1. INTRODUCTION

This issue of the Economic and Social Indicators presents data on International Travel and Tourism for the first semester of 2026. A brief on the compilation of these statistics is given at Annex I and a glossary of terms at Annex II.

2. INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

2.1 Arrivals in 1st Semester 2026

Compared to 1st Semester 2025:

- (i) total passenger arrivals decreased by 0.9% from 954,015 to 945,223;
- (ii) total tourist arrivals increased by 1.5% from 658,909 to 668,471; those arriving by air increased by 0.2% from 643,930 to 645,140 and those arriving by sea increased by 55.8% from 14,979 to 23,331 (Table 6b). Among those arriving by sea, 20,645 were cruise tourists compared to 12,359, representing an increase of 67.0%.
- (iii) the number of excursionists (arriving and leaving on the same day) decreased by 44.7% from 36,474 to 20,176.

In the first semester of 2026, 24 cruise ships arrived in the country and carried some 47,197 cruise travellers comprising 20,645 tourists, 12,018 excursionists, 117 Mauritian residents and 14,417 crew members.

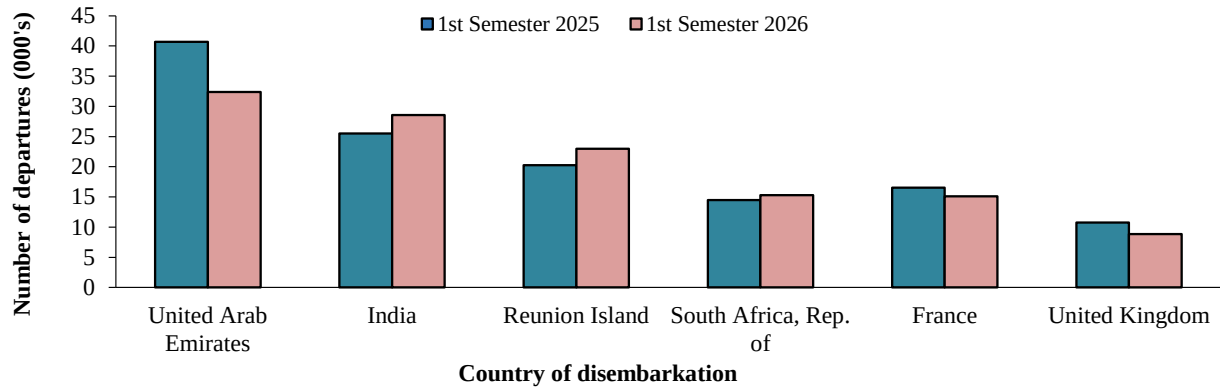
2.2 Departures in 1st Semester 2026

Compared to 1st Semester 2025:

- (i) total passenger departures decreased by 0.6% from 977,378 to 971,886 and
- (ii) departures of Mauritian residents decreased by 3.1% from 170,507 to 165,211 (Table 2).

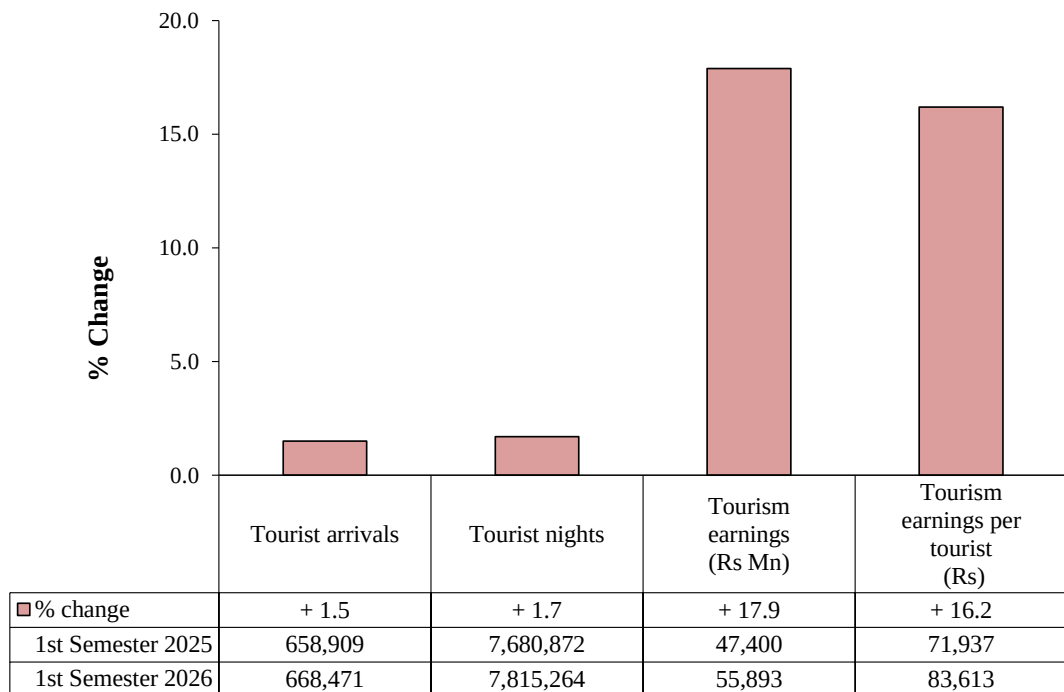
Comparative figures for the first semesters of 2025 and 2026 for Mauritian departures by main country of disembarkation are given in Figure 1 and Table 2. In the first semester of 2026, the main countries of disembarkation (country of final destination or transit country) for Mauritian residents were United Arab Emirates (32,408 or 19.6%), India (28,576 or 17.3%), Reunion Island (22,962 or 13.9%), Republic of South Africa (15,304 or 9.3%), France (15,098 or 9.1%) and United Kingdom (8,833 or 5.3%).

