

## **Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE) 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2015**

### **1. Introduction**

This issue of “Economic and Social Indicators” (ESI) presents the results of the Quarterly Survey of Employment among Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE), conducted by Statistics Mauritius at the end of June 2015.

It also includes provisional figures on EOE imports and exports for the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015 as well as figures for the years 2013 and 2014. Table 1 shows the main indicators of the EOE sector for the period 2007 to 2014.

EOE consist of enterprises formerly holding an EPZ certificate as well as enterprises manufacturing goods for export and holding a registration certificate issued by the Board of Investment.

### **2. Employment**

#### **2.1 Employment – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2015**

Compared to the first quarter of 2015, employment in EOE decreased by 230 (-0.4%) from 54,417 to 54,187. Male employment increased by 66 to reach 25,412, but female employment decreased by 296 from 29,071 to 28,775 (Table 2).

The number of Mauritians employed in the EOE sector went up by 97 (+0.3%) from 31,466 to 31,563 while the number of foreign workers decreased by 327 (-1.4%) from 22,951 at the end of March 2015 to 22,624 at the end of June 2015 (Table 2).

The decrease of 230 in employment during the second quarter of 2015 is the result of 724 job losses and creation of 494 new jobs.

Highest number of job losses occurred in the sub sectors “Wearing apparel” and “Food” with decreases of 221 and 192 jobs respectively. Jobs were created mainly in “Wearing apparel” and “Textile yarn and fabrics” with 218 and 71 jobs respectively.

#### **2.2 Evolution of employment from June 2014 to June 2015**

From June 2014 to June 2015, total employment decreased by 1,505 (-2.7%) from 55,692 to 54,187. The number of Mauritian workers decreased by 1,522 (-564 males and -958 females). However, employment of foreign workers increased by 17 (+296 males and -279 females) (Tables 2 and 5).

Jobs were lost mainly in sub sectors “Pullovers”, with a decrease of 596 jobs and in “Other garments” with a decrease of 549 jobs. However, some new jobs were created mainly in “Food” and “Leather products and footwear” with an increase of 46 jobs in each of these two sub sectors.

Details of changes in employment by product group are given in tables 3, 4 and 5.

### 3. Exports and Imports

Statistics on imports and exports are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importers and exporters. Some of these declarations are, at times, revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA) - Customs Department. Thus, while figures for 2013 are final, those for 2014, 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter and 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter of 2015 will be revised when the MRA - Customs Department submits latest amendments to Statistics Mauritius.

#### 3.1 Exports and Imports – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2015

##### 3.1.1 Exports (f.o.b)

Provisional figures show that EOE exports during the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015 amounted to R 13,553 million, that is, R 2,499 million (+22.6%) higher compared to the first quarter of 2015 (Table 6).

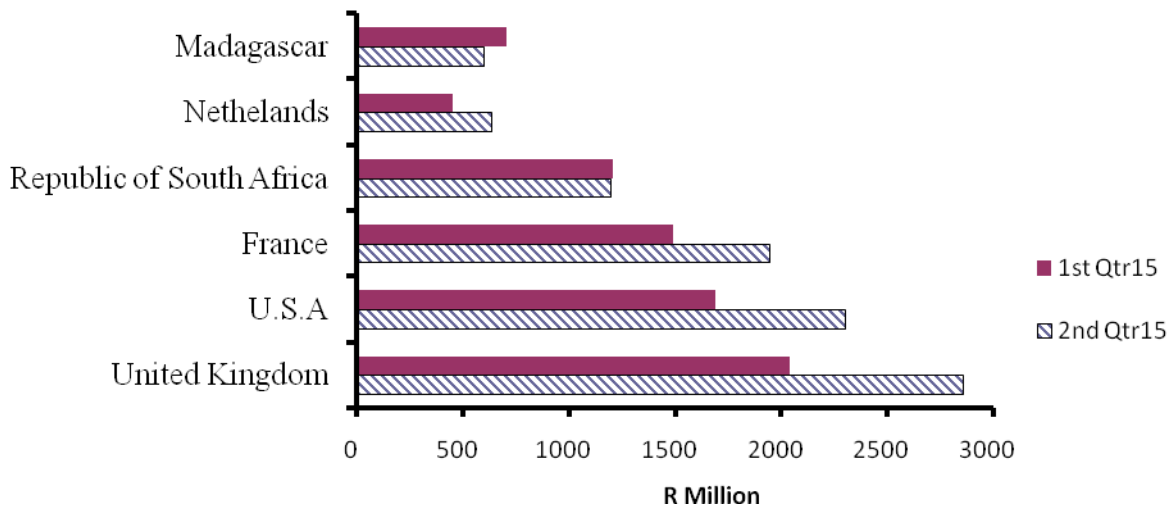
That was mainly the result of increases of R 1,564 million (+30.8%) in the exports of “Articles apparel and clothing” and R 401 million (+17.4%) in “Fish & fish preparations”.

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2014, EOE exports increased by R 461 million (+3.5%).

Details on EOE exports by section are given in Table 7.

The United Kingdom (UK), the United States of America (USA) and France remain the principal EOE markets, together accounting for R 7,105 million (52.4%) of total EOE exports. The Republic of South Africa, Netherlands and Madagascar are among the other main destinations of EOE exports.

Compared to the previous quarter, main changes in exports were as follows:

Exports went up for:

- United Kingdom by R 819 million (+40.2%);
- U.S.A by R 606 million (+35.8%); and
- France by R 452 million (+30.2%).

Exports went down for:

- Madagascar by R 105 million (-14.9%).

Further details are given in Table 9.

### 3.1.2 Imports (c.i.f)

EOE imports during the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015 were estimated at R 7,185 million, representing an increase of R 856 million (+13.5%) compared to the first quarter of 2015 (Table 8). This increase is due to higher imports of raw materials by R 756 million (+12.6%), and machinery and transport equipment by R 100 million (+32.7%).

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2014, imports increased by R 237 million (+3.4%), mainly due to rises in imports of pearls, precious and semi-precious stones for processing, by R 361 million (+52.4%), "Textile yarn and fabrics" by R 146 million (+8.8%) and partly offset by a drop of R 121million (-16.4%).in imports of miscellaneous articles used in manufacturing.

Details on EOE imports by section are given in Table 8.

### 3.1.3 Net exports

Net exports, i.e. exports minus imports, amounted to R 6,368 million in the second quarter of 2015 and its ratio to total exports worked out to around 47% same as in the corresponding quarter of 2014 (Table 6).

It is to be noted that the above exports and imports figures do not include transactions of the EOE with the Freeport. EOE sales to the Freeport are considered as local sales, were valued at R 91 million in the second quarter of 2015 compared to R 45 million in the second quarter of 2014. These sales are included in exports of Freeport, as and when the goods leave the country.
