## External Trade – 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 1998

### Introduction


This economic indicator presents external trade statistics for the first quarter of 1998 and for the years 1996 and 1997. While figures for 1996 and 1997 are final, those for 1998 may be revised in future issues.

Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. As this system accounts for all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, trading activities of the freeport zone should also be covered. However, for the sake of comparability and continuity and also due to lack of detailed information on freeport trade, data from the two sources, namely the Customs Department and the Mauritius Freeport Authority are shown separately. Data pertaining to imports and re-exports of the Freeport are given in **Table 2**. With the exception of this table, all the other tables and the analysis refer to usual customs data.

### 1. Total value of trade and trade balance

Total international trade for the first quarter of 1998 was valued at Rs.18,505 million, a figure which is 24.2% lower than that of the previous quarter and 18.4% higher than that of the corresponding quarter of 1997.

During the first quarter of 1998, total exports reached Rs.7,618 million compared to total imports of Rs.10,887 million, thus yielding a trade deficit of Rs.3,269 million. This deficit shows an improvement of 28% over that of the previous quarter (Rs.4,562 million inclusive of aircraft), but is 54% higher than that of the first quarter of 1997 (**Table 1**).



### 2. Terms of trade (base year: 1992 = 100)

During the first quarter of 1998, the terms of trade index which shows price movements of exports relative to those of imports, increased by 9 percentage points from 101 during the fourth quarter of 1997 to 110. This movement was the result of an increase of 4% in export prices against a fall of 8% in import prices. It should be borne in mind that price changes have been based on unit value indices which do not reflect genuine price changes since they are affected by factors like changes in country of origin, product mix and quality.

Details of price changes for exports and imports are given in **Tables 4 and 5**.

### 3. Exports

Total export proceeds for the first quarter of 1998, including domestic exports, re-exports and ship's stores and bunkers, amounted to Rs 7,618 million, showing an increase of Rs 868 million (or 12.9%) over the first quarter of 1997. Domestic exports, which represent 93% of total exports, increased from Rs 6,328 million to Rs 7,107 million (12.3%).


Exports of sugar were 19% higher in value than proceeds received in the first quarter of last year. This was due to an increase of 14% in volume associated with a price increase of 4%. During the same period, exports of EPZ products improved by 8% in nominal terms, resulting from a 10% increase in prices while volume fell by 2%.

The table below shows the main changes in total exports between the first quarters of 1997 and 1998.

Exports by country of destination for the first quarter of 1998 (**Table 7**) show that our main buyers remained the countries of the European Union: they purchased some 72% of our exports for Rs 5,374 million, representing an increase of 7.4% over the first quarter of 1997. The United Kingdom remained the main buyer with Rs 2,780 million worth of our exports, representing 37% of total exports. The other major markets were France (16%), U.S.A (14%), Germany (5%), Malagasy Republic (5%) and Italy (4%).


The import bill for the first quarter of 1998 attained Rs 10,887 million, showing an increase of Rs. 2,010 million (23%) over the figure of Rs 8,877 million registered during the corresponding period of 1997. Overall import prices are estimated to have fallen by around 1% while imports increased by 24% in volume terms.

Comparative figures for imports by S.I.T.C (Rev 3) sections are shown below, while further details by section and commodity are presented in **tables 8 and 9**.

Compared to the first quarter of 1997, imports of “*Food, live animals, beverages and tobacco*” increased by 20% in nominal terms, due to an increase of 4% in price levels and another increase of 15% in volume. The total value of imports of goods classified under “*Machinery and transport equipment*” increased by 45% during this period, the combined effect of a 7% increase in prices and 36% increase in volume. The only S.I.T.C section which recorded a decrease in nominal value of imports was “*Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials*” for which the total value fell by 15% as a consequence of a 23% decrease in price and an increase of 10% in volume.



**Table 10** shows imports by country of origin. During the first quarter of 1998, Mauritius imported Rs 3,335 million worth of goods from countries of the European Union, representing 31% of total imports for that period. On a countrywise basis, our main suppliers were the Republic of South Africa (13%), France (12%), India (10%), United Kingdom (6%), China (5%), Hong Kong (5%) and Japan (5%).

## 5. The EPZ Sector

During the first quarter of 1998, EPZ enterprises exported some Rs 5,042 million worth of goods against Rs 4,675 million for the same period last year, showing a nominal increase of 8%, representing an increase of 10% in price and a fall of 2% in volume.

On the other hand, during the same period imports by this sector increased by 34% to Rs 3,703 million against Rs 2,758 in 1997. Imports of raw materials went up by Rs 763 million (+ 30%) and machinery by Rs 182 million (+ 87%).

Net EPZ exports for the first quarter of 1998 worked out to Rs 1,339 million against Rs 1,917 million for the corresponding period last year. The ratio of net EPZ exports to total exports of the EPZ fell to 27% from 41% for the same period last year.

## **6. Trade in Freeport Zone**

A summary table on data pertaining to activities in the Freeport compiled by the Mauritius Freeport Authority is given at **Table 2**.

During the first quarter of 1998, total imports of the Free Zone amounted to Rs. 779 million while re-exports totalled 774 million. However, these figures should be treated with caution as the imports include goods sourced locally (already in customs exports) and goods sold locally (customs imports). For instance, the value of goods purchased on the local market by Freeport operators are included in customs data as domestic exports and in freeport statistics as imports.

# **External Trade**

## **Notes**

### **(1) Coverage**

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses
- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.
- Ships stores and bunkers are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

### **(2) Valuation**

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

### **(3) Classification**

#### **(i) Commodity Code**

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 3) or SITC Rev. 3. The HS and the SITC Rev. 3 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.

**4. Terms of trade**

The terms of trade index measures the price movements of exports relative to imports. It is the ratio of exports price index to import price index. A rise in this ratio indicates that the real purchasing power of exports has increased whilst a decrease indicates a drop in the purchasing power
