

## **External Merchandise Trade Statistics – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2019**

### **1. Introduction**

This issue of Economic and Social Indicators presents external merchandise trade statistics for the first and second quarters of 2019 and the years 2018 and 2017. These statistics are compiled from declarations lodged at Customs by importers and exporters. Some of these declarations are at times revised at a later period and corrections made accordingly on the computerised database of the Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA) - Customs Department.


Thus, while revised figures for 2017 are published in this indicator, those for 2018 are still provisional and subject to revision as and when MRA - Customs Department submits latest amendments to Statistics Mauritius.

Data on external merchandise trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. According to this system, all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, including trading activities of the Freeport zone should be accounted for.

### **2. Total value of trade and trade balance**

Total external merchandise trade for the second quarter of 2019 was valued at Rs 68,992 million, i.e. 5.1% higher than the previous quarter and by 1.1% compared to the corresponding quarter of 2018.

During the second quarter of 2019, total exports (including ship's stores & bunkers) were valued at Rs 20,465 million against imports of Rs 48,527 million. The resulting trade deficit worked out to Rs 28,062 million, 4.2% higher than the deficit of Rs 26,919 million of the previous quarter and 1.0% higher than the deficit of Rs 27,789 million of the corresponding quarter of 2018.



### 3. Exports

#### 3.1 Total exports (Tables 1 & 3) – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2019

Total exports proceed for the second quarter of 2019, including domestic exports<sup>1</sup>, re-exports<sup>2</sup> and ship's stores and bunkers amounted to Rs 20,465 million, showing an increase of 5.7% compared to the previous quarter. This is mainly explained by increases in exports of "Machinery and transport equipment" (+54.8%), "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" (+19.4%) and "Miscellaneous manufactured articles" (+15.2%), partly offset by decreases in the exports of "Chemicals and related products, n.e.s." (-14.9%), "Food and live animals" (-6.1%) and "Ships' stores & bunkers" (-4.6%).

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2018, total exports for the second quarter of 2019 rose by 1.1%. This is mainly explained by increases in exports of "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" (+26.2%), "Machinery and transport equipment" (+13.4%) and "Food and live animals" (+1.5%), partly offset by decreases in exports of "Ship's stores & bunkers" (-10.9%), "Chemicals and related products" (-8.7%) and "Miscellaneous manufactured articles" (-1.0%).

Domestic exports amounting to Rs 13,896 million, accounted for 67.9% of total exports in the second quarter of 2019. Compared to a value of Rs 12,574 million recorded in the first quarter of 2019, domestic exports increased by 10.5%. This is mainly explained by increases in domestic exports of "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" (+22.3%), "Miscellaneous manufactured articles" (+20.1%) and "Chemicals and related products, n.e.s." (+13.6%), partly offset by a decrease in exports of "Food and live animals" (-5.4%). Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2018, domestic exports were higher by 4.2%, mainly explained by increases in "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" (+33.0%) and "Chemicals and related products, n.e.s." (+3.8%), partly offset by decreases in the domestic exports of "Food and live animals" (-0.9%) and "Miscellaneous manufactured articles" (-0.4%) (*Table 4*).

In the second quarter of 2019, re-exports stood at Rs 3,762 million, i.e. lower by 2.2% compared to the previous quarter, mainly due to decreases in re-exports of "Chemicals and related products, n.e.s." (-27.0%), "Miscellaneous manufactured articles" (-17.7%) and "Food and live animals" (-9.2%), partly offset by increases in "Machinery and transport equipment" (+54.7%). Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2018, re-exports were higher by 0.3%, mainly due to increases in the re-exports of "Food and live animals" (+12.2%), "Machinery and transport equipment" (+11.8%), partly offset by decreases in re-exports of "Chemicals and related products" (-15.4%), "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" (-15.0%) and "Miscellaneous manufactured articles" (-6.1%) (*Table 5*).

#### 3.2 Exports by SITC section (Tables 1 & 3) – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2019

Around 34.0% of total exports for the second quarter of 2019 consisted of "Miscellaneous manufactured articles" (Rs 6,952 million), 29.0% of "Food and live animals" (Rs 5,939 million) and 12.8% of "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" (Rs 2,611 million).

Compared to the first quarter of 2019, the main changes by section are as follows:

- "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" increased by 19.4%, explained by increases in the exports of "Pearls, precious and semi-precious stones" (+25.4%) and "Textile yarns, fabrics, made up articles" (+13.6%).

<sup>2</sup> Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

- “Miscellaneous manufactured articles” registered an increase of 15.2%, mainly due to an increase in exports of “Articles of apparel and clothing accessories” (+22.5%).
- “Food and live animals” decreased by 6.1%, mainly due to decreases in the exports of “Cane Sugar” (-2.4%) and “Fish and fish preparations” (-0.7%).


### 3.3 Exports of Export Oriented Enterprises (EOE) – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2019

During the second quarter of 2019, exports of EOE amounted to Rs 11,461 million, compared to Rs 11,354 million in corresponding quarter of 2018 (*Table 1*). Further details on these transactions will be presented in the issue of the Economic and Social Indicator on Export Oriented Enterprises, to be released on 27 September 2019.

### 3.4 Exports by country of destination (Table 7) – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2019

Analysis of exports figures by country of destination for the second quarter of 2019 shows that the European countries were our main buyers, purchasing some 44.8% of our exports for a value of Rs 7,906 million. Among countries, the major destinations for our exports were U.S.A. (11.1%), South Africa (10.6%), U.K (10.0%), France (9.8%), Madagascar (7.0%), Italy (6.2%) and Spain (4.2%).

