

SECTION 8 - EMPLOYMENT AND EARNINGS

1. Tables 8.1 - 8.10 which present figures of employment and earnings are derived from the Bi-annual Survey of Employment and Earnings taken each year in March and September. The figures, therefore, relate to large establishments only, defined as :

- (a) Agricultural establishments comprising :
  - (i) Sugar cane plantations where 10 hectares or more were harvested;
  - (ii) Tea plantations of 2 hectares or more were harvested;
  - (iii) All 'flue-cured' tobacco establishments, irrespective of acreage;
  - (iv) Other agricultural establishments employing at least 10 persons on the day of the survey;
- (b) Non-agricultural establishments employing at least 10 persons on the day of the survey. It is to be noted that 'outdoor' workers are excluded; these are piece-workers who although employed by an establishment are working in their own homes.
- (c) All Central and Local government departments.

As from the September 1989 round of the Bi-annual Survey of Employment and Earnings, collection of data has been organized to cover five separate categories of employees according to whether their remuneration is based exclusively on a

- (i) Monthly rate of pay
- (ii) Daily rate of pay
- (iii) Piece rate of pay
- (iv) Hourly rate of pay
- (v) Other rate of pay

It has been noted that the "Manufacturing" sector employs the majority of employees on piece rates of pay as well as those on hourly rates of pay. The respective figures as at September 1989 were about 23,000 and 15,000.

The average daily earnings of employees on piece rates of pay is around Rs 69.00 and the average hourly earnings of employees on hourly rates of pay is around Rs 6.30.

2. (a) Tables 8.5 - 8.10 show changes in average earnings for broad sectors.

Tables 8.11 - 8.15 show changes in wage or salary rates for specific occupations.

(b) Apart from increase in salaries and wages, fluctuations in earnings may be due to :

- (i) changes of different magnitude in the various categories of employees e.g. a large intake of employees at the lower end of the wage scale (as occurs when a new factory starts operation) has the effect of lowering the average earnings. On the other hand, a large intake of professionals by, say, an architectural firm can cause a sudden jump in the average monthly earnings.
- (ii) changes in overtime, regular bonuses and commissions.
