

Export Processing Zone - 1st Quarter 1985

1. Introduction

This issue presents the preliminary results of the Quarterly Survey of Employment in the EPZ sector carried out by this office. It also contains provisional figures relating to EPZ exports and imports during the first quarter of 1985.

2. Employment

As at end of March 1985, there were 215 enterprises operating in the Export Processing Zone and employment stood at 42,772 of which 33,816 were females and 9,756 males.

During the first quarter of this year, 18 new enterprises have started operation. A total of 5,818 new jobs were created, of which 5,046 through the expansion of existing enterprises and 772 through the setting up of new ones. However, as there were 619 jobs lost through the contraction of existing companies, the net change in employment between March 1985 and December 1984 was 5,199. Of these, 3,396 were female workers and 1,803, male workers. The wearing apparel product group which constitutes mainly of the manufacture of knitted pullovers and other ready made garments has been the main employment creation sector. Almost all the additional jobs (99%) were created in this sector.

The EPZ sector is making a significant contribution towards the expansion of employment opportunities in the country. Compared with March 1983, employment in this sector has risen by 19,429 (14,037 of which are female workers and 5,392 male workers) which represents an increase of more than 60% over the last two years.

During the last 12 months, 13,818 additional workers were recruited. Based on the records of the Ministry of Industry relating to the issue of Export Enterprise Certificates, it is estimated that the work force of the EPZ sector will probably reach 50,000 by the end of this year.

### 3. Exports and Imports

#### 3.1 Exports

During the first quarter of this year, Rs 507.6 million worth of goods have been exported by the EPZ enterprises. The main products exported were articles of wearing apparel and clothing which amounted to Rs 369.5 million, representing 73% of the total EPZ exports.

Data on exports by quarter show that EPZ exports usually follow a markedly increasing trend throughout the year. The first quarter of the year registers the lowest export figure and the peak is reached during the last quarter.

Assuming that a similar trend is followed during 1985, it is estimated that, during the next quarters, exports will, by far, exceed Rs 507.6 million and total EPZ exports for the year 1985 could well be around Rs 3,000 million.

#### 3.2 Imports

Imports during the first quarter of 1985 amounted to Rs 507 million, the highest EPZ import bill registered so far for a single quarter.

Of the Rs 507 million, Rs 330 million were paid for imports of raw materials required by the 'textile' and 'wearing apparel' industries. An amount of Rs 60.2 million was paid in respect of imports of machinery and equipment.

#### 3.3 Net Exports

The net exports for the first quarter 1985 have therefore been only around Rs 0.6 million, an almost negligible amount. As shown in table 10, on page 11, net exports during the first quarter of the year are usually low and it is expected that with the increase in exports during the coming months, the net exports may improve considerably.
