabited areas marked on it approximately as drawn up by the enumerator. The bundles of schedules with their corresponding note books were also handed to him and he was instructed to enter into these books the printed number of the schedule left at the house and on the schedule the name of the sub-area and the number painted on the house.

In this way a very complete control was effected and it will be noted that any serious errors could at once be detected by comparison with the totals in each sub-area derived from the preliminary Census.

105. The only outstanding errors which could occur are those due to double enumeration on account of people residing in one locality, and sleeping in another on the night of the Census. This was controlled on collecting the Census Schedules. Double enumeration due to counting a whole household twice is impossible.

106. In the towns enumeration was effected block by block, the enumerators keeping the houses on their right hand and working round the block in a clockwise direction.

107. On the Sugar Estates the whole Census was made by the accountants. In 1911 the house enumeration was performed by the Enumerator, but owing to a late organization and the other difficulties of staffing already referred to, this could not be done in 1921. This control was, in consequence, missing; but the work was very carefully performed by the accountants or their assistants and there is no reason to suppose that the accuracy of the returns was in any way influenced by the absence of this preliminary control.

108. Each enumerator was required to check over the schedule numbers and house numbers and note-book of his sub-enumerator, and send in as soon as possible the total population in males, females and children for each sub-area.

109. On receiving the batches of schedules at the Central Office from the Enumerator the Census Commissioner compared the bundles with the charts and saw that the numbers corresponded before giving an acquittance for work done.

The Schedules were then carefully scrutinised and again compared with the note-books by a special staff, any evident double enumeration being struck out and the totals controlled. These totals were then collected and a preliminary report made on the results thus obtained.

Compilation Description of card System

110. The work of compilation consists of
- (1) Careful examination of every schedule
 - (2) Special annotations required before transcribing to the cards
 - (3) Transcribing of information to cards
 - (4) Checking of cards
 - (5) Counting of cards

111. The 1911 Census was the first in which the compilation of the returns was effected on the card system in Mauritius. As no literature on the subject could be obtained in the Colony and as there was no time to obtain it from Europe it became necessary to devise the whole scheme.

112. In the hurried organization which ensued it is possible that methods were adopted which might have been improved upon if the experience gained in other centres had been available, but so far as the Mauritius compilation work is concerned the system proved very efficient and permitted the work of compilation to be carried on, not only with great rapidity and ease, but with a feeling of security in the results which the schedule method adopted on previous occasions could never inspire.

113. The underlying principle of all card indexing is to record on one easily manipulated register all the information referring to a particular person, object or transaction. It then becomes possible to bring together by simple sorting all the records referring to the person, object or transaction which possess the same qualities. The variations which can be introduced into various card indexing systems are such as will facilitate the work of sorting; permit easy reference; or meet the requirements of record either temporary or permanent. At the present day permanent records are generally transcribed on to loose folio sheets appropriately pierced for binding in loose folio registers. This method has reached a very high degree of perfection and can be made as permanent as the old form of bound register. Small cards are generally adopted for temporary record and often bear a large amount of information the results of which, after suitable grouping are entered on to permanent record sheets and the cards destroyed. This latter is the system employed in all Census organizations. The information collected concerning each individual generally falls under 8 main headings.

Place of residence	Occupation
Age	Birthplace
Civil condition	Infirmities
Family	Religion.

Each of which can be subdivided into a large number of sub-headings the total number of separate classifications reaching considerably over 100. The rapidity with which the cards can be written up and the various classifications enumerated will depend entirely on the ingenuity and experience of the officer in charge. If a wrong order is adopted in selecting the headings under which the various counts are made the work of compilation may be trebled or quadrupled. Another essential condition for efficient census compilation is that a complete plan should be thought out before commencing the work, and the cooperation between compilers thoroughly organised as it is sometimes very difficult to reestablish uniformity in the work when once disorder has arisen.

114. It is very important that the columns of entry on the cards should be in the same order as those on the schedule. If rapid transcribing from the schedule to the card is to be attained the work must become mechanical. There must be no hesitation as to where the entry has to be made and the amount of mental effort must be reduced to a minimum.