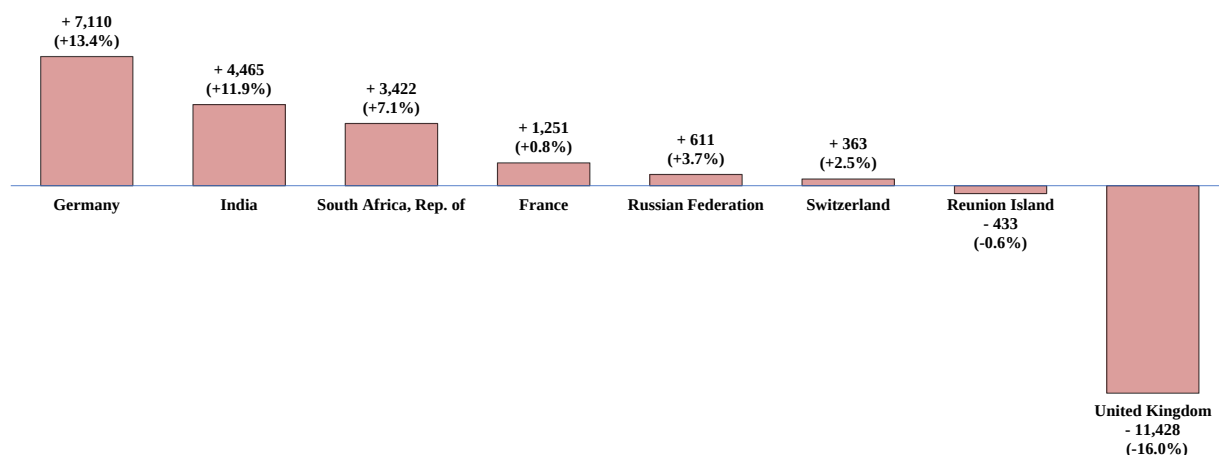
Figure 2 – Main tourism indicators, 1st Semester, 2025 and 2026



