

## External Trade – 3rd Quarter 2011

### 1. Introduction

This issue of the Economic and Social Indicator presents external trade statistics for the first three quarter of 2011 and for the year 2009 and 2010. These statistics are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importer and exporter. Some of these declarations are at times revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA) - Customs Department.

It is to be noted that figures for 2009 published in this indicator are final while those for 2010 and 2011 are subject to revision as and when the MRA - Customs Department submits latest amendments to the Statistics Mauritius.


Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. According to this system, all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, including trading activities of the Freeport zone should be accounted for. However, it was not possible prior to 2002 to include Freeport transactions in our general trade statistics because of different processing systems at the Customs Department and at the Mauritius Freeport Authority. Since mid-October 2001, transactions of the Freeport are being lodged through the Customs Management System (CMS), thus making it possible to integrate data of the Freeport zone with those of Customs.

Hence, as from 2002, data on imports and exports include transactions through the Mauritius Freeport. It is to be noted that all exports of the Freeport are included in re-exports of Mauritius because it is not possible to distinguish between domestic exports and re-exports of freeport licensees. It is estimated that for the third quarter of 2011 some 27% of freeport exports were sourced locally.

### 2. Total value of trade and trade balance

Total international trade for the third quarter of 2011 was valued at R 56,633 million, i.e. 6.5% higher than the previous quarter and 11.2% higher than the corresponding quarter of 2010.

During the third quarter of 2011, total exports were valued at R 20,069 million against imports of R 36,564 million. This resulted in a trade deficit of R 16,495 million, compared to deficits of R 16,299 million (+1.2%) for the previous quarter and R 15,614 million (+5.6%) for the corresponding quarter of 2010.



### **3. Exports**

#### **3.1 Total exports (Table 1)**

Total export proceeds for the third quarter of 2011, including domestic exports<sup>1</sup>, re-exports<sup>2</sup> and ships' stores and bunkers amounted to R 20,069 million, showing increases of 8.9% compared to the previous quarter and 13.7% compared to the corresponding period of 2010.

Domestic exports, which accounted for 71.2% of total exports, went up by 4.6% from R 13,672 million in the previous quarter to R 14,297 million in the third quarter of 2011. Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2010, domestic exports were higher by 5.6%. In the third quarter of 2011 re-exports stood at R 2,588 million, i.e. higher by 7.7% compared to the previous quarter but lower by 3.9% as regard to the corresponding quarter of 2010.

Total exports for the first nine months of 2011 reached R 56,273 million, showing an increase of 14.6% over the first nine months of 2010.

#### **3.2 Exports by SITC section - (First nine months 2011)**

Exports of "Food and live animals" for the first nine months of 2011 amounted to R 15,227 million, showing a rise of 6.1% over the corresponding period of 2010. Exports of sugar went up by 25.1% while those for "Fish and fish preparations" declined by 2.9% (Table 3).

For the first nine months of 2011, exports of "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" were valued at R 5,092 million, higher by 17.3% when compared to exports of R 4,340 million for the first nine months of 2010.

Total exports of "Machinery and transport equipment" for the first nine months of 2011 decreased by 3.8% from R 1,166 million in the first nine months of 2010 to R 1,122 in the first nine months of 2011.

Export proceeds for the first nine months of 2011 from "Miscellaneous manufactured articles" increased by 10.0% compared to the corresponding period of 2010, to reach R 23,651 million from R 21,495 million. These articles represent 48.9% of total exports during the first nine months of 2011. Exports of "Articles of apparel & clothing accessories" representing 82.5% of exports showed an increase of 12.1% compared to the first nine months of 2010.

#### **3.3 Exports of Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE) - (First nine months 2011)**

During the first nine months of 2011, exports of the EOE amounted to R 32,555 million, showing an increase of 11.7% compared to the corresponding period of 2010 (Table 1). Details on exports of these enterprises will be presented in the Economic and Social Indicator on the Export Oriented Enterprises, which will be released by the Statistics Unit based at the Ministry of Industry on 16 December 2011 on website.