The work must become almost sub-conscious: the officer who thinks about every entry will perhaps write 10 cards correctly but he will inevitably break down in writing 10,000.

115. A specimen schedule is attached and the card of the Mauritius Census is shown below:—

Clerks, tradesmen and artisans should mention in what particular branch of business they are employed. Referring to laborers and servants, mention the peculiar calling of each to those who are employed in cultivation, add AGR.—Referring to children above 4 years old and under 16 years old, state whether they attend or have attended a Government, Aided or private School or received tuition at home, or none.

If more than one occupation is followed, state that by which living is mainly earned. If out of work at the time of the Census, the usual occupation must be stated. If retired or pensioned, state the fact and add occupation.

For persons deriving their income from private source and allowances, and not following or having followed a profession or occupation, state "private means."

COLUMN G.—Add N to New Immigrants; and O to Old.

COLUMN H.—Referring to Indians, state whether they were born in the Presidency of Calcutta, Madras, or Bombay; and whether they are Immigrants or not.—To Immigrants add I M. Also distinguish the Country of birth and state whether the persons mentioned is a British subject, or a naturalized British subject, or a Foreign Subject.

COLUMN I. English, French, German, or whatever the nationality may be.

COLUMN J.—If from birth, add Bth.

COLUMN K.—If Christian, the denomination; if not Christian whether Jew, Hindoo, Mahometan, Buddhist Parsee, Sikh, or whatever the religion may be.

COLUMN L.—This column will be filled up by the Enumerator, except as stated in § 1 above.

116. The squares at the top of the card refer to the District, section, enumeration area and house of the person. The blank space at the right of the second line was left in the event of its being found necessary to compute ratio of children living to those born etc. The blank spaces on the left of the occupation line receive the classification numbers of the occupation, while the designation itself is entered in the blank space immediately after. The letters *D.M.E.* refer to Day workers, Monthly workers, and workers under contract of engagement. *Empl.* signifies an employer of labour-work a person working for another party. *Own Acc.* a person working for himself, but not employing other labour directly. On the last line *R.C.* signifies Roman Catholic, *Eng. Scot. Prot.* members of the English, Scotch, or other Protestant denominations respectively. *Hind Maho* Hindoo and Mahomedan respectively. Other headings are self explanatory.

117. While submitting the Householders schedules to a critical examination in the Central Office the following work was performed on them. Husband and wife were bracketed, the difference between the ages taken, the occupation code numbers inserted, the indications made by the enumerator and superintendent verified, an indication of the class of population (G. for general, I for Indian, I.M. for Indian Immigrant and C. for Chinese) inserted and any other notes likely to be of assistance to the card writers were entered. The schedules were then bound up in books of enumeration areas and the total number of persons male and female carefully checked and written on the cover.

118. The cards had been printed in two colours, red for males and yellow for females. They were also notched in three places at the top as indicated on the specimen card a certain number were left without notches. The notch on the left indicated the General Population i.e. persons born in the Colony but not of Indian parentage. The middle notch indicated Indians born in the Colony, the right hand notch Indian Immigrants and the plain cards Chinese.

119. The card writer placed, in consequence, 8 batches of cards in front of him, 4 red and 4 yellow, and after a very short experience it became a mechanical operation to pick up the right card as the reader called out G male or I female etc. Subsequently it was found that each writer preferred to read out the information alone and the reader was dispensed with.

120. It will be seen from the card that very little writing was required: a figure, a mark or a letter being all that was necessary to record the information on the card. After a few hours experience it was found that an average of four cards a minute could be written, 240 cards an hour. As there were 380,000 cards to write the compilation occupied two persons a little over 1,500 hours or 300 days working 5 hours a day.

121. As was stated in paragraph XV of the 1911 Report, 36 card writers were employed and the work of card writing was completed in about 20 days.

122. The entries were checked by interchanging the cards between compilers. The first M.S.S. of the 1911 Census was sent to press $3\frac{1}{2}$ months after the beginning of card writing and 6 months after enumeration: in 1921 the work of compilation was entirely completed by the end of March, 1922.

123. As already stated the order in which the counts under the various heads of information are made is extremely important.