3.1 Tourist arrivals in 1st Semester 2026

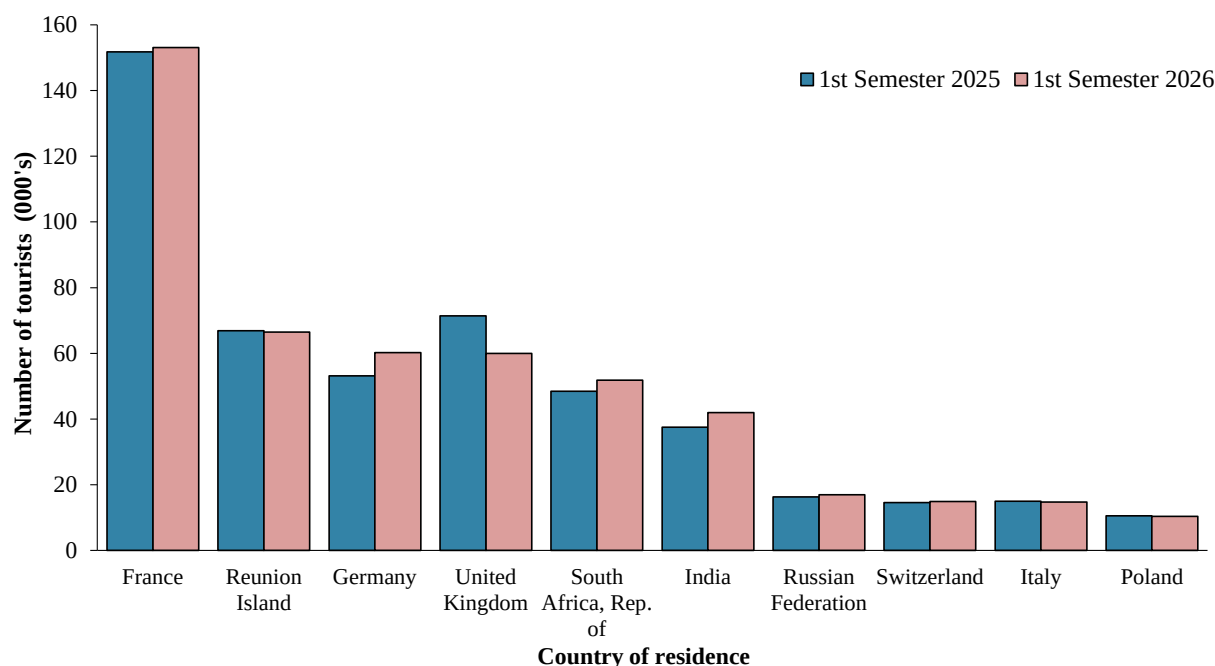
Compared to the first semester of 2025, tourist arrivals increased by 9,562 (+1.5%) to reach 668,471 in first semester 2026 as a result of main changes in tourist arrivals from selected markets as shown in Figure 3.

Figure 3 – Main changes in tourist arrivals by selected country of residence, 1st Semester 2026 compared to 1st Semester 2025



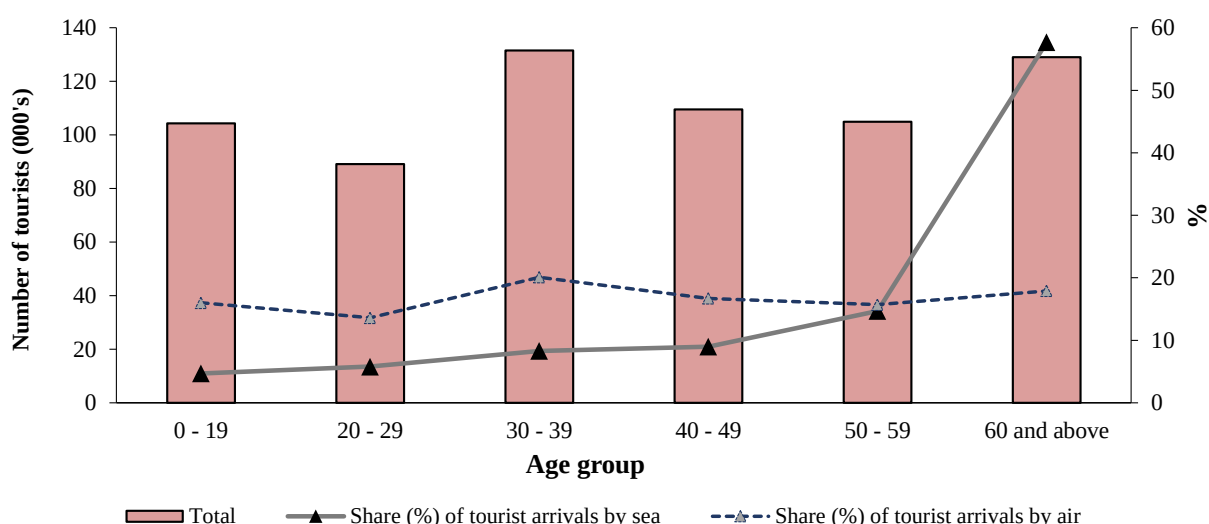
Compared to the first semester of 2025, tourist arrivals from France, our top tourist generating country, increased by 0.8% (or + 1,251) from 151,797 to 153,048. Among the main markets, increases were observed for Germany (+7,110 or +13.4%), India (+4,465 or +11.9%), Republic of South Africa (+3,422 or +7.1%), Russian Federation (+611 or +3.7%) and Switzerland (+363 or +2.5%) while decreases were observed in the other selected markets as follows: Reunion Island (-433 or -0.6%) and United Kingdom (-11,428 or -16.0%).

3.2 Tourist arrivals by age group

During the period under review, the number of tourists aged 60 years and above was 129,056 representing 19.3% of tourist arrivals. Among those who arrived by sea, the proportion was much higher at 57.7% (Figure 5 and Table 6b).

