Grateful acknowledgement is expressed here to all these departments for their continued cooperation.

It is hoped that data given in this report proves useful to the public in general and to all those in the field of external trade.

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EXTERNAL TRADE

SECOND QUARTER AND FIRST SEMESTER 1990

1. Total value of trade and balance of visible trade:-

During the second quarter of 1990, exports totalled Rs 4,300 million and imports Rs 5,600 million bringing the total value of trade to Rs 9,900 million as against Rs 8,300 million in the previous quarter. The first semester therefore saw its total trade reaching over Rs 18,000 million, some 10% higher than the corresponding figure of last year.

The country's trade balance for the second quarter remained at the same level as the previous quarter, registering a deficit of Rs 1,300 million. The deficit for the first six months of 1990 therefore amounted to Rs 2,600 million compared to Rs 2,200 million in the corresponding period a year ago.

2. Terms of trade (1988 = 100)

The terms of trade for the 2nd quarter moved in favour of the country to reach 107 from 99 in the previous quarter.

The quarterly export unit value indices given in table 2 show that prices of exported goods during the second quarter of 1990 were 8% higher than in the previous quarter. The average price increase for the period January-June 1990 relative to the corresponding semester of 1989 was 14% - the price increase in respect of sugar is estimated at 19% and that for EPZ products at 11%.

Prices of imported goods during the second quarter of 1990 compared to the previous quarter on the other hand have remained unchanged. But the price movement for the first semester compared to the corresponding period a year ago was up by 3%. It is recalled that prices of imported goods registered an increase of nearly 20% last year.

3. Exports

Total exports for the second quarter amounted to Rs 4,300 million showing a nominal increase of 24% over the previous quarter but in volume terms, the growth works out to around 15%.

Total export earnings for the first semester of 1990 reached Rs 7,800 million compared with Rs 7,200 million for the corresponding period a year ago indicating a value increase of 8%. EPZ exports increased by 22% to Rs 5,350 million whilst sugar proceeds decreased by 19%. Only 187,000 m.tons were exported against 286,000 m.tons in the corresponding period of 1989. In volume terms, exports for period January-June 1990 were 5% lower than the corresponding semester of 1989.

As usual most of our exports were directed to the EEC which accounted for nearly 80% of the total. The US market absorbed another 14% worth of goods exported in the first semester.

4. Imports

Imports in the second quarter was 17% higher than in the previous quarter and amounted to Rs 5,600 million. As prices in the second quarter remained at the previous quarter's level, the 17% increase is totally accounted for by growth in volume.

Imports for the first half of 1990 reached Rs 10,400 million compared to Rs 9,400 million in the corresponding period of 1989 recording a 10% increase explained by an increase of 7% in volume and 3% in price.

The comparative table below lists products which have recorded major changes in their imports between January-June 1989 and January-June 1990.

Over 35% of our imports came from the EEC with France itself supplying 17% worth of goods. Other major suppliers were South Africa and Japan accounting for 9% and 7% respectively.

5. The EPZ sector

5.1 EPZ exports increased by 67% during the second quarter to reach Rs 3,350 million from barely Rs 2,000 million in the first quarter. The EPZ enterprises therefore exported some Rs 5,350 million worth of goods in the first semester compared to Rs 4,400 million in the corresponding period of 1989 showing a 22% nominal increase explained by an increase of 10% in volume and 11% in price.

Most of our EPZ products were again directed towards the EEC which accounted for over 75% of the total. The US shared another 17%.

5.2 During the second quarter, EPZ imports maintained the previous quarter's level at around Rs 1,900 million bringing the import bill for the first semester to slightly over Rs 3,800 million of which raw materials accounted for Rs 3,500 million and machinery for Rs 320 million.

Over 40% worth of EPZ inputs were supplied by the EEC.

5.3 Net EPZ exports consequently shot up to Rs 1,400 million in the second quarter representing more than a tenfold increase relative to the previous quarter.

Net exports for the first half of 1990 therefore totalled Rs 1,550 million which compares with Rs 900 million for the corresponding period of 1989. The ratio of net exports to total exports consequently increased to 28% from 20% a year ago.

6. Forecasts - Year 1990

On the basis of price and volume data available for the first half of 1990 and taking into consideration the possible changes in the price of petroleum products, a forecast of imports and exports has been worked out for the year 1990.

Exports is most likely to attain Rs 17,500 million with sugar amounting to Rs 5,000 million and EPZ proceeds to Rs 11,000 million. Imports on the other hand will be around Rs 23,500 million inclusive of aircraft and marine vessels.

Consequently, a trade deficit of around Rs 6,000 million is expected for the current year 1990.