The main divisions under each enumeration area were:

These divisions were made very rapidly and accurately by means of the colours and notches. Any errors could be detected by simple inspection and they were made to refer to each sub-area.

124. Now if the geographical divisions of the country have been properly determined the enumeration areas should be sufficiently large to provide a reliable sampling of the population for age distribution, but not so large as would lead to the overlapping of important natural divisions of class, climate or occupation, as it is important, in dealing with mortality rates, to keep all three factors separate. It is, however, better to err on the side of excessive sub-division, because combinations can always be easily effected whereas sub division after sorting is troublesome and involves much waste of time and labour unless machine methods (Hollinith) are employed.

125. If a permanent Census Office exists too much emphasis cannot be laid on the necessity of recording detailed information on record sheets for areas as small as can conveniently be adopted, having due regard of course to the nature of the information extracted. It is impossible to ascertain what political or administrative changes may have occurred during the intercensal period and hence what special grouping may be necessary at each Census. If the records of large divisions only are kept no comparative returns are possible and one of the chief objectives of Census Enumeration—the record of progress—is entirely missed. Whereas if a record is maintained in small areas, even if the boundaries of such areas do not coincide exactly with the new boundaries, the errors resulting from their arbitrary sub-division are not serious.

126. All the counts which have been made so far deal with mutually exclusive data (i.e. a man is either married or not married etc.) and counting presents no special difficulty. When however we come to such attributes as infirmities which are not mutually exclusive, a person may be suffering from one, two or all of them and a lot of double counting will result if a proper system is not adopted.

127. Referring to the card it will be seen that in the Mauritius Census infirmities dealt with:—

Deaf *Blind* *Dumb* *Insane*

The card writer makes a mark through the positive attribute: thus a man may be Deaf and Blind so that if we call the positive attributes, A, B, C, D, and the negative $\alpha, \beta, \gamma, \delta$, this man's attributes would be A, B, γ, δ , or deaf and blind would be crossed out.

128. Now the simplest way of dealing with this problem is to count all the cards of similar marking and arrange them in the order shown below.

It is evident that each letter of the class symbol may indicate either that the attribute is present or is not present and may conveniently be written A or α . *i.e.* Either of these may be combined with any of the other class symbols. By a well known law of algebraic combination the total groups into which the cards will be sorted will be 2^n where n is the number of attributes recorded. In the present case there are eight attributes and $2^n = 16$ hence we have 16 groups to count. The number of times A occurs alone will be the sum of all the groups in which A occurs: the number of times it occurs combined with B will be the sum of all the groups in which A, B, occurs etc.,

Then the number of Deaf people (A) will be the sum of groups 1 to 8 (211) of deaf and Blind (A, B—) the sum of 1,2,3, and 5 (31) etc.

129. The combination of the information recorded on the record sheets for each enumeration area into combinations of areas or districts can best be effected by folding the sheets and bringing all the columns with similar headings into juxtaposition. Any simple clamp will suffice to hold them in position while the necessary additions are being made. It is often an advantage to enter the males and females in different coloured inks or one above the line and the other below so that cross additions can be made without skipping thus:

the final total on the sheet is much more readily obtained and the sheets only require folding 4 times instead of 8.

130. The cards in each sub-area under 8 main headings (§123) were then counted and entered on to Form 1 crossing out the headings 6 &c., which do not refer to these counts (the forms will be referred to in a subsequent paragraph).

This constitutes the first count.

The notches and colours serve sufficiently to separate the eight groups which were then collected under enumeration area.

131. Each of the eight groups for each section was then classified into birthplaces and counted, and entered on Form 1 crossing out headings (a and c). This constitutes the second count and the totals should agree.

132. Each of the eight groups for each section were then classified to 6 age groups as follows:

(1) below 10	(4) below 20 to 49
(2) 10 to 14	(5) 50 to 59
(3) 15 to 19	(6) 60 and over

This gave 48 bundles. The cards were then separated out in infirmities—a direct count of infirmities only made and then age groups (2) 10 to 14 & (3) 15 to 19 combined, separated into occupations and the third full count made.

The totals were then once more compared.

133. The cards were then collected in their 8 primary bundles to form districts and towns and classified.

- (1) in religions
- (2) the religions into Civil condition
- (3) each civil condition into individual ages

The fourth count is then made and entered on to form 2.

