

The Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises,

1st Quarter 1996

Introduction

This issue of the "Economic Indicators" presents the results of the "Quarterly Survey of Employment" carried out at the end of March 1996. Figures are given separately for the Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises. The latter are "small and medium" enterprises engaged, mainly, in new technology as well as support and service industries. The report also includes provisional figures of EPZ imports and exports for the 1st quarter 1996 as well as revised figures for previous years.

I. The Export Processing Zone (EPZ)

(i) Number of enterprises

The number of EPZ enterprises at the end of the 1st quarter of 1996 stood at 480, one less than in the previous quarter.

During the 1st quarter 9 enterprises closed down and 8 new enterprises started operation. The "Wearing apparel" sector remained with 242 enterprises after 4 closures and the coming into operation of 4 new enterprises. The number of enterprises by product group is given in Table 1.5.

(ii) Employment evolution, 1st quarter 1996

Employment in the EPZ rose by 582 during the 1st quarter of 1996 to reach 81,048. The number of male employees increased by 588 from 23,906 to 24,494 whilst no significant change was noted among female employees who numbered 56,554 at the end of the quarter. Between December 1995 and March 1996, moderate increases were noted in "Wearing apparel" (+552) and in "Electric and electronic products" (+126). On the other hand, there was a decrease of 149 in the "Food sector". Details of net change in employment are shown in Table 1.6.

During the 1st quarter of 1996, a total of 4,573 jobs were created of which 578 by 8 new enterprises. On the other hand, 3,991 jobs were lost, 696 of which following the closure of 9 enterprises (Table 1.4).

Foreign workers, who numbered 6,097 at the beginning of the quarter, decreased by 52 to reach 6,045 at the end of March 1996 (1,829 males and 4,216 females). This decrease was the net result of a drop of 100 in the number of female workers and an increase of 48 among male workers.

(iii) Employment evolution, March 1995 - March 1996

During the one-year period ending March 1996, there was a net decrease of 10 in the number of enterprises and 2,112 in the workforce (of whom 911 among outworkers).

In the "Wearing apparel" sector employment went down by 2,307 from 69,117 to 66,810. Decreases were also registered in the following sectors: "Food" (-201), "Wood and paper products" (-66), "Leather products and footwear" (-41) and "Electric and electronic products" (-18). The other sectors witnessed increases ranging between 18 and 142 and totalled 521. Details of the changes by product group are given in Table 1.6.

(iv) Exports and Imports

EPZ Exports, for the 1st quarter of 1996, reached Rs 4,210 million and represent an absolute increase of over Rs 700 million when compared to the corresponding quarter of 1995 (Table 1.11). In nominal terms, the increase works out to 20% and is explained by a 12% increase in volume and 8% in price. Exports to France alone increased by Rs 301 million (Rs 1,231 million against Rs 930 million).

Imports, during the 1st quarter 1996, reached Rs 2,671 million compared to Rs 2,482 million for the same quarter of 1995. Raw materials amounted to Rs 2,393 million whilst imports of machinery and equipment represent an increase of 46% compared to the 1st quarter 1995 (Rs 278 million against Rs 190 million)

Net exports, i.e exports minus imports, totalled Rs 1,539 million and the ratio to exports works out to 37% for the 1st quarter 1996 (Table 1.8).

On the basis of available figures for the 1st quarter of 1996 and taking into consideration past trends for the remaining three quarters, total exports for the year 1996 are expected at Rs 20,500 million.

II. The Pioneer Status Enterprises (PSE)

(i) Number of enterprises

Eight new enterprises started operation during the 1st quarter of 1996, bringing the total to 112 at the end of the quarter (Table 2.1). Among these enterprises 38 are considered as "large", i.e. as having 10 or more employees. The activities in which the enterprises are engaged are given in Table 2.2. It will be noted that "Electric and Electronic products", with the highest number of enterprises

(28), employed 205 persons whilst "Watches and clocks", with only two enterprises, employed 211 persons.

(ii) Employment

The total workforce in the PSE sector at the end of March 1996 was 1,448 (1,006 males and 442 females), an increase of around 100 over the previous quarter (Table 2.1). The "large" enterprises employed 1,117 compared to 1,066 at the end of December 1995.

During the 1st quarter 1996, a total of 178 jobs were created: 67 by the 8 new enterprises and 111 following expansion in 27 existing enterprises. On the other hand, 20 enterprises reported a total reduction of 75 in their workforce (Table 2.3).

The number of expatriates employed as at end of the 1st quarter 1996 stood at 56 (50 males and 6 females).
