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The situation of Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius

1. Introduction

The island of Rodrigues is a constituent island of the Republic of Mauritius with an economy mostly based on agriculture, handicraft and fishing. Many of its residents have migrated to the relatively more developed island of Mauritius with the aim of enjoying a better quality of life. However, it is often argued that their situation, once in the main island, is far from what they had anticipated.

This report presents the situation of Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius based on data from the 2011 Housing and Population Census. It aims to shed light as to whether they are better off in the island of Mauritius and to what extent they are at par with Mauritians.

For the purpose of this analysis,

- A Rodriguan is a person who is born in the island of Rodrigues; and
- A Mauritian is a person who is born in the island of Mauritius.

2. Highlights

- (i) There were around 13,700 Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius at Census 2011;
- (ii) They live all over the island of Mauritius with highest numbers in the town of Port Louis;
- (iii) They are more concentrated in the working ages 25-59 years suggesting that the main reason for their migration to the island of Mauritius is to get jobs;
- (iv) Compared to Rodriguans living in Rodrigues, their situation is 'mixed'. On one hand, they have better access to amenities, and are more likely to have household durables and ICT devices. On the other hand, they hold lower occupations and work longer hours than their counterparts in Rodrigues;
- (v) Compared to Mauritians, their conditions are less favourable with regard to housing and living conditions, education and work.

3. Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius

Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius ...

....represent one third of the total resident population of the island of Rodrigues, and

At 2011 Population Census, around 13,700 Rodriguans (6,300 men and 7,400 women) lived in the island of Mauritius, representing only 1.1% of the total resident population in the island of Mauritius but 34% of the total resident population of the island of Rodrigues.

... are spread in the island of Mauritius with highest numbers in the town of Port Louis

They reside all over the island of Mauritius with highest numbers in the town of Port Louis (22%), followed by Beau Bassin/Rose Hill (9%) and Baie du Tombeau VCA (8%).

4. Situation of Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius v/s those living in Rodrigues

Compared to Rodriguans living in Rodrigues, those living in the island of Mauritius...

... are made up of a higher proportion of women


Women made up 54% of the total Rodriguan population living in Mauritius as compared to 51% of the population of Rodrigues indicating that they tend to migrate more than men. A possible reason is that they come to Mauritius for employment. The activity rate among female Rodriguans (53%) living in the island of Mauritius is higher than that of female Rodriguans living in the island of Rodrigues (49%).

... are more concentrated among the working ages

Above two thirds of Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius fall in the working age-group 25-59 years as compared to only 44% among those living in Rodrigues, indicating that Rodriguans tend to come to the island of Mauritius for work.

By contrast, people aged below 25 years represent a much lower proportion in the island of Mauritius (22%) than in Rodrigues (45%) suggesting that Rodriguans are less likely to come to the main island of Mauritius for education than for work.


Figure 1 – Distribution (%) of Rodriguans living in the islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues by age group, Census 2011



... are less qualified

Compared to their counterparts in Rodrigues, Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius are less likely to attain upper secondary and tertiary level education.


Figure 2 – Distribution (%) of Rodriguans aged 16 years and over living in the islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues by educational attainment, Census 2011



...but more likely to be working...

Rodriguans aged 16 to 59 years, particularly the young ones below the age of 25 years, living in the island of Mauritius are more economically active than those living in the island of Rodrigues, again suggesting that employment is what drives Rodriguans to migrate to the island of Mauritius (Figure 3).

Compared to Rodriguans living in Rodrigues, those living in the island of Mauritius had a higher employment rate (proportion of employed among the economically active population aged 16 years and over) of 94% against 88%.

... and be in paid employment rather than being self-employed, ...

In the island of Mauritius, 83% of working Rodriguans were in paid employment and merely 16% were self-employed whereas in the island of Rodrigues, the corresponding proportions were 59% and 38% respectively.


Figure 4 – Distribution (%) of employed Rodriguans aged 16 years and over living in the islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues by employment status, Census 2011



... and work in the construction and manufacturing sectors, ...

Rodriguans in the island of Mauritius are more likely to work in the secondary sector (48%), comprising mainly construction and manufacturing, than their counterparts living in the island of Rodrigues (17%). They are less likely to work in the primary sector (8%) which comprises mainly agricultural and fishing activities.

**Primary sector – Agriculture, fishing, mining & quarrying*


**Secondary sector – Electricity, water, manufacturing & construction*

... and engaged in low occupations, ...

In both islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues, Rodriguans are more concentrated in low-grade occupations such as skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers; craft and related trade workers; plant and machine operators and assemblers; and elementary occupations. However, the proportion engaged in these low occupations was higher among those living in the island of Mauritius (72%) than in Rodrigues (62%).


Figure 6 – Distribution (%) of employed Rodriguans aged 16 years and over living in the islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues by major occupational group, Census 2011



...and work longer hours

On average, Rodriguans living in Mauritius worked around 43 hours per week against 35 hours for those living in the island of Rodrigues. The difference is more among women (40 against 30 hours) than among men (45 against 38 hours).


