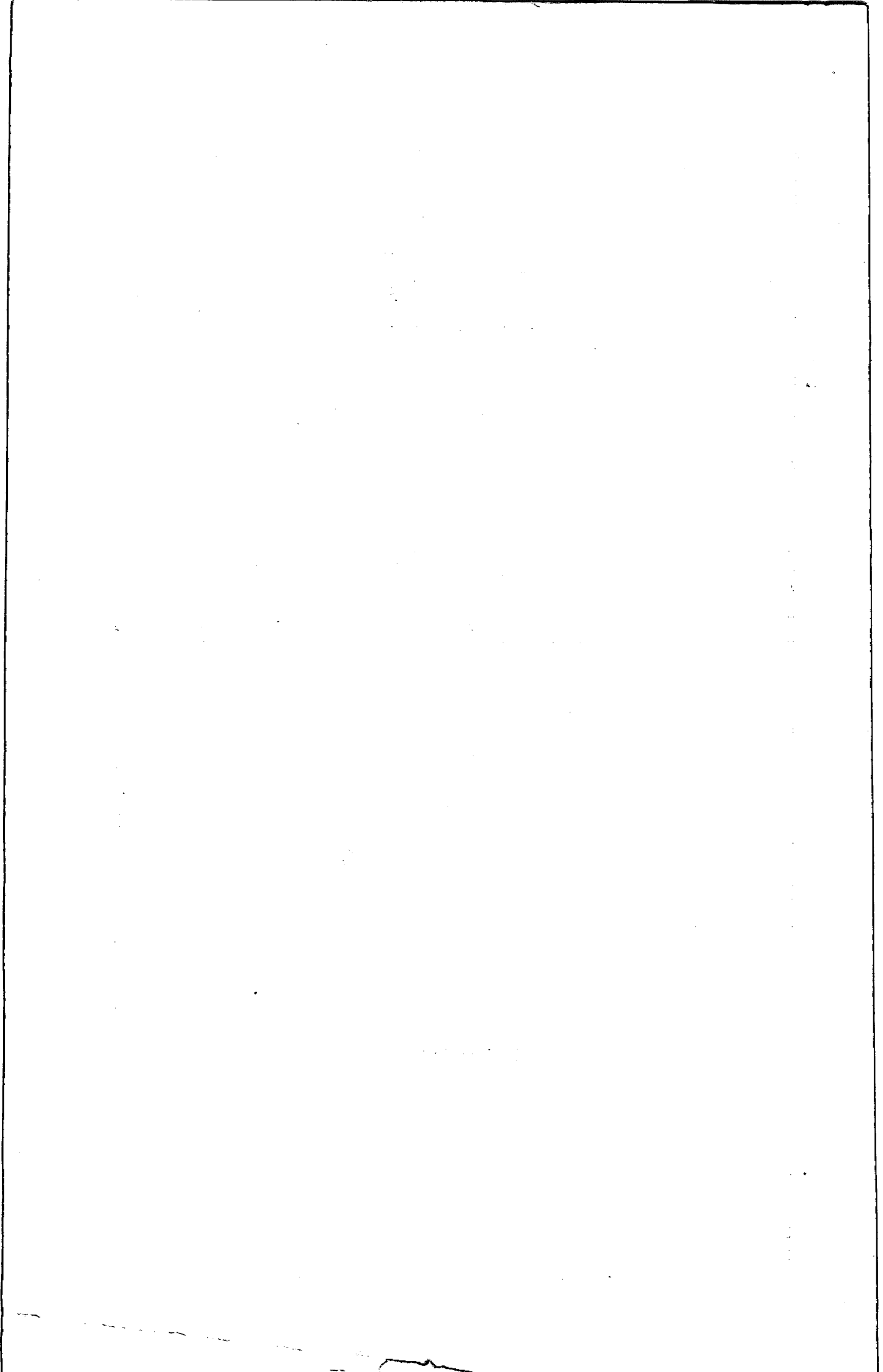

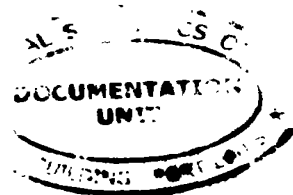

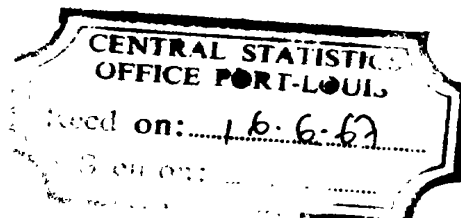
FOREWORD



Since 1946 the Central Statistical Office has prepared regularly a Yearbook of Statistics containing a vast amount of information about Mauritius. The last volume relating to 1959 was published at the end of 1960.

In 1961 the Central Statistical Office started publishing in the place of the Yearbook a Quarterly Digest which, more promptly, made available to the users of statistics information of general interest. This publication was discontinued after June 1966, when it was considered that a Bi-annual digest containing much more information than the quarterly one would be more useful.

This is the first issue of the new digest and the Central Statistical Office will welcome suggestions and comments on the content and presentation of this publication.

