

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR MAY 2026

(Base: January – December 2023 = 100)

1. The **Consumer Price Index (CPI)** increased by +0.9 point or 0.8 % from 111.0 in April 2026 to 111.9 in May 2026. The main contributors to the change in the index between April 2026 and May 2026 were:

2. **Year-on-year (Y-o-y)** inflation worked out to 4.3% in May 2026, compared to 4.2% in May 2025. **Headline** inflation for the 12-months ending May 2026 worked out to 4.2%, compared to 2.7% for the 12-months ending May 2025.
3. **Y-o-y CORE1 inflation** stood at 6.6% in May 2026, compared to 3.0% in May 2025 while, **y-o-y CORE2 inflation** worked out to 6.1% in May 2026, compared to 5.3% in May 2025.
4. **CORE1 inflation for the 12-months ending May 2026** stood at 4.8%, compared to 2.5% in May 2025. Similarly, **CORE2 inflation for the 12-months ending May 2026** worked out to 6.4%, compared to 4.5% in May 2025.

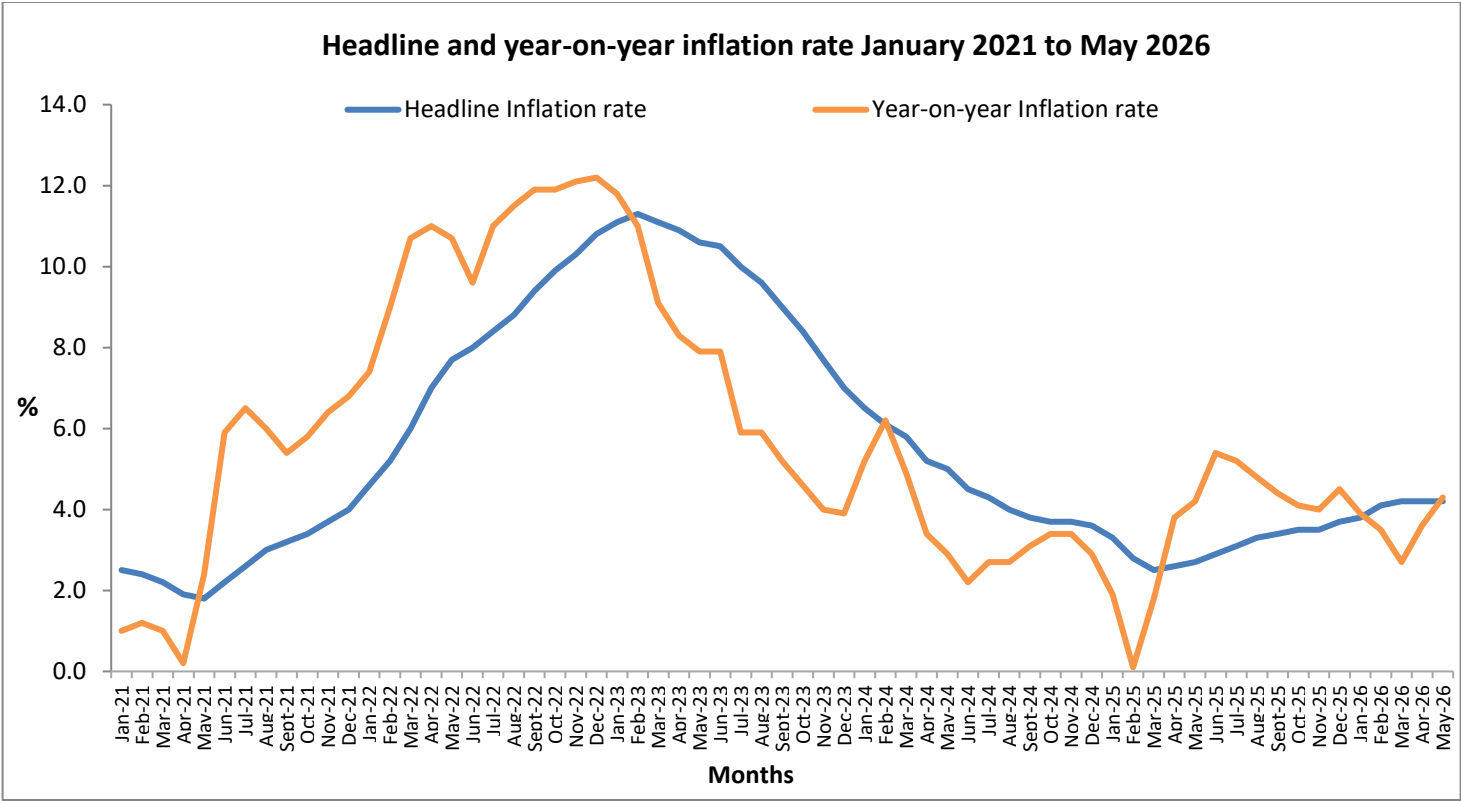

Notes:

1. The headline inflation rate is calculated by using the annual average method, that is, by comparing the average level of prices during a twelve-months period with the average level during the corresponding previous twelve-months period.
2. The year-on-year inflation rate is calculated as the percentage change in the CPI for a given month with respect to the CPI for the corresponding month of the previous year.
3. CORE1 excludes food, beverages and tobacco components and mortgage interest on housing loan from headline inflation.
4. CORE2 excludes food, beverages and tobacco, mortgage interest on housing loan, electricity, gas, other fuels and items whose prices are controlled from headline inflation.