<sup>2</sup> Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

### 3.4 Exports by Country of destination - (First nine months 2011)

Analysis of exports figures by country of destination for the first nine months of 2011 shows that the European countries were our main buyers, purchasing some 62.5% of our exports for a value of R 30,275 million. The United Kingdom remained our main market with R 10,298 million, 21.3% of total exports. The other major destinations for our exports were France (14.6%), U.S.A (10.7%), Italy (7.9%), South Africa (7.6%), Spain (7.4%), and Madagascar (6.2%) - (Table 7).

Compared to the first nine months of 2010, total exports to France fell by 3.0% while those to South Africa, Spain, Italy, Madagascar, U.S.A and UK went up by 51.2%, 28.5%, 20.9%, 17.7%, 9.7% and 5.8% respectively.



### 4. Imports

#### 4.1 Total imports - (Table 1)

Total imports for the third quarter of 2011 reached R 36,564 million, showing increases of 5.3% and 9.9% over the previous quarter of 2011 and corresponding quarter of 2010 respectively.

Total imports for the first nine months of 2011 amounted to R 105,716 million, showing increases of 5.3% over the previous quarter and 10.0% over the corresponding period of 2010.

#### 4.2 Imports by SITC section - (First nine months 2011)

Imports of “*Food and live animals*” for the first nine months of 2011 were valued at R 18,922 million, i.e. 6.3% higher than those of the corresponding period of last year. Increases were noted in imports of dairy products (+6.2%) and fish and fish preparations (+4.5%). On the other hand, a decrease was noted in the imports of rice (-21.3%) – (Table 10).

The import bill of “*Mineral fuels, lubricants, & related products*” stood at R 23,772 million, representing an increase of 29.5% over the corresponding nine months of last year.


Imports of “*Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material*” for the first nine months rose by 12.7% to reach R 20,374 million. Increases were noted in “Textile yarn” (+42.3%), “Cotton fabrics” (+15.9%) and “Pearls, precious and semi-precious stones” (+9.2%).

For the first nine months of 2011, imports of “*Machinery & transport equipment*” which were valued at R 18,381 million fell by 6.7% compared to the same period of last year.

#### **4.3 Imports by country of origin – (First nine months 2011)**

During the first nine months of 2011, imports from the Asian continent, our major supplier, amounted to R 57,004 million, representing 53.9% of total imports.

Our imports originated mainly from the following countries: India (24.2%), China (13.8%), France (8.7%) and South Africa (7.7%) - (Table13).



#### **5. Trade with Regional Organisations – (First nine months 2011)**

Total exports to African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) States during the first nine months of 2011 stood at R 8,142 million, against imports of R 11,032 million (Table 14). The trade deficit with ACP countries worked out to R 2,890 million.

During the first nine months of 2011 our exports to COMESA member states attained R 4,200 million, while imports from these countries amounted to R 2,813 million resulting in a favourable trade balance of R 1,387 million for Mauritius. Madagascar was the main buyer with a share of 71.4%. Our main suppliers were Kenya (34.0%) and Egypt (23.8%) – (Table 15).

Trade with SADC countries for the first nine months of 2011 showed a deficit of R 1,965 million, resulting from imports value of R 9,517 million against exports worth R 7,552 million. The main supplier was South Africa (85.0%) and our main buyers were South Africa (48.9%) and Madagascar (39.7%) - (Table 16).

## **6. Trade in Freeport Zone - (First nine months 2011)**

During the first nine months of 2011, total imports of the Freeport Zone stood at R 6,120 million, a figure which is higher by 45.6% compared to the corresponding period of last year. The main items imported through the Freeport were “Fish and fish preparations” and “Chemicals and related products” (Table 12).

Re-exports to overseas markets, which were valued at R 4,704 million, declined by 12.7% when compared to the first nine months of 2010. The main items re-exported through the Freeport were “Fish and fish preparations”, “Chemicals and related products” and “Articles of apparel and clothing accessories” (Table 6).

## **7. Forecast 2011**

Based on past trends, total exports for the year 2011 are expected to be of the order of R 76,000 million, against R 155,000 million for imports. The trade deficit would be around R 79,000 million.

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## Notes

### (1) Coverage

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses
- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.
- Ships stores and bunker are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

### (2) Valuation

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

### (3) Classification

#### (i) Commodity Code

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS2007). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 4) or SITC Rev. 4. The HS and the SITC Rev. 4 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.
