# Labour force, Employment and Unemployment – First quarter 2024

#### Introduction

- 1. This issue of Economic and Social Indicators (ESI) presents a set of estimates of labour force, employment and unemployment for the first quarter of 2024, based on the results of the Continuous Multi-Purpose Household Survey (CMPHS) from January to March 2024. The estimates refer to the **Mauritian population aged 16 years and above**.
- 2. Annual estimates of labour force including foreign workers, derived after integrating data from the CMPHS with other data sources, are given at Annex 3.



# Labour market overview, first quarter 2024

- 3. Compared to the corresponding quarter of 2023, the labour force has increased by 4,700. Employment increased by 6,800 while unemployment decreased by 2,100. The number of persons outside labour force declined by 2,500 during the same period.
- 4. Compared to fourth quarter of 2023, labour force decreased by 200 with a fall in employment (-1,100) and a rise in unemployment (+900). The number of persons outside labour force increased by 1,200 during the same period.

- 5. The activity rate for first quarter 2024 increased by 0.3 percentage point to 58.6% compared to the corresponding quarter of 2023. The male activity rate decreased by 0.9 percentage point to 69.4% and the female activity rate increased by 1.5 percentage points to 48.5%.
- 6. Compared to fourth quarter 2023, the activity rate decreased by 0.1 percentage point. The male activity rate decreased by 0.6 percentage point and the female activity rate increased by 0.4 percentage point.

- 7. From first quarter 2023 to first quarter 2024, employment increased by 6,800 to 558,600; male employment decreased by 1,000 while female employment increased by 7,800.
- 8. Compared to fourth quarter 2023, employment decreased by 1,100; male employment decreased by 3,300 while female employment increased by 2,200.

# 1st Quarter 2023 to 1st Quarter 2024

- 9. From first quarter 2023 to first quarter 2024, the number of unemployed persons decreased by 2,100. Male unemployment decreased by 3,400 and female unemployment increased by 1,300.
- 10. The unemployment rate decreased by 0.4 percentage point from 6.7% in first quarter 2023 to 6.3% in first quarter 2024. Male unemployment rate decreased by 0.9 percentage point to reach 4.5% and female unemployment rate increased by 0.2 percentage point to 8.7%.

# 4th Quarter 2023 to 1st Quarter 2024

- 11. When compared to fourth quarter 2023, the total number of unemployed persons increased by 900, with increases of 800 among males and 100 among females.
- 12. Total unemployment rate increased by 0.2 percentage point from 6.1% in the fourth quarter of 2023 to 6.3% in the first quarter of 2024. Male unemployment rate increased by 0.3 percentage point from 4.2% to 4.5% and female unemployment rate remained unchanged at 8.7%.

- 13. At the first quarter of 2024, unemployed youth aged 16 to 24 years was estimated at 13,400 (6,200 males and 7,200 females) compared to 12,200 (5,900 males and 6,300 females) at the previous quarter and 13,800 (7,000 males and 6,800 females) at the first quarter of 2023.
- 14. The youth unemployment rate decreased in the first quarter of 2024 to 18.9% from 20.0% in the corresponding quarter of 2023. During the same period, the rate for young men decreased by 1.6 percentage points to 16.5%, and that for young women decreased by 0.7 percentage point to 21.6%.
- 15. Compared to fourth quarter 2023, the youth unemployment rate increased from 17.3% to 18.9%, with increases of 1.3 percentage points for young men and 1.9 percentage points for young women.

