

## **External Trade – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 1999**

### **Introduction**

This indicator presents external trade statistics for the first and second quarters of 1999 and for the years 1997 and 1998. While figures for 1997 and 1998 are final, those for 1999 may be revised in future issues.


Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. As this system accounts for all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, trading activities of the freeport zone should also be covered. However, for the sake of comparability and continuity, data from the two sources, namely the Customs Department and the Mauritius Freeport Authority are shown separately. Data pertaining to imports and re-exports of the Freeport are given in Table 2. With the exception of this table, all the other tables refer to usual customs data.

### **1. Total value of trade and trade balance**

Total international trade for the second quarter of 1999 was valued at Rs.25,440 million, a figure which is 25% higher than that of the previous quarter and 21% higher than that of the corresponding quarter of 1998 (Table 1).

During the second quarter of 1999, total exports reached Rs.9,532 million compared to total imports of Rs.15,908 million, thus yielding a trade deficit of Rs.6,376 million which is 90% higher than that of the previous quarter. It is to be noted, however, that imports for the period under review included the purchase of an aircraft for a value of Rs.2,700 million, and, if this transaction is excluded, the trade deficit will be only 10% higher than that of the first quarter of 1999.

For the first six months of 1999, total exports and imports amounted to Rs.17,994 million and Rs.27,720 million respectively, showing a trade deficit of Rs.9,726 million which is 45% higher than the figure of Rs.6,712 million registered during the corresponding period of last year.



Based on the trend for the first semester, total exports for the year 1999 are expected to reach Rs.40,500 million and imports Rs.55,000 million. The trade deficit will therefore be around Rs.14,500 million, which is 50% higher than that of last year, and around 22% if the purchase of aircraft is excluded.

## 2. Terms of Trade (base year 1997=100)

During the second quarter of 1999, the terms of trade index which shows price movements of exports relative to imports, improved by 4 percentage points to 104, from 100 in the previous quarter (Table 3). This results from a 0.9% increase in export prices and a 2.7% decrease in import prices. It should be borne in mind that price changes are based on unit value indices which, unlike genuine price changes, are affected by changes in country of origin/destination, product mix and quality.

Details of price changes for exports and imports are given in Tables 4 and 5.

## 3. Exports

The value of total exports for the second quarter of 1999 amounted to Rs.9,532 million, 9% higher than that of the corresponding quarter of 1998 (Rs.8,782 million). Proceeds from EPZ exports represented 82% of total exports for this quarter.

Total exports for the first semester attained Rs.17,994 million, showing a 9% increase over those of the corresponding period of last year (Rs.16,474 million). Domestic exports which represented 94% of total exports increased by 10%.



It is observed that sugar exports proceeds were 18% higher in the first semester of 1999 than those for the first semester of 1998 while exports of EPZ products increased by 17%. The group "other" includes EPZ products exported by firms holding ESZ certificates.

Comparison by country of destination for the first semesters of 1998 and 1999 shows that the share of the European Union, fell from 70% to 69% (Table 7). The United Kingdom remained our main partner with 29% (Rs.5,207 million) of our exports. The other major markets were France (Rs.3,436 million), U.S.A (Rs.3,416 million), Malagasy Republic (Rs.874 million), Germany (Rs.787 million), and Italy (Rs.578 million).



#### 4. Imports


Total imports for the second quarter of 1999 reached Rs.15,908 million, showing an increase of 35% over the previous quarter and a rise of 29% over the corresponding period of last year.

For the first six months of 1999, imports, excluding aircraft, totalled Rs.25,020 million, which is 8% (Rs.1,834 million) higher than the value registered for the first semester of 1998.

The table below shows comparative import figures for the first semesters of 1998 and 1999; additional commodity details are shown in Tables 8 and 9.

The highest increase in nominal terms was registered for the group "Machinery and transport equipment", whose import value, excluding aircraft, rose by 39%. Changes in nominal terms for the other product groups are less significant, varying between 1 and 2%.



