# Business Activity Statistics, July 2002 - June 2003 

## Introduction

Business Activity Statistics are compiled mainly from the administrative records of the local authorities, professional councils, government departments and other organisations responsible for the delivery of licences and registration certificates. Thus only licensed and registered activities are covered. Currently all agricultural related activities, except those associated with the manufacture of food products, are not covered.

It must also be pointed out that the statistics on business activity refer to the total number of licensed or registered activities and not to the total number of operation units or establishments. For example, a general retailer may hold three licences: one for trading in foodstuffs, a second for selling tobacco and a third for selling liquor.

## 2. Evolution of Licences between July 2002 and June 2003

During the period July 2002 to June 2003, a total of 5,703 new licences were issued, $64 \%$ of which pertained to activities classified under 'Wholesale \& retail trade; repair of motor vehicles, motorcycles and personal \& household goods’. During the same period, 1,825 licences were cancelled, thus bringing the total number of licences as at June 2003 to 69,402 , representing an increase of 3,878 ( $6 \%$ ) over the previous year figure (Table 1).

## 3. Licences and registrations as at June 2003

Table 4 shows that at the end of June 2003, the total number of licensed and registered activities stood at 86,079 showing an increase of $3,971(5 \%)$ over the figure of 82,108 in June 2002. The highest number of activities was registered in the sector 'Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles, personal and households goods', totaling 46,965 (55\%), followed by the sector 'Transport, storage \& communications', 17,208 (20\%).

## 4. Distribution by region and industry

The distribution of licences and registrations by industry and region (urban and rural) is outlaid in Table 5. The number of activities is higher in rural areas than in urban areas, 44,855 (52\%) against 41,224 (48\%).

An analysis by sector reveals that activities relating to 'Hotels and restaurants' are mostly found in the rural areas (65\%), while those pertaining to sectors 'Real estate, renting and business activities' and 'Financial intermediation' occur predominantly in the urban areas with figures of $66 \%$ and $60 \%$ respectively.

## Technical Notes

## 1. Concepts and coverage

Data compiled in this publication pertain to all activities licensed at the local authorities (Municipal and District Councils) as well as those registered with the relevant authorities. All activities carried out without a licence or registration are therefore excluded. Currently all agricultural related activities, except those in the manufacture of food products, are not covered.

An operator is required to obtain a licence from the Municipal or District Councils for each type of activity or to register with the appropriate Ministry or Organisation (e.g Ministry of Education, Medical Council etc.). In some cases an operator may hold both a licence and a registration certificate and to avoid double counting, such activities have been accounted for in either registration or licence only. For example the owner of a bus, besides registering his vehicle with the National Transport Authority may also hold a licence issued by a district council. In the table giving figures for both licences and registrations, the activity of the bus owner is accounted for in registration only.

## 2. Classification and presentation of data

To cater for the wide range and diverse business activities and for classification purposes, each activity has been assigned an activity code according to the National Standard Industrial classification of Economic Activities (NSIC), which is an adapted version of the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC), Rev. 3, 1990.

The NSIC consists of 5 levels of classification namely:
Level $1 \quad$ Section: $\quad 17$ sections identified by one of the letters A to Q
Level 2 Division: 56 divisions identified by the first 2 digits
Level $3 \quad$ Group: $\quad 151$ groups identified by the first 3 digits
Level $4 \quad$ Classes: $\quad 302$ classes identified by the first 4 digits
Level 5 Sub-classes: 546 sub-classes identified by the first digits