The totals should now all agree.

The cards are left in districts under class, sex and age and are stored in this way as any special information required to be taken out later can only refer to ages.

134. After very careful examination and from experience gained in the 1911 Census the Compilation forms were reduced to two thus saving a considerable expenditure in printing. Form 1 has three headings any two of which can be effaced. Form 2 is used for the final count of ages and for all subsequent summaries. These summaries are made by recopying or folding down and will of course depend on what the Commissioner desires to bring out.

House Compilation

135. The house compilation is a troublesome one. In the first place it is frequently difficult to say what is a main house and what is an out-house. A house in Port Louis is dismantled and taken to the healthy parts of the Island. The dependencies, formerly out-houses, become main houses and give shelter to a dozen or more families.

Again many of the dwellings are impossible to describe as they are mere shanties built of all sorts of material.

136. The classifications and sub-classifications are endless and the schedules in the 1921 Census have been stored, the only counts made being mainhouses with their sub divisions—stores churches—chapels— and outhouses inhabited or uninhabited.

137. Until some semblance of registration and numbering of dwellings has been adopted by the sanitary and municipal authorities and the building authorities or sanitary authorities remove the nondescript erections which go by the name of houses in some of the outlying districts, it will be very difficult for enumerators to classify, or Census Commissioners to issue instructions for classifying, the buildings satisfactorily.

138. It is sometimes considered that the organization for the taking of a Census of 400,000 people or so is far less arduous than that required for a very large population. This is evidently a fallacy: as soon as the numbers exceed a certain limit, de-centralisation of certain portions of the area treated becomes inevitable. In these new centres responsible officers must be appointed and the organization is merely a replica of the central organization, but does not throw any greater burden of work or responsibility on the head officer. In Mauritius the difficulties are perhaps greater than in many other centres as there is naturally a dearth of suitable officers who are prepared to work for the small salaries offered. The Census Commissioner has, in consequence, to exercise a greater amount of direct personal supervision over minor details than he should be expected to do.

139. In the 1921 Census in only two areas—Curepipe and Beau Bassin and Rose Hill—was it possible to obtain really trained assistance and in both cases it was willingly given as a personal service and was unpaid. At Curepipe, Mr. Marc Baissac controlled the distribution and collection of the final schedules, and at Beau Bassin—Rose Hill Mr. Gabriel Pitot superintended the whole Census. These two gentlemen had rendered signal service in the 1911 Census and, in the difficulties caused by the post-War Economic condition in Mauritius, their assistance in 1921 cannot be over-estimated.

140. Another factor on which the successful organization of the Census work at such short notice in great measure depended was the direct personal assistance and sympathy of the Honourable E. B. Denham, C.M.G., the Colonial Secretary—who had acted as Director of Census in Ceylon in former years. His ready appreciation of each difficulty as it arose, his advice and official influence in addition to the visits made in the field and to the Central Office during enumeration and compilation brought confidence and assistance to the whole staff.

141. A special effort was made to interest the population in the work of enumeration by appealing to them through the various religious communities; with the approval of the Bishops, notices were read out in all the churches on the Sunday preceding the final enumeration and it is worthy of note that no cases of non-enumeration were reported after the Census, whereas in former years this was not infrequent.

142. The numbering of the houses throughout the Island undoubtedly reduced the possibility of misses to a minimum and the Indian population in villages and outlying districts reported any omission long before the final enumeration began.

CHAPTER IV

Errors in Age Distribution and graduation of the frequency curve

143. In table IV of Appendix I the age distribution is given for each district. The importance of these detailed tables of ages in questions concerning death-rates and general questions of hygiene is very great.

144. Although the analysis of death-rates and the consideration of general statistical work does not form part of the Census Enumeration, it was hoped that a permanent Census Office would be established where such work could be dealt with, and the vast amount of information contained in the Census Schedules brought more intimately into the administrative work of the Colony. An effort was made to secure more detailed information on vital statistics than is usually given in the Registrar General's report, but my request for an additional vote of Rs. 500 for clerical assistance in the work of copying was disallowed. The completion of the graduated table to which reference is made in subsequent paragraphs had, in consequence, to be abandoned. Application to the Registrar General's office also proved unsuccessful as his limited staff did not, apparently, permit the tabulation of deaths in each year of age under class and sex.