#### Characteristics of the unemployed as at first quarter 2024

- 16. The main characteristics of the unemployed as at first quarter 2024 were as follows:
  - (i) The 37,300 unemployed comprised 15,200 males (41%) and 22,100 females (59%).
  - (ii) Around 20,900 (56%) of the unemployed were single; males (75%) and females (43%).
  - (iii) Some 16,600 (45%) of the unemployed did not have the Cambridge School Certificate (SC) or equivalent and among them 3,200 had not even passed the Primary School Achievement Certificate (PSAC)/Certificate of Primary Education (CPE) or equivalent.
  - (iv) Around 30,000 (80%) had been looking for work for up to one year and the remaining 7,300 (20%) for more than one year.
  - (v) About 28,000 (75%) had working experience and 9,300 (25%) were looking for a first job.
  - (vi) Around 14,800 (40%) were registered at the Employment Service Information Centre.
  - (vii) There were 5,800 (16%) young persons aged 16 to 24 years, not yet married and looking for a first job. Some 2,000 possessed a qualification below SC.
  - (viii) Some 4,400 or 12% of the unemployed were heads of households.
  - (ix) Around 5,200 (14%) lived in households with no employed persons.

#### Seasonally adjusted unemployment rate

17. Seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the first quarter of 2024 was 6.0%, lower than the rates of 6.4% and 6.7% at the corresponding quarter of 2023 and at previous quarter respectively.

#### **Population outside Labour Force**

- 18. The number of persons aged 16 years and over, not forming part of the labour force (inactive population) was estimated at 420,400 at the first quarter of 2024 compared to 419,200 in the fourth quarter of 2023 and 422,900 in the first quarter of 2023.
- 19. The population outside labour force comprised 150,400 males and 270,000 females. Among males, around 54% were retired/old persons and 26% were students. Among females, 52% were homemakers and 25% were retired/old persons.

# **Reliability of the Labour Force estimates**

20. The estimates in this publication are based on the results of a sample survey and are thus subject to sample variability. Standard errors (SE) and coefficient of variation (CV) give an indication of this variability. The standard error of the estimates and the coefficient of variation (SE/estimate) are given in the table that follows.

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#### **NOTES**

#### Release of Labour Force data

Labour Force statistics are compiled and published in the "Economic and Social Indicators" in March, June, September and December according to an advance calendar posted on the website of Statistics Mauritius (https://statsmauritius.govmu.org). This issue provides data for the first quarter 2024 compared to the previous quarter and to the same quarter a year ago.

#### The CMPHS methodology

#### **Data collection**

Following the COVID-19 outbreak in March 2020, the face-to-face interviews of household members were replaced by telephone interviews. As from January 2023, face-to-face interviews have been resumed.

# Frequency of data collection

As from 2005, data collection is carried out monthly except in 2020 after the COVID-19 outbreak of in March 2020, it was carried out only in May, June, July, September, October and December 2020.

The reference week is the second week of the survey month so that quarterly estimates can be published within the quarter following the reference quarter, as required by the IMF Special Data Dissemination System (SDDS) to which the country has graduated on 28 February 2012.

#### Scope and coverage of collection

All private Mauritian households in the islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues are covered.

#### Sampling method

A stratified two-stage sampling design is used. At the first stage, Primary Sampling Units (PSUs) are selected in proportion to square root of the total number of households in the geographical district. Prior to 2005, the first stage stratification factors were urban, semi urban and rural geographical locations. As from 2005, the Relative Development Index (RDI) is used as the spatial stratification factor. This index is based on 12 variables encompassing housing and living conditions, literacy and education, and employment. As from 2023, in order to improve the variance estimates, RDI boundaries have been reviewed such that each geographical district has four even strata. For this exercise, the 2022 Housing and Population Census results have been used.

At the second stage, stratification criteria are community, household size and average monthly expenditure of the household. From 2005 to 2022, 10 households were selected from each selected PSU in Islands of Mauritius and Rodrigues. However, as from 2023 the number of households selected for each PSU in Island of Rodrigues have been increased from

10 to 15 while that of Island of Mauritius has remained the same. It is to be noted that the sample size has remained unchanged.

