

Introduction

Date of Census. 1. In accordance with Ordinance No. 5 of 1930, His Excellency the Governor appointed April the 26th, 1931, for taking the Population Census in Mauritius and its Dependencies.

Appointment of Census Commissioner. 2. The Census Commissioner was appointed on May 28, 1930, and, by January 8, 1931, the Superintendents and Enumerators had been selected and their appointments sanctioned by Government.

Census Office. 3. By kind permission of the Honourable the Inspector General of Police, a large room in the Line Barracks, Port Louis, was utilized as Census Office and proved very commodious and well placed for that purpose.

Organization of the work. 4. Each District of the Island was divided into a number of blocks, the same as those adopted by the House Tax Branch of the Receiver General's Department. One Superintendent was appointed for Port Louis, one for Pamplemousses and Rivière du Rempart, one for Moka and Flacq, one for Plaines Wilhems and Black River, one for Grand Port and Savanne, and one for Rodrigues.

One or several blocks were assigned to each Enumerator according to the size of the Blocks.

Reasons of adopting the House Tax Division. 5. By making the Census Blocks coincident with the House Tax Blocks, it was considered that a very efficient check could thereby be applied to the preliminary work of the Enumerators, on the assumption that the Census Enumerators could find more houses than the House Tax Officers, but not less. Consequently, when the preliminary enumeration in any block had been completed, the number of houses visited by the Enumerator was compared with the number listed at the House Tax Office and any discrepancy brought to the notice of the Enumerator, for explanation or revision. The preliminary enumeration was completed early in March.

Occurrence of a cyclone. 6. The preparation for the final census had thus been unusually thorough; but all the arrangements were thrown into confusion by the occurrence on March 5 to 7 of one of the severest cyclones recorded in Mauritius. A very large number of huts were completely destroyed and many substantial dwellings damaged. The census identification numbers on houses, in many cases disappeared.

Larger staff of Sub-enumerators necessary. 7. As a result, it was considered safer to employ a larger staff of sub-enumerators than was originally contemplated, as the men would have had in many cases, to deal with areas in which the distribution of dwellings had markedly changed. The expense incurred was thereby increased.

Census taking. 8. On the day of Census, each enumerator acted as a guide to and a check upon, his sub-enumerators, guarding, as far as possible, against overlapping of the various sub areas. The superintendents scoured their respective districts keeping in touch with their enumerators, while the Census Commissioner visited all the districts to keep in touch with the superintendents.

On many Estates, managers kindly consented to allow some of their employees to act as sub-enumerators thereby greatly facilitating the work of census taking on these estates

No special difficulties were encountered beyond those anticipated, viz : for the superintendents to direct a large staff of more or less inexperienced sub-enumerators and for the sub-enumerators to obtain, in the least possible time, the desired information from an almost entirely illiterate population.

Preliminary Compilation. 9. During the week which followed the Census, the Schedules were all brought to the Central Office. They were there classified, obvious double enumerations were eliminated and the schedules were compared with the books of preliminary enumeration for any obvious omissions. The first count was made on the schedules, the work being facilitated by the printed numbers to the lines on the form.

Final Compilation. 10. The information on the Schedules was next transferred to index cards ; some cases of double enumeration which had escaped the first scrutiny were again eliminated and the final count made. The cards were then sorted according to the different heads of tabulation, all the totals agreeing amongst themselves and with the final count.

Dates. 11. The Preliminary Compilation was completed at the end of May, 1931 ; card writing, which occupied 17 compilers and 5 check-compilers was completed at the end of August. The last classifications were completed at the end of November and the last tabulations, at the end of December.

Acknowledgments. 12. The Census work, upon the whole, went off smoothly thanks to the zeal of the Superintendents and Enumerators.

The gentlemen who acted as Superintendents were : Mr. G. D. Deslongrais for Port Louis, Mr. H. Mayer for Plaines Wilhems and Black River, Mr. A. d'Unienville for Moka and Flacq, Mr. L. Marot for Grand Port and Savanne, Mr. L. Thenet for Pamplemousses and Rivière du Rempart and Mr. R. Jauffret for Rodrigues. Mr. G. Lailvaux acted as Office Superintendent and, after the Census, as superintendent of compilation.

Special mention should be made of Mr. Deslongrais who was, for the third time, acting as Census Superintendent in Port Louis, and whose practical experience of Census taking proved most helpful.

My best thanks are also due to Mr. G. Lailvaux, the Superintendent of Compilation for his ability, energy and untiring devotion to duty, during the whole of the compilation period.

I.—Total population of Mauritius and Dependencies and comparison with previous figures

The total population of Mauritius, irrespective of the Military, was found to be 393,238 or an increase of 16,753 on the 1921 figures. Of this increase 6,501 were males and 10,252 females.

The population of Rodrigues was returned as 8,202 or an increase of 1,618 on the 1921 figures.

The population in the other dependencies of Mauritius was returned as 1,457 or a decrease of 353 on the 1921 figures.

The total population of Mauritius and Dependencies was thus 402,897 or an increase of 17,812 on the 1921 figures.

The density of population, in each District of Mauritius and in the Dependencies, is compared, in the following table, with the corresponding figures for 1921.

III.—Constitution of the Population

In the following table, the percentage constitution of the Population is compared with that given by previous Censuses. As will be seen, the proportion of General Population has remained practically stationary for the past 40 years, while the rate of increase in the proportion of Indo Mauritians is being checked by the decrease in the proportion of immigration from India.

The Chinese population is increasing steadily since 1911, especially on the female side.

CENSUS OF MAURITIUS AND ITS DEPENDENCIES

In relation to sex distribution, the increase in the proportion of females, in the General population which has been in evidence since 1846, has continued during the past ten years. As regards the Indian Population, the same feature is observed, but more accentuated while, for the Chinese, the increase in the female element is very considerable : this section of the community cannot, however, yet be considered as a permanently settled division of the Population.

In the 1921 Census Report, Mr. A. Walter, the then Census Commissioner, remarked that the classification of the Population under the previously accepted headings, viz :—General, Indo Mauritian, Other Indians and Chinese, was becoming a matter of some difficulty. He suggested new headings, viz :—European, Mauritian, Indian and Chinese ; the term European applying only to those persons born in Europe, of European parents, or born in Mauritius, of European parents ; the term Mauritian applying to those persons, of whatever origin, who have become permanently settled in Mauritius and who are following European customs and religions. The Indian section would then have comprised those members of the population following the customs and religions of India.

On the occasion of the present Census, an attempt was made at following this classification, collaterally to the previously adopted one. The results are given in the following table.

As will be seen therefrom, the proportion of true Europeans is negligibly small as compared with the General Population. On the other hand, the "Other Indian" class is becoming relatively unimportant and could well be blended with the "Indo Mauritian" into one "Indian" class.

At present, the "General Population" are continually recruiting members from the "Indo Mauritian" while the latter are gradually absorbing the "Other Indians." The principal factor operating in the first case is probably religion : a member of the Indian Community embracing Christianity becomes virtually separated from his Clan and it seems probable that his offsprings become permanently separated and are absorbed in the General Population.

IV—Ages of the Population

The following table gives the ages, in each year of age, of the different classes of the Population, at the time of Census. The same tendency to errors in 5's and 10's, noticed in previous reports, is observed ; the reason is obviously due to the illiterate stating their ages in round numbers. Some of the great ages given at the end of the table are open to considerable doubt.

It would appear from these tables that approximate equality in the sexes obtains at birth for all classes of the population and that the force of mortality is the same for both sexes until about the fifteenth year.

After this limit, a pronounced difference is observed between the General Population and the Indo-Mauritian. As regards the former, the force of mortality appears to increase in the male sex and, at great ages, the number of women is nearly double the number of men.

As regards the Indo-Mauritian, equality of the sexes is more or less preserved until about the thirtieth year, after which the number of males markedly exceed the number of females. Equality of the sexes is again approximately realized after the sixtieth year.

The age distribution, in quinquennial groups, for each class of population and in each District is given in Appendix II.

V.—Civil Condition of the Population ✓

In the next tables is given the Civil Condition, under different age groups, of the different sections of the Population.

The following remarks can be made on the above tabulations. In the General Population, 24% are married civilly, less than 1% are married religiously, and 6% are living in concubinage.