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2018, exports to Italy, South Africa, Madagascar and U.S.A went up by 39.1%, 12.3%, 11.0% and 7.3% respectively. On the other hand, exports to Spain, U.K and France dropped by 30.0%, 15.1% and 11.9% respectively.



## 4. Imports

### 4.1 Total imports (Table 10) – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2019

Total imports for the second quarter of 2019 amounted to Rs 48,527 million, showing an increase of 4.9% over the previous quarter. This is mainly due to increases in imports of

“Miscellaneous manufactured articles” (+29.1%), “Machinery and transport equipment” (+10.9%) and “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” (+5.4%).

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2018, imports in the second quarter of 2019 rose by 1.0%. This is mainly due to increases in imports of “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” (+9.1%), “Chemicals and related products” (+2.9%), “Machinery and transport equipment” (+2.4%) and “Miscellaneous manufactured articles” (+1.4%), partly offset by decreases in the imports of “Food and live animals” (-4.9%) and “Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials” (-1.0%).

#### **4.2 Imports by SITC section (Table 10) – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2019**

Around 23.2% of imports in the second quarter of 2019 consisted of “Machinery and transport equipment” (Rs 11,246 million), 18.3% of “Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials” (Rs 8,899 million), 17.3% of “Food and live animals” (Rs 8,408 million), 17.0% of “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” (Rs 8,268 million), 9.7% of “Miscellaneous manufactured articles” (Rs 4,702 million) and 9.1% of “Chemicals and related products” (Rs 4,392 million).

Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2018, total imports increased by 1.0%. Main changes by section are as follows:


- “Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” increased by 9.1%, mainly due to increases in the imports of “Cement” (+46.3%), “Manufactures of metal, n.e.s” (+21.8%) and “Iron and Steel” (+20.9%).
- “Chemicals and related products” increased by 2.9%, mainly due to increases in the imports of “Fertilisers” (+175.6%) and “Medicinal & pharmaceutical products” (+2.8%).
- “Machinery and transport equipment” increased by 2.4%, mainly due to increases in imports of “Road vehicles” (+19.0%), “Machinery specialized for particular industries” (+17.4%) and “General industrial machinery & equipment, n.e.s., & machine parts, n.e.s” (+15.4%).
- “Miscellaneous manufactured articles” increased by 1.4%, mainly due to an increase “Articles of apparel and clothing” (+15.2%).

#### **4.3 Imports by country of origin – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2019**

During the second quarter of 2019, our imports originated from four main countries, namely: India (18.7%), China (16.8%), South Africa (8.6%) and France (6.8%) (*Table 13*).

Among continents Asia was our main supplier with a share of Rs 26,574 million, representing 54.8% of total imports.

Compared to the corresponding period of 2018, total imports from India rose by 12.0%, while imports from France, South Africa and China fell by 24.3%, 12.5% and 0.6% respectively.

## **5. Trade with Member States of Regional Organisations – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2019**

During the second quarter of 2019, total exports to African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) States stood at Rs 4,226 million against imports of Rs 5,963 million (*Table 14*). The trade deficit with ACP countries worked out to Rs 1,737 million.

Exports to COMESA member states attained Rs 2,154 million while imports from these countries amounted to Rs 1,941 million, resulting in a trade surplus of Rs 213 million. Madagascar was the main buyer with a share of 57.4% followed by Kenya (21.5%). Our main suppliers were Seychelles (35.5%), Kenya (21.9%) and Egypt (16.8%) (*Table 15*).

Trade with SADC countries showed a deficit of Rs 1,871 million, resulting from imports of Rs 5,419 million against exports worth Rs 3,548 million. The main supplier was South Africa (76.8%) and Seychelles (12.7%) and our main buyers were South Africa (52.5%) and Madagascar (34.9%) (*Table 16*).

## **6. Trade in Freeport Zone – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2019**

During the second quarter of 2019, total imports of the Freeport Zone stood at Rs 2,213 million, lower by 22.4% compared to the corresponding quarter of 2018 – (*Table 12*). Re-exports were valued at Rs 2,691 million, representing a decrease of 2.1% compared to the corresponding period of 2018 (*Table 6*). The main items imported were “Food and live animals” and “Crude materials, inedible, except fuels”, while the main items re-exported were “Food and live animals” and “Miscellaneous manufactured articles”.

## 7. Forecast 2019

Based on recent past trends and information from various sources, the forecast of total exports for 2019 is maintained at around Rs 83,000 million and the forecasted total imports will be around Rs 207,800 million lower than the forecast figure of Rs 211,700, made in May 2019. To note that the new forecast includes one - off items such as tugs, linear accelerator and metro trains but excludes aircraft and wind turbines. The trade deficit for 2019 is forecasted to be around Rs 124,800 million, compared to Rs 112,068 million in 2018.

## Notes

### (1) Scope and coverage

**External merchandise trade statistics** are compiled according to the General Trade System as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

**Imports** include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses.

**Exports** cover:

- Domestic exports defined as goods of national origin, that is goods produced in the exporting country.
- Re-exports which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged and include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses.
- Ship's Stores and Bunkers (SSB) are included in total exports and are shown separately.

Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports.

### (2) Valuation

**Imports** are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis, whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free on Board) basis.

**Cost, Insurance and Freight** (C.I.F) value is the value of a country's imports of goods, including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft unless it is borne by the carrier.

**Free on Board** (F.O.B) value is the value of a country's exports of goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the customs frontier, export duties.

### (3) Classification of commodities

Commodities are coded according to the **Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS 2017)**. However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the **Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 4) (SITC Rev. 4)**. The HS and the SITC Rev. 4 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.
