

EXPORT PROCESSING ZONE (EPZ) - 1st QUARTER 1986

1. Introduction

This issue contains data on employment in the EPZ Sector as at 31st March 1986 and also gives an estimate of EPZ exports and imports during the first three months of the year.

2. Employment

The EPZ industries have registered a remarkable growth in employment during the first three months of this year. There were 28 additional enterprises operating; 136 enterprises recruited additional workers resulting in the creation of 7,740 jobs of which 3,550 were held by male workers.

As at 31st March 1986, there were 318 enterprises operating in the EPZ sector and the workforce reached 61,700 of which 70% (around 43,250) were female workers and 30% (18,450), male workers.

An analysis of the table on employment evolution (table 2) shows that 9,600 jobs have been created during the period January - March 1986 of which 6,600 were through the expansion of existing enterprises and 3,000 through the opening of new enterprises. However, as there were 1,860 jobs lost: 1,700 through contraction and 160 through closing down of enterprises, the net employment created stood at 7,740.

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Virtually all/additional jobs were created in the wearing apparel sector: 2,700 in manufacture of pullovers and about 5,000 in the manufacture of made-up garments.

It is worth noting that the EPZ industries have contributed towards the creation of around 18,500 jobs during the last twelve months (see table 4). Employment creation during the first quarter of 1986 has almost doubled last year's performance, when it was on average around 4,600 each quarter.

3. Exports and Imports

Definite figures on exports and imports of the EPZ industries during the period January to March 1986 have not yet been obtained. However, preliminary estimates indicate that goods worth of Rs 925 million have been exported and imports of raw materials and equipment were around Rs 1,000 million. Detailed data on imports and exports in the EPZ sector will become available next month.