Imports by country of origin (Table 10) show that our main source of imports during the first semester of 1999 remained the European Union with 36% of our imports. Country-wise, our main suppliers were: France (19%), the Republic of South Africa (10%), India (8%), Japan (6%), China (5%) and United Kingdom (5%).

## 5. The EPZ Sector

During the second quarter of 1999, exports from EPZ enterprises reached Rs.7,778 million, bringing the total for the first semester to Rs.13,666 million against Rs.11,718 million for the same period in 1998, that is an increase of 17% in nominal terms (Table 11).

EPZ exports to the European Union, representing 66% of total EPZ exports, increased by 15% from Rs.7,843 million during the first semester of 1998 to Rs.9,008 million during the corresponding period of 1999 (Table 12). The three major markets for EPZ products were: U.S.A (24%), France (24%) and United Kingdom (23%). EPZ exports of main commodities are shown in Table 13.

EPZ imports during the first semester of 1999 were almost at the same level as the corresponding period of 1998, i.e Rs.8,072 million compared to Rs.8,076. Purchases of raw materials went down by 3% (-213 million rupees) while machinery and equipment went up by 24% (+209 million rupees) for the same period (Table 11). EPZ imports of main commodities are shown in Table 14 while Table 15 shows imports by country of origin.

Net EPZ exports, which is the difference between exports and imports, works out to Rs.5,594 million for the first semester of 1999, that is 54% higher than that of the corresponding period of 1998. The ratio of net exports to total exports thus rose from 31% to 41%.

Based on figures for the first six months, total exports for the year 1999 are expected to reach Rs.29,300 million, that is 12% higher than in 1998.

## **6. Trade with Regional Organisations**

Total exports to African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) States amounted to Rs.566 million during the second quarter of 1999 while imports stood at Rs.406 million, showing increases of 8% and 15% respectively over the previous quarter. During the first semester of 1999, total exports to these countries were valued at Rs.1,091 million compared to Rs.759 million worth of imports (Table 16).

During the second quarter of 1999, Mauritius exported goods to a value of Rs. 549 million to COMESA countries while imports from these countries amounted to Rs.246 million, thus showing a balance of Rs.303 million in favour of Mauritius (Table 17). The main partner was Malagasy Republic with shares of 84% of exports and 46% of imports.

Total imports from COMESA countries for the first six months of 1999 amounted to Rs.440 million compared to total exports of Rs.1,055 million to these countries. During this period, trade with COMESA States represented 2% and 6% of our total imports and exports respectively.

Imports from SADC countries for the second quarter of 1999 amounted to Rs.1,556 million compared to exports worth Rs.124 million, thus showing a trade deficit of Rs.1,432 million (Table 18). The main supplier was the Republic of South Africa (93%) while our main buyers were the Republic of South Africa (41%), Seychelles (20%), Zimbabwe (17%) and Tanzania (10%).

For the period January to June 1999, Mauritius has imported goods worth Rs.2,871 million from SADC countries while exports to these countries amounted to Rs.195 million. These figures represented 10% and 1% of total imports and exports respectively.

## **7. Trade in Freeport Zone**

A summary table on data pertaining to activities in the Freeport compiled by the Mauritius Freeport Authority is given at Table 2.

During the second quarter of 1999, total imports of the Free Zone amounted to Rs.635 million, which is 8% lower than the figure registered during the previous quarter. However, during this quarter, re-exports increased by 14% to reach Rs.810 million. For the first semester of 1999, total imports amounted to Rs.1,324 million compared to re-exports to a value of Rs.1,519 million.

## External Trade

### Notes

#### (1) Coverage

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports). However, for the sake of comparability and continuity, transactions of the freeport zone are not included.

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses
- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.
- Ships stores and bunkers are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

#### (2) Valuation

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

#### (3) Classification

##### (i) Commodity Code

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 3) or SITC Rev. 3. The HS and the SITC Rev. 3 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.

#### 4. Terms of trade

The terms of trade index measures the price movements of exports relative to imports. It is the ratio of exports price index to import price index. A rise in this ratio indicates that the real purchasing power of exports has increased whilst a decrease indicates a drop in the purchasing power