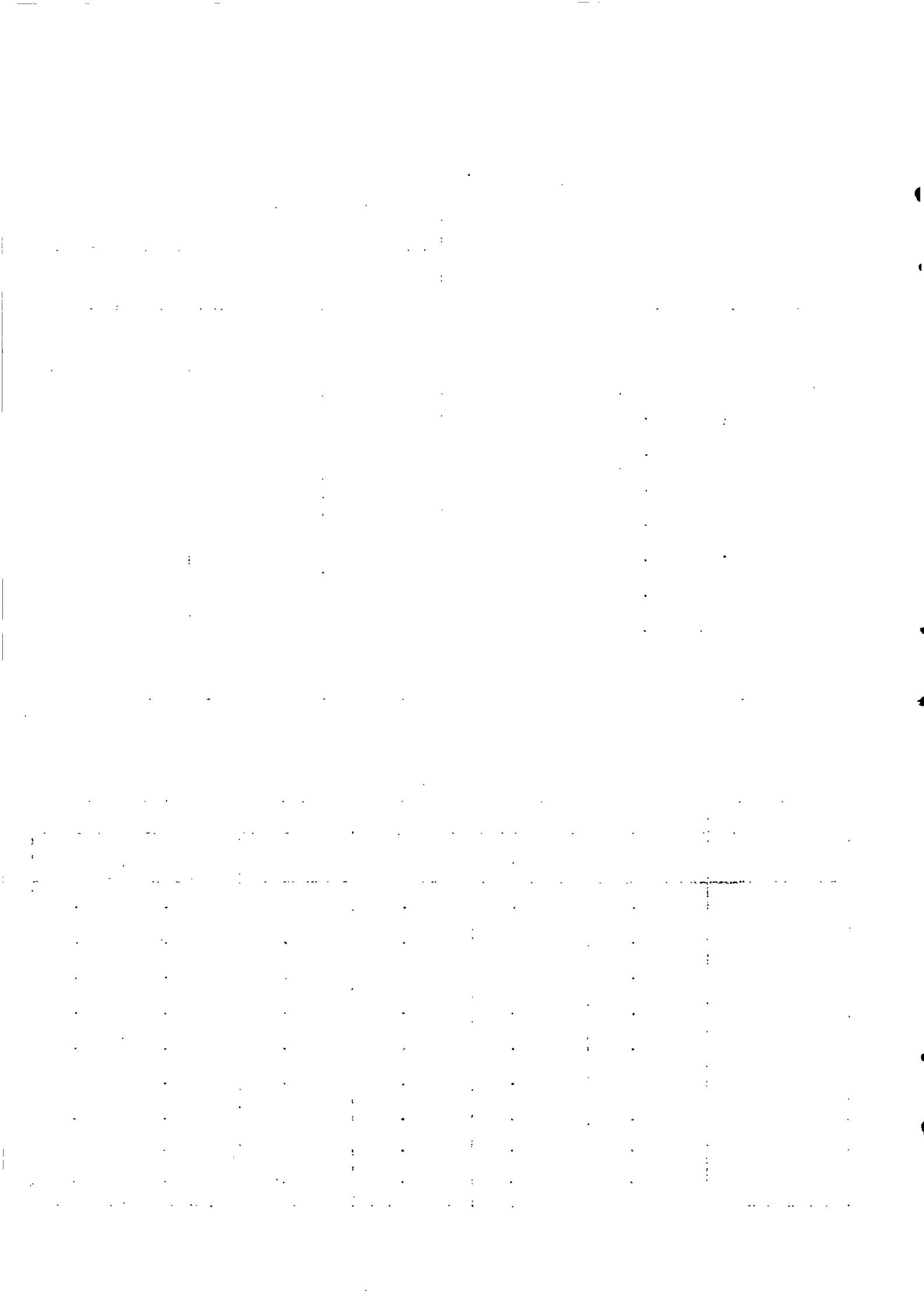

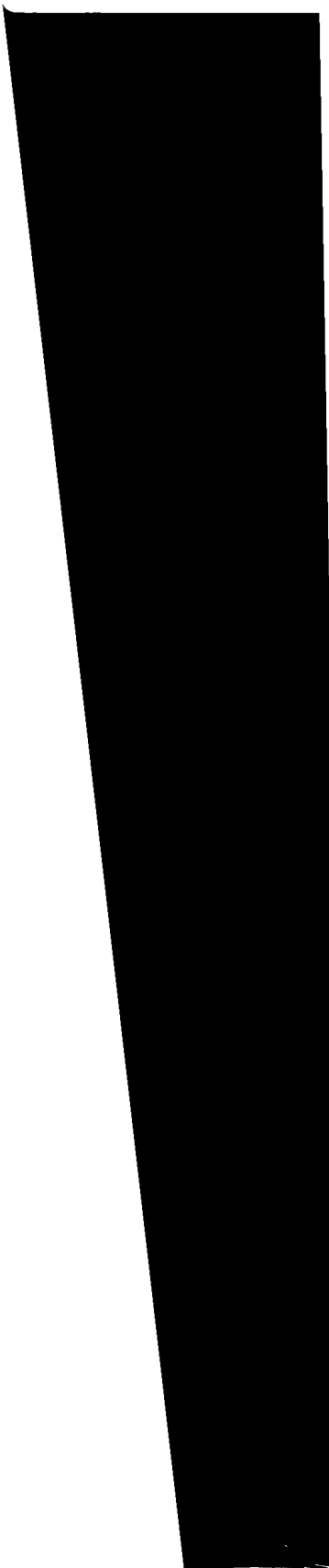