Figure 5 - Tourist arrivals by age group, 1st Semester 2026

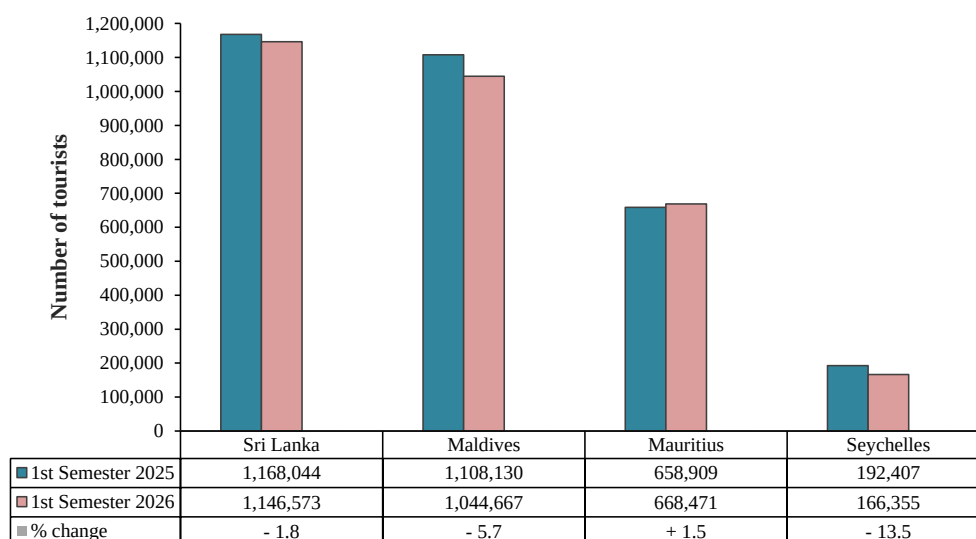
3.3 Tourist arrivals by air and by main port of last embarkation for selected markets

From Table 7, it is observed that during the first semester of 2026, tourists from United Kingdom (62.0%), Austria (58.2%), France (55.8%), Germany (49.2%), Italy (39.3%) and Switzerland (38.3%) arrived mainly by direct flights from their own country of residence. Tourists from Russian Federation and Netherlands travelled mainly through United Arab Emirates which was the most used transiting port. For the period under review, the proportion of tourists from Russian Federation and Netherlands who travelled to Mauritius through United Arab Emirates were 70.7% and 26.5% respectively.

3.4 Tourist arrivals - Selected tourist destinations in the Indian Ocean region

Compared to the first semester of 2025, an increase in tourist arrivals was observed for Mauritius (from 658,909 to 668,471 or +1.5%), while the other tourist destinations in the Indian Ocean region registered declines during the first semester of 2026:

Sri Lanka (from 1,168,044 to 1,146,573 or -1.8%), Maldives (from 1,108,130 to 1,044,667 or -5.7%) and Seychelles (from 192,407 to 166,355 or -13.5%).

3.5 Tourist Nights

Compared to 1st Semester 2025:

- the number of nights spent by tourists who departed during the first semester of 2026 increased by 1.7% from 7,680,872 to 7,815,264; and
- the average length of stay decreased from 11.3 to 11.2 nights (Table 8).

3.6 Accommodation

(i) Licensed hotels in the Island of Mauritius

As at end of June 2026, there were 111 licensed hotels of which one was temporarily closed and four were closed due to renovation works. The total room capacity of the 106 hotels in operation was 13,477 with 30,179 bed places (Table 9).

During the 1st Semester 2026,

- the room occupancy rate of all licensed hotels in operation averaged 69%, lower compared to 70% in first semester 2025; and
- the bed occupancy rate was 62%, lower compared to 63% in first semester 2025 (Table 10).

(ii) 'Large' hotels in the Island of Mauritius

At the end of June 2026, there were 59 'large' hotels (i.e. well-established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms) in operation. The total room capacity of these 59 'large' hotels was 10,809 with 24,492 bed places. These 'large' hotels represent 56% of all licensed hotels in operation but comprise 80% of total room capacity and 81% of total bed places (Table 9).

During the 1st Semester 2026,

- the room occupancy rate of 'large' hotels was 70%, lower than the 72% registered in first semester 2025; and
- the bed occupancy rate was 64% lower than the 66% recorded in first semester 2025 (Table 10).

3.7 Employment

Employment data for the tourism sector obtained from the Survey of Employment and Earnings, relate to employment in establishments with 10 or more workers in food service, hotels and travel and other services. Latest available data indicate that employment in these establishments increased by 2.2% from 28,217 in March 2024 to 28,834 in March 2025 (Table 11).