In the Indo-Mauritian Population, 17% are married civilly, 6% religiously and 12% are living in concubinage. In the "Other Indians" and "Chinese" sections, the figures are not comparable with the above, on account of the great disparity in numbers between males and females in both.

CENSUS OF MAURITIUS AND ITS DEPENDENCIES

In the following tables, are classified under different heads of Population, the birth places of the inhabitants. The number of persons of the General Population born in Europe was 391 as compared with 423 in 1921.

As regard Nationalities those under the head French comprise natives of Réunion and Madagascar who have returned themselves as French citizens together with a few Mauritians of French descent, who have preserved their French nationality.

VII.—Occupations of the Population

In the following tables the occupations of the Population, as returned at the 1931 census, are compared with corresponding figures for 1921. The tables are of special interest in that they refer to two periods very different from the economic point of view: 1921 was a year of exceptional prosperity for the Colony while 1931 is a year of considerable economic depression.

In the General population, in spite of the absolute increase in total numbers, there is a pronounced decrease in the Commercial, Agricultural and Industrial classes. The Professional and Domestic classes evince a marked increase, while the class "without specific occupation" is also considerably in excess of the 1921 figure.

In the Indian Population, the number of males engaged in Agriculture is somewhat lower than in 1921 while the number of female agricultural labourers is greatly in excess of the 1921 figure.

In the Commercial and Industrial classes a pronounced decrease on 1921 is in evidence while the Domestic Class evinces a considerable excess and the Professional a slight one. The class without specific occupation is greatly in excess for the males and markedly in defect for the females, on the 1921 figures.

In the Chinese Population there is nothing noteworthy, except a pronounced increase in those returned as without specific occupation.

These tables should also be consulted in connection with age periods, especially as regards the class returned as without specific occupation. The classifications, in selected age periods, for each class of population and for each District are given in Appendix 3.

In the next table, are given the conditions of employment for male agricultural workers, as returned by the Census Compilation. Some remarks should be made on this table. Firstly, as the Census was taken on a Sunday, during the inter-crop season, a number of field and factory employees, especially of the General Population, were censussed in localities which were not their localities of work. Thus the distribution in Districts, especially as regards the General Population, may be misleading.

Secondly, as regards salary a measure of uncertainty attaches to the second columns: information under this head was not explicitly asked for on the Census schedule but was deduced, in compiling, from the nature of the work indicated on the Schedule. As a result, it is possible that a certain number of labourers paid by the month may have been classified as paid by day and hence, especially as regards the Indian population, that the first column may be too low, and the second too high.

In the first of the above tables, school attendance in the different classes of population is compared.

In the General Population, the proportion attending school, of boys under 9 years, is 28% and the proportion of girls 26%; between 10 and 19, the proportion, for boys, is 30% and for girls, 22%.

In the Indian population, corresponding figures are:—0-9, boys: 18%; girls: 8%; 10-19, boys: 15%, girls: 4%.

In the General Population, 40% of the males returned themselves as able to read and write and 36% of the females; in the Indian Population, 5% of the males and 1% of the females.

In the General Population 17% of the males returned themselves as capable of speaking English, and 9% of the females.

In the Indian Population, 4% of the males and 1% of the females.

For the total population, the proportions capable of speaking English are:—for the males, 7% and for the females, 3.5%.

X. Houses of the Inhabitants

In the house enumeration, every building was considered separately whether main house or dependency or whether used for industrial purposes or for human habitation.

As regards classification, the following heads were adopted:—(a) thatched huts, (b) wood or stone walls, thatched; (c) wood, stone or sheet iron walls, covered with sheet iron; (d) wood, stone or sheet iron walls, covered with shingles or tiles.

In respect of size, the following were the heads of classification:—(a) with 1 to 3 rooms; (b) with 4 to 8 rooms and (c) with more than 8 rooms.

As regards density of habitation the classification was as follows.—(a) with 5 inhabitants or less (b) with 6 to 10; (c) 11 to 20; (d) 21 to 30; and (e) 31 and above.

It should be stated that these classifications refer to conditions existing before the cyclone: but it is not improbable that most of the damaged dwellings have been reconstructed on very much the same model as before.
