CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

2nd Quarter 2000

1. Main movements in the Consumer Price Index - 2nd Quarter 2000.

The Consumer Price Index (C.P.I) stood at 121.0 at the end of June 2000, i.e. at the same level as that of the end of the first quarter (*Table 1*). This was however the net effect of price increases in a variety of products, mainly fish (+0.1 point), fresh eggs (+0.1 point), some other food products (+0.1) and other goods and services (+0.3 point), coupled with price decreases of fresh vegetables (-0.4 point), household appliances (-0.1 point) and personal transport (-0.1 point) (*Table 2*).

It might be noted that the C.P.I increased by 2.3 points or 2% during the second quarter of 1999.

2. Changes in Major Commodity Group Sub-indices.

Table 3 shows the evolution of the major commodity group indices (sub-indices) during the first six months of the year. Except for the "Fuel and light" sub-index, all the sub-indices registered changes during the second quarter of 2000.

The highest percentage rise (+0.6 %) occurred in the sub-index for "Miscellaneous goods and services". This was mainly the result of price increases of alcoholic beverages in bars and restaurants and in some personal care goods.

The sub index for major commodity group "Clothing and footwear" increased by 0.4 % due to higher tailoring charges (+0.7 %) and price increases of some ready made clothing (+0.4%) and footwear (+0.4 %).

An increase of 0.3 % was recorded in the sub index for "Recreation, entertainment, education and cultural services". This is attributable to higher prices of some recreational and sports goods offset to some extent by price decreases of audio equipment.

The sub index for the major group "Medical care and health expenses" went down by 1.1 % mainly due to lower prices of some medicinal products (-2.3 %).

Following government decision to reduce custom duties on some household goods and appliances in the last budget, the sub index for "Housing and household operations" decreased by 0.4 %. This was mainly due to price decreases of refrigerators (-22.9 %), microwave ovens (-18.3 %), grinders and blenders (-13.4 %) and electric showers (-11.9 %).

The "Alcoholic beverages and tobacco" sub index went down by 0.2 %, mainly as the result of a decrease in the price of cane spirit (-5.8%).

The sub index for the major group "Food and non alcoholic beverages" registered a decrease of 0.1 %. This was the net effect of price decreases of cooking oil (-8.6 %), food drinks (-5.1 %) and fresh vegetables (-3.5 %) together with price increases of fresh eggs (+13.1 %), prepared meals (+8.1 %), pastry (+2.3 %) and fish (+2.1 %)

Another 0.1 % decrease was registered in the sub index for 'Transport and communication', caused mainly by a fall in the price of motorcycles (-3.5 %).

3. Rate of inflation

The rate of inflation for financial year 1999/2000 was 5.3 %, compared to 7.9 % for financial year 1998/99. This rate was 6.9 % for calendar year 1999 (Table 4).
