1. Introduction

This issue presents data on employment in the EPZ Sector as at end of September 1987. It also gives an estimate of imports and exports of the EPZ enterprises during the first nine months of the years.

2. Employment as at 24th September 1987

As at 24th September 1987, there were 500 enterprises operating in the EPZ Sector with a workforce of some 85,700 employees of whom nearly two thirds (55,100) were female workers.

The manufacture of wearing apparel which comprises of 340 enterprises employing around 75,400 workers (25,100 male and 50,300 female workers) remained the major economic activity in the EPZ Sector.

Comparative figures on employment show that the high rate of employment creation of last year has not been maintained. Net employment creation during the last twelve months stood around 15,200 compared to 20,500 during the corresponding period a year ago. Also during the first nine months of the year, the EPZ enterprises have recruited a total of 11,700 additional workers compared to 16,500 during the corresponding period last year.

3. Employment during 3rd Quarter 1987

During the third quarter of 1987, EPZ enterprises recruited some 3,000 additional workers, as compared to the 4,700, the previous quarter and about 4,500 the corresponding quarter of last year.

Details of the evolution during the third quarter of 1987 indicate the setting up of 33 new enterprises, contributing to the creation of 1,150 jobs. Expansion of activities in 56 existing ones brought in a further 5,450, thus bringing total employment creation to 6,600. However, this was partly offset by contractions in a few other firms to the tune of 3,600, as workers continued to move from one to another, most probably after acquiring experience. In fact, an average of 2,750 workers have changed jobs each quarter this year compared to 1,830 last year.

The effective increase in recruitment was thus 3,000 for the quarter, most of which went, as in the past, to the manufacture of wearing apparel. It should be pointed out, however, that the trend towards more male employment continued with a preponderance of males - 83% of the new recruits this quarter.

4. Exports and Imports

Definite trade figures for the first nine months are not yet available but preliminary estimates of EPZ imports and exports indicate that slightly over Rs 3,500 million worth of inputs and raw materials and machinery were imported while export proceeds reached about Rs 4,800 million. On this trend it is expected that gross exports for the year may exceed Rs 6,500 Mn.
