

## External Trade – 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2013

### 1. Introduction

This issue of the Economic and Social Indicators presents external trade statistics for the first quarter of 2013 and for the years 2011 and 2012. These statistics are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importers and exporters. Some of these declarations are at times revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA) - Customs Department.

Thus while revised figures for 2011 are published in this indicator, those for 2012 are subject to revision by mid July 2013 when the MRA - Customs Department submits latest amendments to Statistics Mauritius.


Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. According to this system, all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, including trading activities of the Freeport zone should be accounted for.

It is to be noted that all exports of the Freeport are included in re-exports of Mauritius. It is estimated that for the first quarter of 2013 some 16% of Freeport exports were sourced locally.

### 2. Total value of trade and trade balance

Total international trade for the first quarter of 2013 was valued at R 57,632 million. It is lower by 13.4% when compared to the previous quarter and higher by 4.1% when compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012.

During the first quarter of 2013, total exports stood at R 20,361 million against imports of R 37,271 million. The resulting trade deficit for the first quarter 2013 worked out to R 16,910 million, 8.8% lower than the deficit of R 18,548 million in the first quarter of 2012.



### 3. Exports

#### 3.1 Total exports (1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2013)

Total export proceeds (including domestic exports<sup>1</sup>, re-exports<sup>2</sup> and ships' stores and bunkers) for the first quarter of 2013 amounted to R 20,361 million. This shows a decrease of 6.5% and a rise of 10.6% compared to the previous quarter and the corresponding quarter of 2012 respectively.

Domestic exports, which accounted for 67.8% of total exports, went down by 8.3% from R 15,048 million in the previous quarter to R 13,799 million in the first quarter of 2013. Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012, domestic exports were higher by 5.4%. For the first quarter of 2013, re-exports stood at R 2,692 million, lower by 14.3% compared to the previous quarter but higher by 3.4% compared to the corresponding period of last year.

#### 3.2 Exports by SITC section (Table 3)

Exports of "Food and live animals" for the first quarter of 2013 amounted to R 6,624 million showing a slight decrease of 0.8% over the previous quarter. Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012, total exports of this section increased by 17.9%, mostly explained by increases of 28.6% in exports of sugar and 17.5% in the exports of "Fish and fish preparations".

During the first quarter of 2013, exports of "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" were valued at R 1,527 million, showing a decrease of 18.9% compared to the previous quarter but an increase of 3.2% compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012. The 18.9% decrease is explained mainly by lower export of "Pearls and precious stones" (-37.7%).

Export proceeds from "Miscellaneous manufactured goods", amounted to R 6,731 million, representing decreases of 14.1% compared to the fourth quarter of 2012 and 6.4% compared to the first quarter of 2012. These articles represented 40.8% of goods exported in the first quarter of 2013.

#### 3.3 Exports of Export Oriented Enterprises (1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2013)

During the first quarter of 2013, exports of the Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE) amounted to R 10,914 million showing a decrease of 10.3% compared to the previous quarter and a slight increase of 0.3% compared to the corresponding period of 2012 (Table 1). Further details on these transactions will be presented in the issue of Economic and Social Indicators on EOE, to be released on 28 June 2013.


<sup>2</sup> Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

### 3.4 Exports by country of destination (Table 7)

Analysis by country of destination for the first quarter of 2013 shows that the European countries were the main buyers, purchasing 61.1% of our exports for a value of R 10,077 million. The United Kingdom remained our main client with R 3,179 million, representing 19.3% of total exports.

The other major destinations for our exports were France (11.9%), Italy (10.2%), U.S.A (9.3%), South Africa (8.9%), Spain (6.5%), and Madagascar (6.2%).

Compared to the first quarter of 2012, total exports to our major markets, namely Italy, Madagascar, South Africa, United Kingdom and USA increased by 33.4%, 9.0%, 2.5%, 0.3% and 0.2% respectively. However, decreases were noted in exports to Spain (-14.6%) and France (-7.3%). Further details are given in Table 7.



