# Business Activity Statistics, July 2003 - June 2004 

## Introduction

Statistics on business activities undertaken in the island of Mauritius are compiled mainly from administrative records. They cover activities which are either licensed with the local authorities (municipalities and district councils) or registered with the appropriate organizations such as the Medical and Dental council, the National Transport Authority, the Financial Services Commission etc. All agricultural activities are presently excluded.

It must be pointed out that the statistics on business activity refer to the total number of licensed or registered activities and not to the total number of operation units or enterprises. For example, one enterprise may hold three licences: one as general retailer of foodstuff, a second for selling tobacco and a third for selling alcoholic beverages.

## 2 Registration with the Tourism Authority

As from July 2003, the Tourism Authority set up under the Tourism Act 2002, became the institution responsible for the issue of permits to operators in the tourism sector, as defined in the Act, such as travel agents, tour operators, hotel and restaurant keepers etc. Consequently licences which were issued by the local authorites for the above activities, were cancelled. Permits which were then issued by the Tourism Authority, have been accounted for as registrations. Important changes are thus observed in both the number of licences and registrations during period July 2003 and June 2004.

## 3 Evolution of Licences between July 2003 and June 2004

During the period under reference 5,269 new licences were issued of which 3,911 (74\%) pertained to activities classified under 'Wholesale \& retail trade; repair of motor vehicles, personal and household goods'. During the same period, 4,425 licences were cancelled (of which 2,488 (56\%) following the coming into force of the Tourism Act). The total number of licences as at June 2004 was thus 70,701 representing a slight increase of $1 \%$ over the previous year figure of 69,857 (Table 1).

## 4 Licences and registrations as at June 2004

As shown in Table 4, the total number of licensed and registered activities increased by $5 \%$, from 86,547 in June 2003 to 90,830 in June 2004. Majority of such activities 49,790 (55\%) related to the sector 'Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles, personal and household goods' and 17,707 (19\%) to the sector 'Transport, storage \& communications'. Sector wise the highest increases were noted in 'Other community, social and personal service activities’ (8\%), 'Construction’ and 'Financial intermediation’ (7\% each).

## 5 Distribution by region and industry

Table 5 shows the distribution of licensed and registered activities by industry and region (urban and rural). The number of activities is slightly higher in rural areas (53\%). Activities which are predominantly in the rural regions are from the sectors 'Hotels and restaurants' (65\%) and 'Other community, social and personal service activities' (64\%). Activities pertaining to the sectors 'Health and social work' and 'Real estate, renting and business activities' are found mostly in the urban areas ( $77 \%$ and $65 \%$ respectively).

## Technical Notes

## 1. General

Data compiled in this publication provide useful information on demography and trend of business activities in the different economic sectors of the country.

## 2. Concepts and Coverage

An operator is required to obtain a licence from the Municipal or District Councils for each type of activity or to register with the appropriate Ministry or organizations (e.g Ministry of Education and Scientific Research, the Medical Council, the National Transport Authority, the Mauritius Freeport Authority, etc.) Statistics published in this report pertain only to activities that are either licensed or registered. Thus activities which are not licensed/registered are excluded. All agricultural related activities, except those in the manufacture of food products, are also not covered.

In some cases, an operator may hold both a licence and a registration certificate. To avoid double counting, such activities have been accounted for in either registration or licence only. For example the owner of a bus, besides registering his vehicle with the National Transport Authority may also hold a licence issued by a district council. In the table giving figures for both licences and registrations, the activity of the bus owner is accounted for in registration only.

## 3. Classification and presentation of data

To cater for the wide range and diverse business activities and for classification purposes, each activity has been assigned an activity code according to the National Standard Industrial classification of Economic Activities (NSIC), which is an adapted version of the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC), Rev. 3, 1990.

The NSIC consists of 5 levels of classification namely:
Level 1 Section: 17 sections identified by one of the letters A to Q
Level 2 Division: 56 divisions identified by the first 2 digits

Level $3 \quad$ Group: 151 groups identified by the first 3 digits Level $4 \quad$ Classes: 302 classes identified by the first 4 digits Level 5 Sub-classes: 546 sub-classes identified by the first digits