#### Sample size

From 1999 to 2003, around 6,500 households were covered each year. In 2004, the sample was increased to 8,640 so that reliable quarterly estimates of labour force, employment and unemployment could be worked out. As from 2005, the sample for the year has been further increased to 11,280. Furthermore, in order to measure quarterly changes, 50% of the households sampled in a quarter are re-interviewed in the following quarter; for example, 50% of the households sampled in the first quarter of 2005 have been re-interviewed in the second quarter of 2005.

#### Questionnaire

The CMPHS questionnaire comprises three modules: (a) a basic module common to all rounds of the survey covering the general characteristics of the population (b) a second module covering labour force with in-depth investigation and a core set of questions which are kept constant at all rounds of the survey and (c) a third module grouping other topics of interest but investigated in less details.

#### Estimation and reliability of results

Estimates worked out from a household survey data are inevitably subject to sampling variability since they are based on information collected from only a sample of households rather than from all households. Standard errors and coefficient of variation for the main labour force estimates are given in this report.

#### **Definitions**

#### Household

A household is defined as either a person living on his/her own or a group of two or more persons, who may or may not be related, but who live together and make common provision for food and other essentials for living.

#### **Employment**

Employed population consists of Mauritians aged 16 years and above who have worked for pay, profit or family gain for at least one hour during the reference week of a month. It includes those who are temporarily absent from work for reasons such as leave with pay, leave without pay and temporary disorganisation of work (bad weather, break down of equipment, lack of order, etc.).

It is to be noted that as from year 2007, labour force estimates are based on population aged 16 years and above, following the amendment to the Labour Act in December 2006 whereby the minimum legal working age is 16 years, and the subsequent recommendation by the ILO to be in line with the amended Labour Act.

#### Unemployment

Unemployed population comprises all Mauritians aged 16 years and above who are not working but who are looking for work and are available for work during the reference period.

#### Labour force

Labour force or active population is made up of employed and unemployed population.

#### **Unemployment rate**

Unemployment rate is the ratio (%) of unemployment to labour force.

#### **Outside the Labour Force (previously known as inactive population)**

Outside the labour force includes all Mauritians aged 16 years and above, not forming part of the labour force for reasons such as attendance at educational institutions, engagement in household duties, retirement, old age and infirmity/disablement.

#### **Activity rate**

Activity rate is the ratio (%) of labour force to population aged 16 years and above.

#### **Employer**

An employer is a person who operates his/her own business or trade and hires one or more employees

#### Own account worker

An Own account worker is a person who operates his/her own business or trade but does not hire employees. He/She may be working alone or with the help of contributing family workers.

## **Employee**

An Employee is a person who works for pay for someone else, even in a temporary capacity.

## **Apprentice**

An Apprentice is a person being trained for a job or trade and is paid.

# Contributing family worker

A Contributing family worker is a person who works without pay in an enterprise operated by a family member.

#### **Educational attainment**

*Primary*: comprises persons who have studied from Grade 1 (Standard 1) to Grade 6 (Standard 6) or to Primary School Achievement Certificate (PSAC)/Certificate of Primary Education (CPE) or equivalent.

Secondary: comprises persons who have studied from Grade 7 (Form 1) to Grade 13 (Form 6) or to Higher School Certificate (HSC) or equivalent.

*Tertiary*: comprises persons who in addition to their secondary educational certificates (SC and HSC or equivalent) also possess either a certificate/diploma (which is above the HSC but below a first degree) or a degree.

<sup>1.</sup> The above figures have been worked out in order to give a set of comparable labour force estimates obtained from different sources. Users are cautioned in the use of these figures given that there are differences related to the reference period, coverage and methodology. The different sources from which these estimates have been obtained are as follows:

i CMPHS for Mauritian labour force estimates which are subject to sampling variability as mentioned at Annex 1.

ii The Annual Survey of Employment and Earnings (SEE) in large establishments carried out in March of each year. Employment figures refer to jobs in large establishments employing 10 or more persons and include both Mauritians and foreign workers.

iii Employment in 'other than large' establishments has been estimated after reconciling data from CMPHS, SEE and administrative sources.
