A. Criteria for Institutional Sector Classification

Statistics Mauritius (SM) is officially mandated to compile Government Finance Statistics (GFS) for Mauritius. As part of this mandate, SM compilers update the classification of public entities annually. This structured process strictly adheres to the IMF's **Government Finance Statistics Manual (GFSM) 2014** guidelines.

Updating the list of public entities is a structured process which involves identification, classification and validation of all public sector units. This annual review ensures that national accounts and GFS accurately reflect the evolving scope of public activity. Crucially, the process establishes clear boundaries between the public and private sectors, providing a robust framework to support policy analysis, public finance, and national debt management.

The basic statistical unit utilized for GFS compilation is the **institutional unit**, defined as an entity capable in its own right of owning assets, incurring liabilities, engaging in economic activities, and maintaining a complete set of financial statements. The list covers all resident institutional units whose centre of predominant economic interest is within Mauritius. Information is gathered from a wide range of sources, including budget documents, company records, annual financial statements, regulatory agency lists, and media reports, to build a comprehensive list of entities that may be under public control or influence.

A rigorous two-step classification procedure is applied to determine the status of these units:

1. **Government Control:** To determine if an entity is part of the public sector, it is assessed against the criteria of government control of corporations outlined in *Box 2.2 of GFSM 2014*. An entity is classified as public if it is directly or indirectly controlled by the government or other public sector units. Control is established through effective influence on the core aspects of management. It can take the form of the government or public sector entities holding a majority of voting shares in the entity being analyzed or exercising control over the board of directors through the power to appoint members or key personnel in the entity. While GFSM 2014 outlines eight "indicators of control", a single indicator is sufficient to establish government control.

2. **Sectorization:** Once identified as a public entity, the unit is sectorized into either the **General Government sector** or as a **Public Corporation**, using the decision tree for sector classification of public entities in *Figure 2.4 of GFSM 2014*. As part of this step, a market versus non-market test is applied to examine the entity's primary source of financing. Specifically, SM compilers verify whether the entity earns its income mainly from sales (market producer) or relies primarily on public funding (non-market producer). Under the 50% criterion rule, a corporation is designated as a market producer if it covers at least 50% of its operating costs through sales over a sustained period of at least three consecutive years. Units classified as non-market producers are placed under the General Government sector, while market producers providing goods and services at economically significant prices are classified as Public Corporations.

B. Structure of the List

Based on the application of the two-step procedure outlined above, the public institutions of Mauritius are organized into two main sectors within this document. The **General Government Sector (Non-Market Producers)** comprises Category 1 (Extra Budgetary Units), Category 2 (Social Security Schemes), Category 3 (Regional Government), and Category 4 (Local Government). The **Public Corporations Sector (Market Producers)** comprises Category 5 (Non-Financial Public Corporations) and Category 6 (Financial Public Corporations). Sub-items listed with bullet points or indented under a parent company represent controlled subsidiaries compiled within that institutional cluster. The detailed classification of these institutional units is presented below:
