

# Quarterly Export and Import Price Indices

2nd Quarter 2013  
(Base year: 2007=100)

## 1. Introduction

The Export Price Index (EPI) provides an overall measure of pure price changes (in Mauritian rupees) of goods exported to other countries. The Import Price Index (IPI), on the other hand, measures pure price changes (in Mauritian rupees) of goods purchased from other countries.


This issue of Economic and Social Indicators presents a series of quarterly export and import price indices for the period second quarter 2011 to second quarter 2013 with 2007 as base year. The weights have been derived from exports and imports data for the base year, while the average import and export prices of representative items in 2007 have been used in the base year.

The methodology used and the weight structure are given in the technical notes at Annex.

## 2. Terms of trade (base year: 2007 = 100)

The terms of trade index is the ratio of export price index to import price index. A rise in this ratio indicates that the terms of trade have moved in favour of Mauritius. During the second quarter of 2013, exports prices did not change while import prices decreased by 1.2% when compared to the previous quarter. Consequently, the terms of trade index rose by 1.1 points to reach 89.7 from 88.6. Compared to the corresponding period of 2012, the terms of trade rose by 6.8 points, from 82.9 to 89.7.

### **3. Export Price Index (EPI) – (Tables 4 - 9)**

#### **3.1 Structure of the EPI**

The EPI covers six sections of the SITC, namely “Food and live animals”, “Crude materials, inedible, except fuels”, “Animals and vegetables oils & fats”, “Chemicals and related products”, “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” and “Miscellaneous manufactured articles”. Exports of goods falling under these sections covered 88.0% of total exports in base year 2007. In addition to the overall index, separate sub-indices are given for the different sections, groups of commodities and items product categories.

#### **3.2 Changes in Export Price Index (2<sup>nd</sup> quarter 2013)**

##### 3.2.1 Overall Index

During the second quarter of 2013, the EPI remained unchanged at 109.3. However, an increase of 1.4% was noted in the prices of “Food and live animals”, partly offset by a decrease of 1.2% in the prices of “Miscellaneous manufactured articles”.

Compared to price levels in the corresponding quarter of 2012, the index was higher by 6.3%, explained mainly by price increases in “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” (+22.1%), “Food and live animals” (+5.8%) and “Miscellaneous manufactured articles” (+3.5%).

##### 3.2.2 Sub-indices by section

###### *Section 0: Food and live animals*

During the second quarter of 2013, the sub-index for “Food and live animals” accounting for 34.5% of the total weight went up to 118.2 from 116.5 in the previous quarter, representing an increase of 1.4%. That was mainly due to an increase of 3.4% in the export prices of “Sugars, sugar preparations and honey”, partly offset by a decrease of 1.1% in the prices of “Fish and fish preparations”.

When compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012, the index rose by 5.8%, due to an increase of 14.6% in the prices of “Fish and fish preparations” and “Sugars, sugar preparations and honey” (+1.1%), partly offset by a decrease of 17.4% in the prices of “Live animals”.

###### *Section 2: Crude materials, inedible, except fuels*

The index for “Crude materials, inedible, except fuels”, consisting mainly of “Fresh cut flowers”, increased by 6.1% from 96.7 in the first quarter of 2013 to 102.5 in the second quarter of 2013.

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012, the index increased by 1.7%.

### *Section 5: Chemicals and related products*

The export price index for “Chemicals and related products” which stood at 90.1 in the first quarter of 2013 remained unchanged in the second quarter.

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012, the index rose by 7.1% as a result of increases in the prices of “Medicinal and pharmaceutical products” (+7.5%) and “Organic chemicals” (+6.2%).

### *Section 6: Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material*

Export price index did not change in the second quarter as a result of offsetting of price increases of some products by decreases in prices of other products. The main changes were an increase of 5.7% in the prices of “Non-metallic mineral manufactures, n.e.s” and a decrease of 4.0% in the prices of “Textile yarn and fabrics”.

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012, the index rose by 22.1%, mainly as a result of increases in the export prices of “Clock or watch glasses” (+92.2%) in the division “Non-metallic mineral manufactures, n.e.s”, partly offset by a decrease of 2.0% in the prices of “Textile yarn and fabrics”.

### *Section 8: Miscellaneous manufactured articles*

“Miscellaneous manufactured articles” is the most important section covered by the export price index. It carries about 55.2% of the total weight and consists mostly of “Articles of apparel and clothing accessories”.

During the second quarter of 2013, the index for “Miscellaneous manufactured articles” decreased by 1.2% from 98.5 in the first quarter of 2013 to 97.3 in the second quarter of 2013. This is mainly explained by decreases in the prices of “Watches and clocks” (-27.1%).

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012, the index rose by 3.5%, mostly due to increases in the prices of “Articles of apparel and clothing accessories” (+3.5%) and “Photographic apparatus, equipment and supplies and optical goods” (+3.4%).

## **4. Import Price Index (IPI) (Tables 10 -15)**

### **4.1 Structure of the IPI**

The IPI covers nine out of the 10 Standard International Trade Classification sections.

The only section not covered is “Commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere”, because of the heterogeneity of the products and the inherent difficulties in pricing items of a constant quality.

Thus, the index, either directly or indirectly, covers about 91.0% of merchandise imported during 2007. Sixty per cent of the items are directly represented. For those items which are not directly represented, the prices are considered to move similarly to those represented directly.

### **4.2 Changes in Import Price Index (2<sup>nd</sup> quarter 2013)**

#### 4.2.1 Overall Index

The Import Price Index (IPI) decreased by 1.2% from 123.3 in the first quarter of 2013 to 121.8 in the second quarter of 2013. This was mainly the effect of decreases in the prices of “Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials” (-7.9%), “Animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes” (-6.7%), partly offset by an increase of 7.4% in the prices of “Beverages and tobacco”.

Compared to the corresponding period of 2012, the index went down by 1.8%, mainly as a result of decreases in the prices of “Machinery and transport equipment” (-13.7%) and “Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials” (-4.2%), partly offset by increases in the prices of “Beverages and tobacco” (+13.2%) and “Food and live animals” (+8.5%).

#### 4.2.2 Sub-indices by section

##### *Section 0: Food and live animals*

The index for “Food and live animals”, representing about 18.1% of total weight, increased by 1.1% from 138.8 in the first quarter of 2013 to 140.4 in the second quarter of 2013. Within the section, price increases were registered mainly in “Fish and fish preparations” (+3.4%) and “Dairy products and birds' eggs” (+3.4%).

Compared to the second quarter of 2012, the index went up by 8.5%, mainly due to increases in the prices of “Fish and fish preparations” (+16.0%), “Cereals and cereal preparations” (+12.0%) and “Dairy products and birds' eggs” (+7.2%), partly offset by a decrease in the prices of “Live animals” (-7.9%) and “Meat and meat preparations” (-6.5%).

##### *Section 1: Beverages and tobacco*

The index for “Beverages and tobacco” increased by 7.4% from 147.2 in the first quarter of 2013 to 158.0 in the second quarter of 2013 as a result of price increases of 12.0% in “Beverages”.

Compared to the corresponding period of 2012, the index was up by 13.2% due to higher prices of 18.2% and 6.7% in “Beverages” and “Tobacco & tobacco manufactures” respectively.

#### *Section 2: Crude materials, inedible, except fuels*

The index for “Crude materials, inedible, except fuels” increased by 6.2% from 160.4 in the first quarter of 2013 to 170.4 in the second quarter of 2013, mainly as a result of an increase of 11.6% in the prices of “Cork and wood”.

Compared to the corresponding period of last year, the index went up by 5.7%, attributable mainly to increases of 12.3% in the prices of “Cork and wood”.

#### *Section 3: Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials*

The index for “Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials” consisting mainly of “Petroleum, petroleum products and related materials” with 20.0% of the total weight, decreased by 7.9% from 148.6 in the first quarter of 2013 to 136.8 in the second quarter of 2013. This is mainly explained by a decrease of 8.1% in the prices of “Petroleum, petroleum products and related materials” and 11.3% in the prices of “Gas, natural and manufactured”.

Compared to the corresponding period of 2012, the index fell by 4.2% as a result of price decreases of 16.5% in “Coal, coke and briquettes” and 2.9% in “Petroleum, petroleum products and related materials”.

#### *Section 4: Animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes*

The index for “Animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes” went down by 6.7% from 137.2 in the first quarter of 2013 to 128.0 in the second quarter of 2013.

Compared to the second quarter of 2012, the index decreased by 10.5% from 143.0 to 128.0.

#### *Section 5: Chemical materials and related products, not elsewhere specified (n.e.s)*

The index for “Chemical materials and related products, n.e.s” increased by 1.1% in the second quarter of 2013 to reach 108.6 from 107.5 in the first quarter of 2013. Main price increases were registered in “Plastics in primary forms” (+2.4%) and “Essential oils and resinoids, etc.” (+2.1%).

When compared to the corresponding period of last year, the index fell by 2.6%, mainly as a result of a decrease of 41.4% in the prices of “Organic chemicals”.

#### *Section 6: Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material*

In the second quarter of 2013, the index for “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” stood at 112.4 and represents an increase of 0.6% over the previous quarter figure of 111.7. This rise is mainly due to increases in the prices of “Manufactures of metals, n.e.s.” (+1.3%) following increases in the prices of “Empty gas bottles”.

Compared to the second quarter of 2012, the index fell by 2.5%, mainly due to price decreases in “Non-metallic mineral manufactures, n.e.s.” (-11.0%), partly offset by an increase in the prices of “Non-ferrous metals” (+3.3%).

*Section 7: Machinery and transport equipment*

The index of “Machinery and transport equipment” remained unchanged in the second quarter compared to the previous quarter of 2013.

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012, the index fell by 13.7% as a result of decreases of 38.2% in the prices of “Telecommunications and sound recording” and 9.9% in “Road vehicles (including air-cushion vehicles)”.

*Section 8: Miscellaneous manufactured articles*

During the second quarter of 2013, the index of “Miscellaneous manufactured articles” was 117.2 which represents a decrease of 0.4% over the first quarter figure of 117.6, attributable to price decreases of 5.5% in “Prefabricated buildings; sanitary plumbing, heating & lighting fixtures and fittings, n.e.s.”.

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2012, the index went up by 2.3%, mainly due to higher prices of 9.8% in “Photographic apparatus, equipment and supplies and optical goods, n.e.s.; watches & clocks” and 3.3% in “Furniture & parts thereof; bedding, mattresses, mattress support, cushions & similar stuffed furnishings”.

**5. Past trends**

As indicated earlier, EPI and IPI in this publication are not strictly comparable with previously published series worked out using 2003 as base year. Chain linked export and import price indices using 2007 as the base year have been worked out using appropriate conversion factors and are presented in Tables 9 and 15 respectively.

**ANNEX****Technical Note****Export Price Index (EPI)****Methodology for the Construction of the EPI****Definition**

The Export Price index (EPI) provides an overall measure of pure price changes in Mauritian Rupees of goods exported to other countries. This index is constructed from the export prices of a "constant" well-defined representative basket of products selected from trade data in the base year, that is, in 2007.

The first series of EPI was calculated with year 1993 as base and reference period. It was subsequently rebased in 1997, 2003 and 2007.

**Scope and Classification**

The index is based on the Nomenclature of the Standard International Trade Classification of the United Nations (SITC Rev 4). Separate sub-indices are produced for each SITC section and for more detailed groups where possible.

The EPI covers domestic exports and re-exports, the most important commodities being sugar, textile fabrics, articles of apparel and clothing accessories.