145. As an example of the intrinsic value of these age tables graphs are appended shewing [1] the percentage of the Indo Mauritian class living at each quinquennial group 0-4, 5-9, &c., for the districts of Port Louis, Black River, and Plaines Wilhems—the Districts of the Colony which shew the greatest difference in climatic and social conditions.

146. It will be seen that at the two ends of the curve where high mortality occurs—children and aged persons—Port Louis is considerably below Plaines Wilhems, whereas from 20 to 54 the curve runs much above. Strictly speaking the Port Louis death-rate should be lower than that of Plaines Wilhems on this account but it has generally been much higher.

147. The same applies' in an even more marked degree, to the district of Black River, where the children below 14 are greatly deficient in number and where, in consequence, the death-rate, if made comparable with that of Plaines Wilhems, would be more unfavourable than it is at present.

148. A very superficial acquaintance with the varying climatic conditions obtaining in the different parts of the Island also shews how important it is, in this matter of statistics and death-rates, to discriminate between the various districts and portions of districts in the Colony. In many other important questions, especially in that of irrigation, the same difficulty was encountered, for nearly a century committees and commissions in number studied the question of irrigation, but it was not until the Island was divided into its natural river systems and the varying rainfall conditions of each considered separately, that any effective work could be done.

149. When it is remembered, as was stated by an early French traveller :—" Qu'il se trouve autant, ou plus de différence entre certains quartiers de cette île reserrée dans une circonference de 30 et quelques lieues qu'entre deux provinces de France les plus distantes l'une de l'autre " and when moreover one extreme dips into intense tropical conditions with an eastern population while the other resembles that of an English spring climate with, for the most part, a wealthy European population the necessity for a reasoned analysis of statistical returns becomes evident, and administrative methods which may meet with success in one part of the Island might be fraught with serious danger if applied in another.

150. At the present time the district divisions as used for statistical purposes combine, irrespective of ages, the deaths from the most unhealthy litoral areas with those of the higher portions of the Island, or where an attempt is made to divide them up it is not always an easy matter to correlate the population with the deaths returned. Even where the district rates alone are concerned an examination of these age curves shews very clearly that some allowance must be made for the varying constitution of the population.

151. This is the first time that individual ages, district by district, have been published, and this has been done with special reference to their comparative use at the next Census when, it may be hoped, the full effect of the active measures at present being taken to reduce the death-rate will be *Permanently* felt.

152. Examining the frequency curves in greater detail it will be noticed that the first quinquennial group 0—4 shews a lower average of persons per age than the second although, naturally, the first age (below 1) is the highest figure in the frequency table.

153. At first sight this low average appears to be anomalous and indeed it is unusual ; but on referring to the Registrar General's reports for the decade we find that in the 5 years (1916 to 1920), immediately preceding the Census Enumeration, there were 5060 births recorded *less* than in the 5 years 1911 to 1915, the actual figures being as follows :—

154. If the total population at each age is compared with the corresponding year before the Census date i. e. age 10 years with 1911, age 9 years with 1912 &c., it will be found that, with the exception of age 5 which included errors due to the tendency to state ages to the nearest 5 and 10 referred to in paragraph 32 above—the variations follow each other very closely, as will be seen from the graph 2.

155. These considerations shew that any graduation of the age frequencies must be made with caution : although the complete analysis is not possible for the reasons given in paragraph 144 above, it has been considered of interest to point out the lines along which research work on the death rates might be performed with profit, and some well known formulæ are reproduced from standard works, in case the Registrar General's department decide to deal with the problem as part of their routine work.

156. The original information should be collected and tabulated in the manner described in paragraph 7 of Studies in Mauritian statistics No. III part I where a specimen card is shown.

157. In the first place it is evident that graduation formulae cannot be applied to any frequency distribution unless there is *a priori* evidence that the frequencies increase or decrease by regular differences. In the case of an age distribution it will be seen from the diagram (2) shewing the relation between births and the population at each year of age, (0 to 10) that the difference between successive ages does not proceed by regular decrements and hence any attempt to apply any of the well-known graduation formulae of the frequencies of population at each year of age will give misleading results. They will only partially eliminate errors on the 5's and 10's and introduce errors into practically every other age.

158. The variations in the total number of births each year, even in the comparatively stable population of Mauritius, are very marked and these variations run through the frequency curve like waves, the variation affecting each year of age successively in exactly the same way as an immigrant population affects it.

159. The force of mortality, however, at each age does not present the same inconveniences. It is shewn in most works on the theory of human mortality that two main factors are at work, one due to chance and operative at any age with equal intensity if the sampling of the population is large enough, the other due to the gradual diminution with age of the resistivity of the human body to disease, in its broadest sense, leading to final dissolution.

160. This latter may be closely represented by a series in geometrical progression in which case it represents the force of mortality at age x it may be written in the form.

$$\mu_x = A + Bc^x$$

where A, B, and C are constants which have to be determined from a table giving the mortality rate.

161. The method which suggests itself in the case of the Mauritius statistics is

- 1.—Obtain from the Registrar General's return the deaths at each year of age for the Census year—(d_x) in the ordinary notation where x indicates the age to which the mortality refers.
- 2.—divide these by the number of persons living at each age—(l_x) as Enumerated at the Census.
- 3.—graduate the results by any means which the officer dealing with the problem has at his command *i.e.* (1) by hand smoothing (2) the application of the above formula in its usual actuarial form of

$$\mu_x = -\log_e S - (\log_e g \log_e c) c^x$$
 —a formula derived from (1) by the ordinary methods of the calculus— or (3) the application of one or other of the well known Pearsonian types of frequency distribution. The mortality curve is generally treated as two independent curves from 0 to 10 and 10 to old age.
- 4.—When a graduated mortality curve has been secured, by whatever means the officer can employ, the reverse process, using the actual deaths at each age, will give the number living at each age, at the time of the Census, corrected for errors of enumeration, assuming that the age at death is more accurately given than the Census age. Thus in the first instance

$$\mu_x = \frac{d_x}{l_x} \quad \begin{array}{l} d_x \text{ being taken from the Registrar General's returns and } l_x \text{ from} \\ \text{the (erroneous) Census returns.} \end{array}$$

in the second instance

$$l_x = \frac{d_x}{\mu_x} \quad \begin{array}{l} \text{where } d_x \text{ is taken from the Registrar General's returns } \mu_x \\ \text{from the graduated mortality rate and } l_x \text{ now is the computed} \\ \text{number of persons living at each age.} \end{array}$$

162. It is quite possible that for most practical purposes the ages in groups as published by the Registrar General in each annual report will suffice and as an example of the method indicated above these returns are compared with the Census returns for the year 1921 in the following paragraphs. That this is not sufficient for *all* practical applications of these mortality rates is evident as the tails *i.e.* the beginning and end of a frequency distribution are most important and, moreover, the intervals throughout the curve are not regular. A mathematical graduation of the mortality rate has not, in consequence, been made and will not be until the detailed statistics are procurable. The values given below are derived from the hand smoothed curve and, in consequence, are subject to error on this account as well as for the reasons stated above. The method here outlined is merely put forward as a suggestion; the whole problem of the age graduation in Mauritius lends itself to a great deal of interesting investigation.

163. That this is important to clear up this question of corrected deaths in Mauritius is evident to anyone acquainted with the statistical methods of to-day. Several enquiries have been made recently for a general life table and it would be a valuable guide for Insurance Companies intending to open business in the Colony.

164. From these figures, and the diagram 3, it will be seen that the curve of mortality in age groups is very regular and demands little or no graduation; the method of grouping naturally eliminates the errors on the 5's and 10's—but it also eliminates what are real fluctuations in the ages as has already been seen from the comparison of the total births with successive ages from age 0 to age 9 given in paragraphs 152—154.

165. It is evident, in consequence, that until the deaths at each age are available no efficient work can be performed on the age distribution. Further, if comparison of death-rates are to be made with other countries it may be necessary to refer the computed rates to the standard population adopted for such countries. The following standard population may be found sufficient to eliminate any serious error which could arise from the variations due to the influence of immigration on the age distribution.