4. Survey of Inbound Tourism

The primary objective of the survey is to gather information on tourists visiting Mauritius, mainly on their spending pattern, purpose, frequency of visits, place of stay and rating of the Mauritian destination. During the survey, data was collected from departing tourists at Sir Seewoosagur Ramgoolam International Airport.

4.1 Nearly seven out of 10 tourists preferred to stay in hotels than in non-hotel accommodations

In 2025, 67.0% of tourists preferred to stay in hotels rather than in non-hotel accommodations compared to 75.4% of tourists who stayed in hotels in 2024. Among the non-hotel accommodations, 19.6% of tourists stayed with friends and/or relatives, 10.9% in tourist residence and some 2.0% in guest house (Table 12).

4.2 Tourists travelling on package tour

In 2025, 38.7% of tourists travelled on package tour, compared to 59.5% in 2024, indicating a decline in the proportion of tourists opting for organised travel arrangements. Among tourists staying in hotels in 2025, 56.8% of them travelled on package tour, compared to 77.0% in 2024 (Table 13).

4.3 Average expenditure per tourist increased

In 2025, the average expenditure per tourist amounted to Rs 74,200, that is around Rs 3,200 higher compared to Rs 71,000 in 2024. On average, in 2025, a European tourist spent Rs 76,500, higher than the figure of Rs 74,700 in 2024. Tourists from France, our leading market spent an average of Rs 65,100 per person, higher compared to Rs 63,800 in 2024 (Table 14).

Average expenditure for those staying in hotels was Rs 93,900 in 2025, higher compared to Rs 81,300 in 2024. Those staying in non-hotel accommodations spent on average Rs 34,300 in 2025 compared to Rs 39,600 in 2024 (Table 13).

The average expenditure per tourist per night for 2025 amounted to Rs 6,600, higher than the figure of Rs 6,200 in 2024 (Table 14).

A tourist staying in hotels spent on average Rs 11,700 per night in 2025 which was more than sixfold the amount spent by a tourist staying in non-hotel accommodations (Rs 1,900 per night). Corresponding figures for 2024 were Rs 9,000 for hotels and Rs 2,100 for non-hotel accommodations (Table 13).

COMPILATION OF PASSENGER TRAFFIC STATISTICS

Sources of data

The main source of data for the compilation of passenger traffic statistics is the Passport and Immigration Office, which maintains a database of all travellers entering and leaving the country. The data are collected from the passport of travellers, disembarkation cards filled in by non-residents and questions put to non-residents entering the country. At the end of every month, the electronic database of passenger traffic for that particular month is downloaded and supplied to the statistics unit of the Ministry of Tourism within ten days. Additional data on cruises are obtained from the Mauritius Ports Authority.

Tourism earnings

The Bank of Mauritius (BoM) is responsible for the estimation of tourism earnings based on monthly statements of Inward and Outward Remittances of Commercial Banks. As from 2015, BoM is also including data culled from Money changers and Foreign exchange dealers.

Monthly Occupancy Rates

Survey questionnaires are emailed to all hotels at the end of every month to collect data on room/bed nights available and rented during the month for the calculation of room and bed occupancy rates. Non-responses are contacted by phone.

Short-term projections of tourist arrivals

A Tourism Statistics Committee grouping various stakeholders of the tourism industry meet regularly under the chairmanship of Statistics Mauritius to discuss performance of the tourism sector and to provide information for short-term forecast of tourist arrivals.

The regular publications of the unit are:

- (i) Monthly tourist arrivals uploaded on Statistics Mauritius website
- (ii) Fortnightly tourist arrivals uploaded on Statistics Mauritius website

- (v) Yearly Handbook of statistical data on tourism
- (vi) Report of the Survey of Inbound Tourism

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

1. Tourist

A tourist is defined as a non-resident staying overnight but less than a year, and who has no employer-employee relationship with a resident.

2. Transit

A transit passenger is one who stops over in the country for flight connections to other destinations. There are two types of transit passengers:

Type I: Passengers who do not leave the transit area of the airport or the harbour.

Type II: Passengers who do leave the airport or harbour and stay in the country overnight but only for flight connection purposes.

Only Type II transit passengers, as defined above, are included in the definition of "Tourists".

3. Excursionist or same-day Visitor

Excursionists are non-resident visitors, other than those who do not leave the airport, who depart on the same day they arrived.

4. Tourist nights

"Tourist nights" for year Y refer to nights spent by tourists who departed in year Y.

5. Large hotels

Large hotels are well established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms.

6. Occupancy rate

The room/bed occupancy rate is the ratio of room/bed nights rented to the total number of room/bed nights available.
