## 5. EDUCATION

## Women are more literate than men

Between 2000 and 2011, the literacy rate of the population aged 12 years and above improved from $68.1 \%$ to $78.8 \%$. Women reported a higher literacy rate than men both at the 2000 and 2011 Census. Over time however, men are bridging the gap.

## More people with qualifications

The proportion of people aged 16 years and over who have attained School Certificate (SC) or higher increased from $10.2 \%$ in 2000 to $21.4 \%$ in 2011.

## Both men and women more qualified

There has been a significant increase in the proportion of both men and women aged 16 years and over who hold a qualification at SC level or higher

- from $10.5 \%$ in 2000 to $22.2 \%$ in 2011 among men; and
- from $8.8 \%$ in 2000 to $20.6 \%$ in 2011 among women.


## ...but tertiary level education is still rare

Only $1.4 \%$ of the population aged 16 years and over reported having a qualification at the tertiary level in 2011. The proportion was $1.8 \%$ among men and $1.2 \%$ among women.

The educational level of Rodriguans is improving but not yet at the level reached by residents of the island of Mauritius