## 4. Imports

### 4.1 Total imports (1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2013)

Total imports for the first quarter of 2013 dropped by 16.7% from R 44,748 million in the previous quarter to R 37,271 million but increased slightly by 0.9% compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012.

### 4.2 Imports by SITC section (Table 10)

Imports of “*Food and live animals*” for the first quarter of 2013 amounted to R 7,347 million, showing a decrease of 19.2% over the previous quarter and an increase of 17.5% over the corresponding quarter of 2012. Decreases were noted mainly in imports of “*Meat and meat preparations*” (33.5%), “*Fish and fish preparations*” (29.6%), “*Dairy products and bird’s eggs*” (20.5%) compared to the previous quarter of 2012.

The import bill of “*Mineral fuels, lubricants, & related products*” stood at R 9,963 million for the first quarter of 2013, representing a rise of 13.3% over the previous quarter. Compared to the corresponding period of 2012, it rose by 13.0%.


Imports of “*Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material*” declined by 22.4% compared to the previous quarter but increased by 2.1% compared to the first quarter of 2012.

For the first quarter of 2013, imports of “*Machinery & transport equipment*” stood at R 5,814 million. Imports of this section fell by 26.1% compared to the previous quarter and by 30.3% with respect to the corresponding quarter of 2012.

#### 4.3 Imports by country of origin (Table 13)

During the first quarter of 2013, imports from the Asian continent, our major supplier, amounted to R 20,673 million with a share of 55.5% of total imports.

Our imports originated mainly from the following countries: India (28.0%), China (12.1%), France (8.0%) and South Africa (6.6%). Compared to the first quarter of 2012, the following changes were noted: India (+14.4%), South Africa (+11.8%), China (-3.0%) and France (-6.5%).



#### 5. Trade with Regional Organisations (Tables 14-16)

Total exports to African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) States during the first quarter of 2013 stood at R 2,990 million, against imports of R 3,972 million (Table 14). The trade deficit with ACP countries worked out to R 982 million.

During the first quarter of 2013 our exports to COMESA countries attained R 1,398 million, while imports from these countries amounted to R 1,177 million, resulting in a positive trade balance of R 221 million for Mauritius. Madagascar was the main buyer with a share of 73.7%. The main products exported to Madagascar were yarn of carded wool and coloured plain cotton weave. Our main suppliers were Kenya (34.8%) and Egypt (17.9%). The main products imported from Kenya were cigarettes containing tobacco while iron and steel bars constituted the main product imported from Egypt.

Trade with SADC countries for the first quarter of 2013 showed a deficit of R 470 million, resulting from imports of a value of R 3,256 million and exports worth R 2,786 million. The main supplier was South Africa (75.6%) and our main buyers were South Africa (52.7%) and Madagascar (37.0%).

## **6. Trade in Freeport Zone (Table 2)**

During the first quarter of 2013, total imports of the Freeport Zone stood at R 1,830 million, lower by 26.9% compared to the previous quarter and by 30.2% compared to the first quarter of 2012. The main items imported through the Freeport were “Fish and fish preparations”, “Machinery and transport equipment” and “Chemicals & related products” (Table 12).

Re-exports to overseas markets were valued at R 1,807 million, showing a decrease of 15.5% compared to the previous quarter and an increase of 16.2% over the corresponding quarter of 2012. The main items re-exported by the Freeport were “Fish and fish preparations” and “Chemicals and related products” (Table 6).

## **7. Forecast 2013**

Based on recent past trends and indicative information from various sources, total exports including ships’ stores and bunkers for the year 2013 are expected to be of the order of R 87,000 million, against R 180,000 million for imports. The trade deficit would be around R 93,000 million.

## Notes

### (1) Coverage

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses
- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.
- Ships stores and bunkers are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

### (2) Valuation

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

### (3) Classification

#### (i) Commodity Code

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS2012). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 4) or SITC Rev. 4. The HS and the SITC Rev. 4 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.
