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## Export Processing Zone (EPZ) - 1985

### 1. Introduction

This issue contains the latest information on employment in the EPZ Sector as at the end of December 1985 and gives also latest estimates of its exports and imports.

### 2. Employment

During the fourth quarter of 1985, 20 additional enterprises started operation creating about 3,200 additional jobs of which 2,150 were occupied by male and 1,050 by female workers. A fact worthy of note during this quarter is that the creation of employment in this sector has been for the first time more important among male than among female workers.

As at the end of December 1985, 277 enterprises were operating in the EPZ Sector with a workforce of some 53,500 employees as compared with 195 enterprises and 37,500 employees a year ago.

The additional 16,000 jobs, which have been filled by about 6,800 male and 9,200 female workers, were the result of the creation of about 12,000 jobs through the expansion of existing enterprises and of about 6,000 jobs through the opening of new enterprises. On the other hand, 2,000 jobs were lost through contraction (1,600) and closing down (400) of existing enterprises.

There has been a marked progression in the employment of male workers in the EPZ industries during the year 1985. The ratio of female employment to male employment which was almost 4 to 1 a year ago in this sector has now fallen to about 2.5 to 1 at the end of 1985.

The manufacture of wearing apparel which provides for more than 85% of employment in the EPZ Sector was almost the only avenue for new opportunities for employment in that sector during 1985. In fact 15,000 out of the 16,000 jobs created were found in this sub-sector.

More detailed information on employment in the EPZ industries appears in tables 1 to 7.

### 3. Exports and Imports

Figures of exports and imports for December 1985 are not yet ready. However, for October and November, exports of the EPZ industries have amounted to Rs 456 million and Rs 263 million respectively. For the first eleven months of 1985, exports of the EPZ industries have therefore reached Rs 3,000 million. It is estimated that during December exports may have been of the order of Rs 250 million, so that EPZ exports could have attained Rs 3,250 million during 1985.

As regards/

As regards imports of EPZ industries, they were Rs 205 million and Rs 234 million in October and November respectively. The EPZ import bill for the first eleven months of 1985 was therefore Rs 2,275 million. There are indications that imports during December may have reached Rs 225 million, in which case the EPZ industries have imported about Rs 2,500 million during 1985.

The detailed results of imports and exports of EPZ enterprises will appear in a subsequent issue of the "Economic Indicators".
