

## External Trade – 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2001

### Introduction

This issue of the Social and Economic Indicators presents external trade statistics for the first quarter of 2001 and for the years 1999 and 2000. While figures for 1999 are final, those for 2000 and 2001 are subject to revision in future issues.

Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. As this system accounts for all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, trading activities of the freeport zone should in principle also be integrated in external trade statistics. However, for the sake of comparability and continuity, data from the two sources, namely the Customs Department and the Mauritius Freeport Authority are shown separately. Data pertaining to imports and re-exports of the Freeport are given in Table 2. With the exception of these two tables, all the other tables refer to usual customs data and do not include transactions of the freeport.

Detailed statistical tables on imports and exports of the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) are published in the indicator on "EPZ and Pioneer Status Enterprises", which appears in this same issue.


### 1. Total value of trade and trade balance

Total international trade for the first quarter of 2001 was valued at Rs.23,229 million, a figure which is 13.2% lower than that of the previous quarter and 17.0% higher than that of the corresponding quarter of 2000.

During the first quarter of 2001, total exports reached Rs.10,530 million compared to total imports of Rs.12,699 million, thus resulting in a trade deficit of Rs.2,169 million. However when transactions of the Freeport are taken into consideration, this deficit is reduced to Rs. 1,787 million (Table 1).

Total exports for the first quarter of 2001 have decreased by 13.7% over the total exports of the fourth quarter of 2000. However, an increase of 33.5% is observed in the total exports when compared to the corresponding quarter of 2000. This is mainly due to a substantial increase in the export of sugar.

Based on the trend for the previous years, total exports for the year 2001 are expected to be of the order of Rs.46,000



million, as against Rs.60,000 million for imports which will include aircraft worth Rs.2,500 million. The trade deficit will be around Rs.14,000 million.

## 2. Terms of trade (base year: 1997 = 100)

During the first quarter of 2001, the terms of trade index, which shows price movements of exports relative to those of imports, decreased by four percentage points to 86, from 90 in the fourth quarter of 2000 (Table 3). This movement was due mainly to an increase of 4.2% in import prices while export prices remained at the same level. It should be borne in mind that these price movements are based on unit value indices which, unlike genuine price changes, are affected by changes in country of origin/destination, product mix and quality.

Details of price changes for exports and imports are given in Tables 4 and 5.

## 3. Exports

Total export proceeds for the first quarter of 2001, including domestic exports, re-exports and ship's stores and bunkers, amounted to Rs.10,530 million, showing an increase of Rs.2,641 million (or 33.5%) over the figure of Rs. 7,889 million registered in the corresponding quarter of 2000.

Domestic exports, which represent about 90% of total exports, increased from Rs.7,239 million to Rs.9,516 million or 31.5% during these two periods.

The table below shows the main changes in domestic exports between the first quarters of 2000 and 2001.

Proceeds from sugar exports were very high compared to the first quarter of 2000 on account of the low production registered for the crop year 1999-2000 due to adverse climatic conditions. Exports of "*crude materials, except fuels*", registered an increase of 8% in value, as a result of a 24% increase in prices, and a 13% fall in volume. Export receipts from "*manufactured goods classified chiefly by materials*" improved by 13% in nominal terms, resulting from an increase of 11% in prices and a 2% increase in volume. Similarly, exports of "*Miscellaneous manufactured articles*" registered an increase of 8% in value, following increases of 2% and 6% in prices and volume respectively.

Analysis by country of destination shows that our main buyers, i.e the European Union, purchased some 67% of our exports for Rs.6,699 million, representing an increase of about 40% over the first quarter of 2000. The United Kingdom remained the main buyer with Rs.3,299 million, or 33% of total exports, followed by U.S.A with Rs.1,990 million (20%). The other major markets were France (18%), Malagasy Republic (6%), Italy (4%) and Germany (4%). Table 7 shows further details.



#### 4. Imports

Total imports for the first quarter of 2001 reached Rs. 12,699 million, showing an increase of 6.1% over the imports figure of Rs.11,973 million registered during the corresponding period of 2000. Overall import prices are estimated to have increased by around 7% while import volume decreased by 1%.

Figures for imports by S.I.T.C (Rev 3) sections are compared to those of the first quarter of 2000 below.

The value of imports of "Food, live animals" increased by 11% reflecting a 12% rise in prices accompanied by a 1% decrease in volume. Decreases in value were also registered in "Animals & vegetable oils & fats", "crude materials, inedible except fuel" and "Machinery and transport equipment" i.e 19%, 5% and 4% respectively. The other remaining sections, except "Beverages and tobacco" which showed no change in its value, registered increases in value ranging from 8% to 14%.

Further details by section and commodity are given in tables 8 and 9.

### Imports from main countries




Table 10 shows imports by country of origin. During the first quarter of 2001, imports from the European Union totalled Rs.3,543 million, representing 28% of total imports for that period. Our main supplier countries were the Republic of South Africa (18%), France (11%), India (8%), China (7%), U.S.A (4%), United Kingdom (4%), Japan (4%), Italy (4%), Germany (4 %) and Hong Kong (3%).

## **5. Trade in Freeport Zone**

A summary table on data pertaining to activities in the Freeport compiled by the Mauritius Freeport Authority is given at Table 2.

During the first quarter of 2001, total imports of the Free Zone amounted to Rs.967 million while re-exports totalled Rs.1,349 million. These include respectively Rs.129 million worth of goods sourced locally and Rs.113 million sold locally.

## **6. Trade with Regional Organisations**

Total exports to African, Carribean and Pacific (ACP) States during the first quarter of 2001 amounted to Rs.765 million, while imports stood at Rs.418 million, showing increases of 24% and 12% respectively over the corresponding quarter of 2000 (Table 11).

During the first quarter of 2001, Mauritius exported goods to a value of Rs.738 million to COMESA countries. Imports from these countries amounted to Rs.370 million, resulting in a balance of Rs.368 million in favour of Mauritius. The main partner was Malagasy Republic with a share of 82% of exports and 50% of imports.

Trade with SADC countries for that period showed a deficit of Rs.2,271 million, resulting from imports to a value of Rs.2,444 million and exports amounting to Rs.173 million. The main supplier was the Republic of South Africa (92%). Our main buyers were Republic of South Africa (37%), Zimbabwe (31%), Seychelles (16%) and Mozambique (9%).

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# External Trade

## Notes

### (1) Coverage

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses
- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.
- Ships stores and bunkers are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

### (2) Valuation

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

### (3) Classification

#### (i) Commodity Code

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 3) or SITC Rev. 3. The HS and the SITC Rev. 3 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.

4. **Terms of trade**

The terms of trade index measures the price movements of exports relative to imports. It is the ratio of exports price index to import price index. A rise in this ratio indicates that the real purchasing power of exports has increased whilst a decrease indicates a drop in the purchasing power
