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EXPORT PROCESSING ZONE - 4TH QUARTER AND YEAR 1988

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The Export Processing Zone - 4th Quarter and Year 1988

1. Introduction

This issue contains the latest available data on employment in the EPZ Sector as at December 1988. A few additional tables analysing, on a sectoral basis, new enterprises set up as well as those closed down and a geographical distribution of EPZ units of production are given for the first time. These data will no doubt serve as key indicators to gauge the performance of this vital sector of the economy.

2. Employment evolution during the 4th quarter 1988

During the 4th quarter, 24 firms started operation whilst 19 closed down bringing the total number of enterprises operating at December to 591. The level of employment in the EPZ Sector stood at 89,100 compared to 90,700 in September and 87,900 in December 1987. The last quarter therefore witnessed the loss of some 1,700 workers which compares with a reduction of 900 during the previous quarter and an increase of 2,200 during the corresponding quarter of 1987.

Closures of firms and a slow down in the rate of recruitment of additional workers by existing enterprises were the determinant factors that affected employment growth during the last quarter. Total employment created was 4,600: 1,500 by the 24 new enterprises and 3,100 by existing enterprises. But, total employment loss was around 6,300 : 3,700 lost following the closures of 19 enterprises, 5 of which owned by a group laid off some 2,800 workers, and 2,600 reductions in personnel reported by existing firms. Net employment creation therefore turned out to be negative i.e. a loss of 1,700. Female employment fell by 2,200 whilst male employment increased by 500. The analysis of the net change in employment given in table 5, shows that the pullover sector suffered the loss of some 2,300 workers whilst the other sectors with the exception of 'other garments' (+ 500) and 'leather products' (+ 220) have registered modest increases. Also out of 24 new enterprises, 5 were engaged in the non-textile sector namely leather, electronic, chemicals and electric bulb production - an indication of diversification in the sector.

3. Employment as at December 1988

As at December 1988, there were 591 enterprises operating with a workforce of some 89,100 workers of whom nearly two thirds or 57,500, were female and 37,600 male. Included in this figure, are 550 expatriates and 2,200 outworkers. During the year 1988, only 1,200 additional jobs were created compared to 14,000 last year and 20,000 in 1986. This stagnation in the rate of employment creation is clearly indicated in the line graph on employment evolution given in Fig. A.

It is also noted that of the 1,200 additional jobs created, 1,000 were held by female workers. During the year, 95 new enterprises were set up which contributed to the creation of over 5,000 jobs. On the other hand, 35 enterprises closed down bringing about the loss of some 5,000 jobs. Existing enterprises which were expanding their activities recruited some 10,300 additional workers whilst others have reported reduction in personnel, to the tune of some 9,200, yielding a net employment creation of only 1,200.

The analysis of net change in employment between December 1987 and December 1988 given in table 4 clearly confirms the high mobility of workers among firms in the EPZ Sector.

It is recalled that the EPZ enterprises have contributed to the creation of around 60,000 jobs during the past 5 years and it is possible that it has now reached a point of stabilization with a workforce that will vary around the 90,000 mark.

4. Distribution of enterprises by product group

The textile industries comprised 435 enterprises and a workforce of some 81,000 workers representing slightly over 90% of total EPZ employment. The remaining 156 enterprises were engaged in the non-textile sector as follows: 28 in the flower sector, 12 in leather products and footwear, 15 in wood and paper, 14 in jewellery and precious stones and 10 in optical goods and watches.

5. Distribution of enterprises by size of employment

The distribution of enterprises by size of employment given in table 7 shows that among the 591 enterprises, 323 or 55% may be considered as small with each a personnel of less than 50 workers. This category employs only 7% of the EPZ workforce. On the other hand, there are 44 large enterprises each employing more than 500 workers but it must be pointed out that these employ nearly 55% of the total workforce.

6. Distribution of EPZ establishments by locality

Table 14 shows the distribution of the EPZ production units (establishments) by district and main locality. It is noted that the sector comprised 591 enterprises but the actual number of units of production was 679 i.e. it included 88 branches.

Plaines Wilhems had the greatest concentration with 272 establishments representing 40% of the total.

There were 100 establishments located in Port Louis so that the urban areas, with 372 establishments accounted for 55% of the total.

The other districts had each some 50 establishments with the exception of Savanne, 29 and Black River 20.

7. Exports and Imports


Provisional trade data shows that during the year 1988, the EPZ enterprises have exported around Rs 8,200 million worth of goods, compared to Rs 6,700 million last year. Imports of raw materials and equipment goods amounted to around Rs 5,900 million, resulting in net export earnings of Rs 2,300 millions.

B: EXPORTS AND IMPORTS OF EPZ ENTERPRISES


