## Business Activity Statistics, July 2007-June 2008

## Introduction

Statistics on business activities undertaken in the Island of Mauritius are compiled mainly from administrative records. They cover activities which are either licensed with the local authorities (municipalities and district councils) or registered with the appropriate organisations such as the Medical and Dental Council, the National Transport Authority, the Tourism Authority, etc. All agricultural activities are presently excluded.

It is to be noted that statistics on business activity presented in this publication refer to the total number of licensed or registered activities and not to the total number of operation units or enterprises.

With the coming into operation of the Business Registration and Business Facilitation Acts on the $1^{\text {st }}$ of October 2006 and amendments brought to various regulations, several trades have been grouped under different clusters. As a result, an operator may carry out several activities grouped within the same cluster without having to hold separate licences.

Consequently, statistics on licences and registrations collected prior to October 2006 are not strictly comparable with those collected after October 2006. Care should therefore be taken when comparing figures presented in this publication with figures published prior to October 2006.

## 2. Evolution of licences between July 2007 and June 2008

The total number of licences as at June 2008 was 89,595 representing an increase of $6 \%$ over the figure of 84,185 for June 2007 (Table 1). During the reference period, 9,150 new licences were issued, the majority of which (64\%) were in the industry group 'Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles, personal and household goods', and 3,740 licences were cancelled. Table 2 shows the distribution of licences by industry group and district.

## 3. Registrations by industry group and district as at 30 June 2008

The number of registered activities increased by 259 (1\%) from 29,330 in June 2007 to 29,589 in June 2008. The industry group 'Transport, storage and communications’ had the highest number of registered activities ( 21,380 or $72 \%$ ), followed by 'Real estate, renting and business activities' ( 2,846 or $10 \%$ ), as shown in Table 3. It is to be noted that activities carried out by enterprises previously holding export processing and pioneer status certificates, are no longer considered as registered activities and are now included under licensed activities only. This explains the decrease in the number of registered activities from 545 in June 2007 to 18 in June 2008, in the industry group 'Manufacturing’.

## 4. Adjusted licences and registrations as at June 2008

Table 4 shows the total number of licensed and registered activities as at June 2008, adjusted for double counting. Activities which are both licensed and registered are included in registrations only.

The total number of adjusted licensed and registered activities increased by 5\% from 107,378 in June 2007 to 113,047 in June 2008. An analysis by industry group shows that 'Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles, personal and household goods' had the highest number of activities, 61,916 (55\%), followed by 'Transport, storage and communications' with 21,851 (19\%) activities.

## 5. Distribution of adjusted licences and registrations by industry group and region

Table 5 shows the distribution of adjusted licensed and registered activities by industry group and region (urban and rural). The number of activities was slightly higher in rural areas (54\%) than in urban areas. Activities predominant in the rural regions were from the industry groups 'Other community, social and personal service activities’ (65\%) and 'Hotels and restaurants' (63\%). On the other hand, activities pertaining to the following industry groups were found mostly in the urban areas: 'Health and social work' (75\%), 'Real estate, renting and business activities’ (63\%) and ‘Education’ (56\%).

## 6. Distribution of adjusted licences and registrations by industry group and district

The highest number of licensed and registered activities was in the district of Plaines Wilhems (30,554 or 27\%), followed by the district of Port Louis (20,881 or 18\%). The smallest number occurred in the district of Black River with a total of 4,684 (4\%) activities, as shown in Table 6.

## 7. Licences and registrations by activity, district and industry group

Tables 7.1 to 7.8 give a breakdown of the licensed and registered activities for the different industry groups, by activity and district.

## Technical Notes

## 1. General

Data compiled in this publication provide the information on demography and trend of business activities in the different economic sectors of the country.

## 2. Concepts and Coverage

An operator is required to obtain a licence from the Municipal or District Councils or to register with the appropriate Ministry or organisations (e.g Ministry of Education and Human Resources, the Medical Council, the National Transport Authority, the Tourism Authority, etc.) in order to operate. Statistics published in this report pertain only to activities that are either licensed or registered. However, all agricultural related activities, except those in the manufacture of food products, are not covered.

Statistics on licences relate to the number of licences as delivered by the local authorities. Similarly statistics on registrations are those as registered with the appropriate Ministries or organisations. In some cases, an operator may hold both a licence and a registration certificate. To avoid double counting, while compiling statistics on both licences and registrations, such activities have been accounted for in registration only. For example the owner of a bus, besides registering his vehicle with the National Transport Authority may also hold a licence issued by a district council. In the table giving figures for both licences and registrations, the activity of the bus owner is accounted for in registration only.

## 3. Classification and presentation of data

To cater for the wide range and diverse business activities and for classification purposes, each activity has been assigned an activity code according to the National Standard Industrial classification of Economic Activities (NSIC), which is an adapted version of the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC), Rev. 3, 1990.

The NSIC consists of 5 levels of classification namely:
Level $1 \quad$ Section: 17 sections identified by one of the letters A to Q
Level 2 Division: 56 divisions identified by the first 2 digits
Level $3 \quad$ Group: 151 groups identified by the first 3 digits
Level $4 \quad$ Classes: 302 classes identified by the first 4 digits
Level 5 Sub-classes: 548 sub-classes identified by the 5 digits