However, some commodities were excluded in the computation of the weights, because of their heterogeneity and the inherent difficulties in pricing the items to a constant quality. These were precious stones, jewellery, recorded media and free publications, and all products classified within the Sections 1, 3, 7 and 9 of the SITC; together, they accounted for around 12% of total exports.

The index thus covers about 88% of the value of merchandise exported during 2007. Items directly represented (price movements followed), constitute 75% of the total value of exports. For the other 13% not directly represented, their prices are considered to move similarly to those represented directly.

**Selection of Items to be priced and Outlets**

A representative sample of 25 exporting companies (outlets) was selected from trade declarations submitted to the Customs Department in 2007 for the pricing of the commodity items. The sample consists of major exporting companies trading on a regular basis. The selected companies are visited each quarter to collect the required prices.

A total of 65 items, representing 30 commodities were selected for pricing on the basis of regularity of trade and share in total exports, the most important ones being sugar, textile fabrics, and articles of apparel and clothing accessories. Specifications of items to be priced (physical and qualitative) were established in collaboration with the selected exporting

companies to ensure that same items are priced every quarter. Specifications include: pricing basis, contract basis, country of destination, unit of measurement, mode of transport, terms of payment, currency and any other conditions like quality and quantity of the product, that have a bearing on the price.

### **Weighting Scheme**

The weights have been derived from the 2007 total exports. Weights assigned to each section, division, group and commodity are based on their export values in 2007. Items selected for pricing purposes represent all commodities that fall within that weight group.

### **Changes in the weights from 2003 to 2007**

The changes in weights at section level are shown in the table below.

It is noted that the weights of “Food and live animals”, and “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” have increased in the new weight structure due to their growing importance while the increase in the weights of “Chemicals and related products” was a result of the introduction of medicinal and pharmaceutical products in the index basket.

### **Base and Reference Period**

Both the base period (period to which weights refer) and the reference period (index=100) for the EPI are the calendar year 2007. Export data for year 2007 have been used to derive the weights while the yearly average prices were used as reference year prices. The quarterly average prices have also been used to calculate the quarterly indices for the reference year.

## Price Collection

Selected companies are visited once every quarter, but prices are collected for each month of the quarter and quarterly averages worked out for the computation of the price indices. Some 65 price quotations are collected each month. These prices are reported on a free on board (F.O.B.) basis and are mostly contract prices.

## Uses of the EPI

The EPI is mainly used as price deflators for exports. It shows changes in the prices of Mauritian products sold abroad and can be used for calculating changes in the volume of exports.

It also serves as a basis to assess the competitiveness of Mauritian products in relation to price trends of common products of other countries with which Mauritius competes for markets.

## Calculation of the EPI

The lowest level (SITC 7 digit) indices are calculated as a geometric average of the price relatives of the basic observations. A modified Laspeyres formula, based on the weighted average of price relatives, is used to calculate higher level indices. The mathematical

## **Import Price Index (IPI)**

### **Methodology for the Construction of the IPI**

#### **Definition**

The Import Price Index (IPI) provides an overall measure of pure price changes (in Mauritian Rupees) of goods imported into the country.

The IPI is based on actual price measurements of a fixed basket of imported goods. It requires elaborate specifications of products and takes into account the main price determining factors such as country of origin and quality.

The first IPI was calculated with the year 2003 as reference and 2002 as base year. The new index is calculated with 2007 as base and reference year.

#### **Scope and Classification**

The commodities are classified according to the United Nations Standard International Trade Classification (SITC Rev 4). Sub-indices are produced for each SITC section and for more detailed groups where possible.

For the computation of weights, some commodities accounting for around 9% of total imports in 2007 were excluded because of their heterogeneity and the inherent difficulties in pricing the items to a constant quality. These were: precious stones, jewellery, cellular telephones, recorded media and free publications, aircraft, helicopters and marine vessels, certain machine parts, textile wastes and Section 9 of the SITC described as “Commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere”.