Figure 7 – Average number of hours worked by Rodriguans aged 16 years and over living in the islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues by sex, Census 2011



... and on the whole, they enjoy better housing and living conditions

Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius are more likely to have access to amenities such as electricity and piped water but less likely to own their house.


Figure 8 – Proportion of Rodriguan households* in the islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues by housing and living conditions, Census 2011

They are also better off with regard to availability of household durables, in particular washing machines possibly since more of them work and have less time for household chores.

5. Situation of Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius v/s those of Mauritians living in the island of Mauritius


In the analysis that follows, Mauritians are defined as people born in the island of Mauritius to differentiate between Rodriguans who are defined as people born in the island of Rodrigues.

Among people living in the island of Mauritius, those born in Rodrigues ...

... are less educated

Among people living in the island of Mauritius, only 25% of those born in Rodrigues reached upper secondary level or higher whereas the corresponding proportion is nearly 50% among Mauritians.


Figure 10 – Distribution (%) of persons aged 16 years and over living in the island of Mauritius by educational attainment, Census 2011



... but more likely to be on the job market

Rodriguans in the island of Mauritius are more likely to be on the job market than Mauritians – their economic activity rates are higher than those of Mauritians at all age-groups (Figure 11).

Figure 11 – Economic activity rate (%) of persons aged 16 years and over living in the island of Mauritius by age group, Census 2011




Young Rodriguans are more likely to hold a job than young Mauritians

Rodriguans are as likely as Mauritians to hold a job; the employment rate (for the population aged 16 years and above) among Rodriguans worked out to 94% against 93% for Mauritians.


Figure 12 – Employment rate (%) of persons aged 16 years and over living in the island of Mauritius by age group, Census 2011

However, young Rodriguans aged 16 – 24 years are more likely to work than Mauritians of the same age (Figure 12).

Rodriguans are more likely to be engaged in low occupations

Over 70% of the people born in Rodrigues were engaged in the low occupations namely, skilled agricultural; forestry and fishery workers; craft and related trade workers; plant and machine operators and assemblers; and elementary occupations as compared to around 49% among Mauritians.


Figure 13 –Distribution (%) of employed persons aged 16 years and over living in the island of Mauritius by major occupational group, Census 2011



... and to work slightly longer hours

On average, they worked around 43 hours per week, one hour more than Mauritians (42 hrs). Rodriguan men worked two hours more than Mauritian men whereas the women put in the same number of hours of work.

Figure 14 – Average number of hours worked by persons aged 16 years and over living in the island of Mauritius by sex, Census 2011




Their housing and living conditions are less favourable

Based on the Relative Development Index (RDI)^{1/} compiled by Statistics Mauritius, nearly half of the Rodriguans lived in regions of the island of Mauritius that are considered to be of low development^{2/} such as Morcellement Ilois (in Baie de Tombeau VCA), Cité Briquetterie, Cité La Cure and Carreau Calyptus/ Roche Bois (in Town of Port Louis), Eau Bonne (in Bambous VCA), etc.. By contrast, less than one third of Mauritians live in these “low developed” regions.

Also Rodriguans living in the island of Mauritius are less likely to own a house and to live in fully concrete houses. In terms of access to electricity, having a flush toilet and a kitchen inside housing unit, their situation is slightly less favourable than Mauritians.

Figure 15 – Proportion of households in the island of Mauritius by housing and living conditions, Census 2011




They are less likely to possess household durables and ICT devices

A lower proportion of them had household appliances such as refrigerators and washing machines, as well as ICT devices except for mobile phones.

6. Concepts & definitions

- (a) Household A household is either:
- (i) a one-person household, i.e., a person who makes provision for his own food or other essentials for living without combining with any other person to form part of a multi-person household; or
 - (ii) a multi-person household, i.e., a group of two or more persons living together who make common provision for food or other essentials for living. The persons in the group may pool their incomes and have a common budget to a greater or lesser extent; they may be related or unrelated persons or a combination of both.
- (b) Resident population The resident population is a count of all usual residents of a country at the time of the census. For census purposes, “usual residence” is defined as the place at which the person lives at the time of the census, and has been there continuously for the past 12 months or intends to live there continuously for at least 12 months.
- (c) Employment Employed population consists of Mauritians aged 16 years and above (16+) who have worked for pay, profit or family gain for at least one hour during the reference week which was from Monday 27 June to Sunday 3 July 2011 at the 2011 Population Census. It includes those who are temporarily absent from work for reasons such as leave with pay, leave without pay and temporary disorganisation of work (bad weather, break down of equipment, lack of order, etc.).
- (d) Unemployment Unemployed population comprises all Mauritians aged 16+ who are not working but who are looking for work and are available for work during the reference week.
- (e) Active population Active population is made up of employed and unemployed population.
- (f) Activity rate (%) Activity rate is the ratio (%) of the active population (or labour force) to the population aged 16+ (active and inactive population).
- (g) Relative Development Index (RDI) RDI is a composite index that measures the relative achievement of sub-regions of the country in various dimensions of development. The RDI ranges between 0 and 1, where index values near 0 indicate the least developed areas and index values near 1 indicate the most developed areas.