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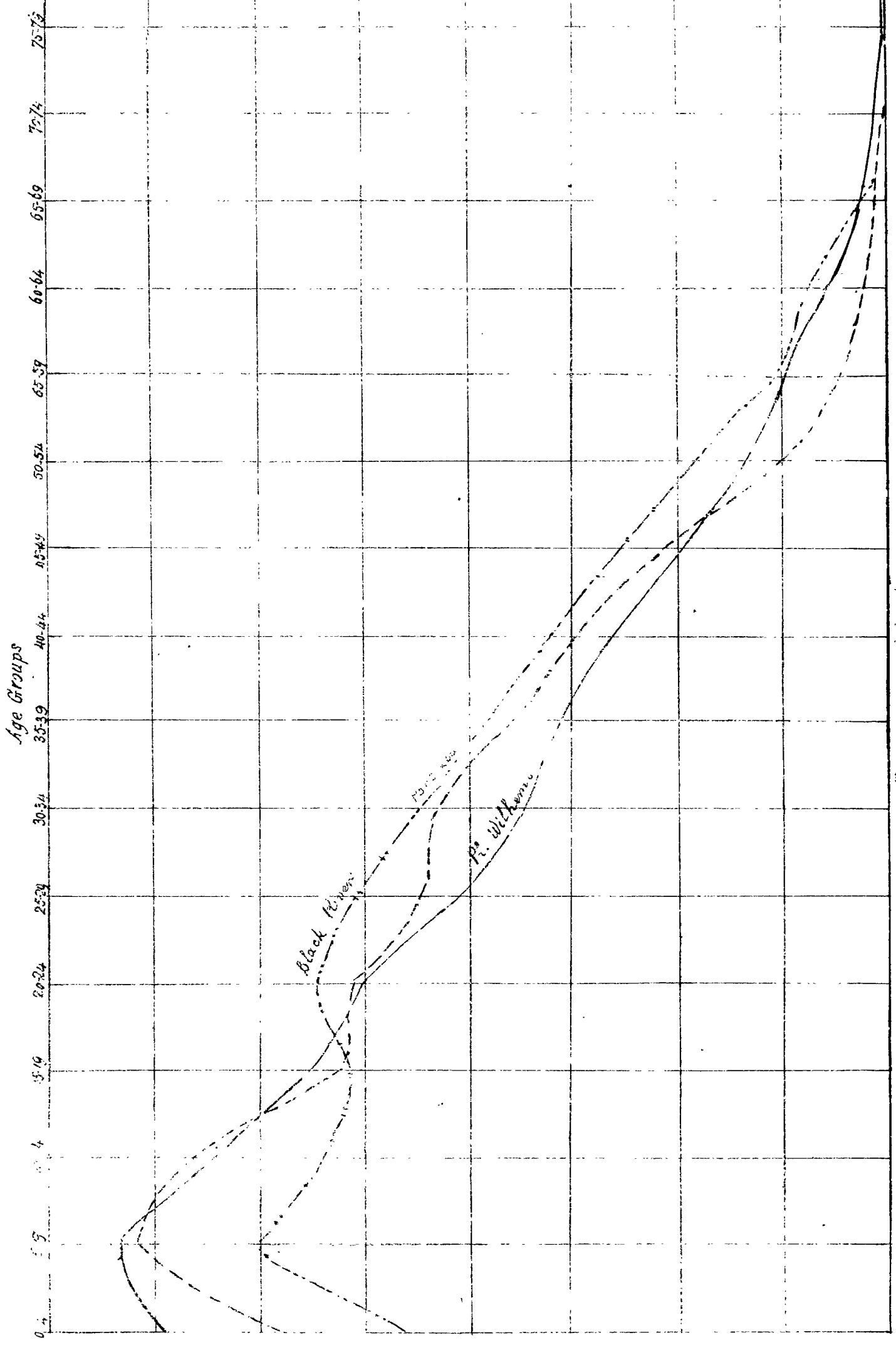
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Graph showing the percentage at each quinquennial group of the total population (Indo-Mauritian) in three Districts.
