Basic data for this publication have been obtained from the bills of entry of the Customs and Excise Department.

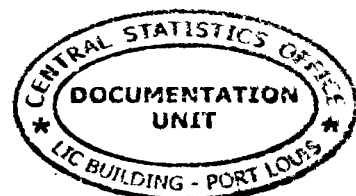
Some of the figures in this publication are provisional and are liable to revision in future.

## External Trade - Third Quarter 1985

### Introduction

#### 1. Total Trade

The total value of external trade of the country during the third quarter of 1985 amounted to Rs 4,068 million, as against Rs 3,384 million during the previous quarter, representing an increase of Rs 684 million or 20 % in value. In terms of volume, however, the growth is about 17%.

When compared with the corresponding quarter of 1984, the increase in value is nearly 30%, that is a growth of about 20% in real terms.

A comparison of the figures for the first three quarters of 1985 with those of 1984 shows a very substantial increase of Rs 2,240 million in the total value of trade between the two periods which in volume terms represents an increase of around 14%.

#### 2. Balance of Visible Trade

The value of exports attained Rs 1,923 million and that of imports reached Rs 2,145 million in the third quarter of 1985. Consequently, the trade deficit was Rs 222 million. For the previous quarter, the deficit was Rs 572 million. The third quarter's deficit has been much lower than that of the second quarter mainly due to higher shipments of sugar and EPZ goods. However, for the corresponding quarter of the previous year the deficit was Rs 134 million.

The deficit in the external trade for the first nine months of 1985 was Rs 1,077 million compared with Rs 957 million for the corresponding period last year.

#### 3. Price Indices and Terms of Trade

During the third quarter of 1985, the overall prices of exported goods rose by around 5%, whilst those of imported goods remained stationary with respect to the second quarter. As a result, the terms of trade of the country have improved by 6 points moving from 107 (1982 = 100) during the second quarter to 113 during the third quarter of 1985.

#### 4. Exports

##### 4.1 Exports performance - third quarter 1985

Exports during the third quarter of 1985 attained the level of Rs 1,923 million compared with Rs 1,406 million the previous quarter, which in volume terms represents a substantial increase of 30%. However, compared with figures for the corresponding period of the year 1984, the real increase was around 18 %. 140 thousand metric tons of sugar were shipped for a value of Rs 573 million compared with 146 thousand metric tons valued at Rs 740 million exported during the corresponding quarter of 1984. Earnings from the exports of EPZ goods amounted to Rs 978 million, those from tea, Rs 13 million and from molasses Rs 28 million.

The preferential Tariff Countries have absorbed 99% of the country's total exports, 82% of total exports were shipped to the EEC Countries and 13% to the United States of America. The total value of goods exported to the EEC Countries amounted to Rs 1,511 million of which Rs 905 million were shipped to the United Kingdom and Rs 280 million to France. The United States of America continued to be also an important market for Mauritian products with the total exports to this country amounting to Rs 238 million.

#### 4.2 Exports performance - January - September 1985

The total value of goods exported during the period January - September 1985 amounted to Rs 4,809 million, representing a marked increase of Rs 1,060 million over the corresponding exports of 1984.

During the first nine months of 1985, 369 thousand metric tons of sugar were exported for a value of Rs 1,913 million compared with 357 thousand metric tons valued at Rs 1,680 million for the corresponding period of 1984. Export earnings from the EPZ sector attained Rs 2,278 million and those from tea, Rs 150 million.

The country exported Rs 4,471 million worth of goods to the Preferential Tariff Countries of which the majority, Rs 3,583 million went to the EEC Countries with the United Kingdom Rs 2,011 million and France Rs 911 million. The United States of America bought Rs 694 million worth of goods.

#### 5. Imports

##### 5.1 Imports - third quarter 1985

The import bill of the Country during the third quarter of 1985 amounted to Rs 2,145 million compared to Rs 1,978 million for the previous quarter. As there was no change in the level of prices of imported goods between the second and the third quarters, the increase in volume was around 9%.

Compared with data relating to the corresponding quarter of 1984, the percentage increase in value terms works out to about 51% which is accounted for by a 21% rise in the volume of imports and a 9% rise in the imports price.

Some of the important groups of commodities that have weighed heavily in the import bill during the third quarter of 1985 were:

EPZ raw materials and equipment	- Rs 659 Mn
Food	- Rs 346 Mn
Refined petroleum products	- Rs 243 Mn

The above mentioned groups of commodities have accounted for nearly 60% of the total value of imports.



Rs 1,558 million (73%) worth of imports to the country were supplied by the Preferential Tariff Countries and the remaining 27% (Rs 587 Mn) by the General Tariff Countries. The Country has imported for a value of Rs 733 million (34%) from the EEC Countries, with Rs 293 million from France and Rs 177 million from the United Kingdom. Other important sources of supply were the Gulf Countries (Rs 231 Mn), the Republic of South Africa (Rs 199 Mn) and Japan (Rs 113 Mn).

## 5.2 Imports - January - September 1985

From January to September 1985, the total value of imports has increased by Rs 1,180 million with respect to the corresponding period of the previous year to reach Rs 5,886 million. The growth in volume over these two periods was about 13%.

Main increases were registered in the following broad groups of commodities: textile fibres, yarn and fabrics (+ Rs 399 Mn), machinery (+ Rs 166 Mn) and refined petroleum products (+ Rs 146 Mn).

The country has imported for a value of Rs 1,904 million (32%) of its total imports from the EEC Countries with Rs 747 million from France and Rs 479 million from the United Kingdom. Other suppliers were the Republic of South Africa (Rs 527 Mn), Kuwait (Rs 439 Mn), Bahrain (Rs 345 Mn) and Japan (Rs 330 Mn).

6. The performance of the EPZ Sector

Exports by the Export Enterprise Certificate Industries (EPZ) have been continuously increasing each quarter from Rs 505 million in the first, Rs 795 million in the second to attain the level of Rs 978 million during the third quarter of 1985. EPZ exports during the third quarter of 1984 amounted to Rs 603 million. During the first nine months of 1985, EPZ exports have therefore amounted to Rs 2,278 million.

During the third quarter of 1985, the value of exports of textile and clothing amounted to Rs 810 million (83% of total EPZ exports) and for the first three quarters the corresponding figure is Rs 1,326 million (80%).

The value of imports of the EPZ industries reached Rs 659 million during the third quarter of 1985 compared with Rs 672 million during the previous quarter of this year. From January to September 1985, EPZ enterprises have imported for a value of Rs 1,838 million.

The net exports which were negligible during the first quarter and Rs 122 million during the second quarter attained Rs 320 million during the third quarter of 1985.

7. Forecast of Exports and Imports - Year 1985

From an analysis of past figures and taking into consideration the trends observed lately, it is estimated that the value of exports will attain Rs 7,000 million and that of imports Rs 8,100 million for the year 1985. As a result, the deficit in the external trade will remain at about the same level as last year's, i.e. at around Rs 1,000 million.

As regards the terms of trade it is expected that they will pick up sufficiently this year to recover from the slight fall registered in 1984. They will reach 110 (1982 = 100) in 1985 as compared with 108 in 1984 and 109 in 1983.