Thus, the index covers about 91% of the value of merchandise imported during 2007. Items directly represented (price movements followed), constitute around 60% of the total value of imports. For the other 31% not directly represented, their prices are considered to move similarly to those represented directly.

#### **Selection of Items to be priced and Outlets**

The commodities forming the basket were selected according to the following criteria:

- (i) As far as possible, an item is included if it is imported regularly and frequently
- (ii) The items selected had to be, to a large extent, representative of the bulk of the trader’s import
- (iii) There must be a sustained demand of the commodity variety
- (iv) Items had to be specific and detailed enough for pricing.

Similarly, an importer for a particular product is selected provided that he imports that product on a regular basis.

Detailed characteristics (physical and qualitative) of items to be priced were established in collaboration with the importers so that the price quotations from period to period refer to the same items. The following are some commodity specifications: pricing basis, country of importation, unit of measurement, mode of transport, terms of payment, currency and any other conditions like quality and quantity of the product that have a bearing on the price

At the end of the process, some 139 commodity items and 220 outlets were selected for subsequent pricing.

### **Weighting scheme**

The weights were derived from total imports in 2007. Weights assigned to each section and group are based on their import values in that year. Products or group of products selected for pricing purposes represent all products that fall within that weight group.

### **Changes in the weights from 2003 to 2007**

The changes in weights at section level are shown in the table below.

The main changes were:

- (i) "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" declined by 1,635 from 3,776 in 2003 to 2,141 due to lower imports of textile yarn, paper and paperboard and cotton fabrics
- (ii) "Machinery and transport equipment" increased by 666 from 1,134 in 2003 to 1,800 as a result of higher imports.

### **Base and Reference Period**

Both the base period (period to which weights refer) and the reference period (index=100) for the IPI are the calendar year 2007. Import data for year 2007 have been used to derive the weights while the yearly average prices were used as reference year prices. The quarterly average prices have also been used to calculate the quarterly indices for the reference year.

### **Price collection**

There are two common practices for the collection of prices of items falling in the basket. Prices for the specified goods are collected each month from importers and average quarterly prices are then derived for compiling the index, or, in case where most imports occur at intervals longer than a month, prices are collected only once every quarter and refer to the last consignment. A preliminary survey of the importers has shown that, in the case of Mauritius, the second practice is more suitable.

Prices are reported on a cost, insurance and freight (c.i.f) basis and are expressed in Mauritian Rupees. Exchange rates from the Customs and Excise Department are used in case prices are reported in foreign currencies.

Though the frequency of imports has been taken into consideration in selecting items and importers, it may happen that some items in the basket have not been imported during a certain period. In such cases, the prices are estimated using the variations in the exchange rate of the currency of imports. The underlying assumption is that the only factor affecting the price is the value of the Mauritian Rupee relative to the transaction currency. However, for items that would no longer be imported, they would have to be substituted by similar items.

### **Petroleum products and rice**

It is to be noted that for petroleum products, the index is calculated differently given that these products, namely gasoline, gas oil, aviation fuel, fuel oil, LPG are now imported more than once during a quarter. All prices available for the quarter are collected and an average price for the quarter is computed.

The above pricing system is also applicable for rice , imported by the STC.

### **Uses of the Import Price Index**

The Import Price Index is an important economic indicator which is used, inter alia, to:

- (i) measure changes in prices of imports
- (ii) analyse the effect of import price changes on the various sectors of the economy
- (iii) calculate changes in the volume of imports
- (iv) calculate the terms of trade (that is the ratio of export prices to import prices)
- (v) analyse the effect of exchange rates on import prices.

### Calculation of the IPI

The lowest level indices are determined as a geometric average of the price relatives of the basic observations. A modified Laspeyres formula, based on the weighted average of price relatives, is used to calculate higher level indices.

The mathematical form of the formula is shown below:
