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Export Processing Zone - 1st Quarter 1989

1. Introduction

This issue presents data on employment in the EPZ Sector as at end of March 1989. It also gives an estimate of imports and exports of the EPZ enterprises during the first three months of the year.

2. Employment evolution during 1st quarter 1989

During the 1st quarter 1989, 28 new firms started operation, 7 closed down and 39 ceased operation on a temporary basis bringing the total number of enterprises to 573 and 200 additional workers were recruited so that the EPZ workforce stood at 89,300, i.e. at almost the same level as that of December 1988.

A detailed analysis of the survey data shows that the 28 new firms recruited some 1,100 workers whilst existing firms expanded their workforce by some 6,000, bringing total employment creation to 7,100. During the same period, 39 firms which were encountering difficulties laid off some 1,200 workers whilst 7 others closed down accounting for the loss of around 2,000 jobs. Total employment loss therefore reached around 6,900. Consequently, net change in employment during the 1st quarter was positive, i.e. an increase of some 200 workers.

It is worth pointing out that net employment creation would have been around 800, had it not been for the reduction of some 600 in the category of 'outworkers', i.e. persons working at home on materials supplied by firms.

Also as from this year, data are being compiled in respect of enterprises classified as 'dormant' and are excluded from the total (Table 3 refers).

3. Employment as at March 1989

As at March 1989, there were 573 active EPZ enterprises operating in the EPZ Sector with a workforce of some 89,000 employees of whom two thirds were female, i.e. 59,000 and 30,000 male.

The wearing apparel sector which dominates the EPZ Sector comprised 378 enterprises and employed about 76,000 persons representing 83% of the EPZ workforce.

A comparison with data as at March 1988 shows that during the 12 months' period, employment in the EPZ Sector has decreased by around 1,300; male employment fell by some 1,900 partly offset by an increase of 600 in female employment.

A sectoral analysis shows that with the exception of the woollen sector which has contracted by some 4,500, the other sectors have recorded increases mainly as follows:- Textile yarn and fabrics: + 500, other garments: + 1,500, leather products and footwear: + 400 and jewellery and related articles: + 300.

4. Exports and Imports

Definite figures of EPZ trade are not yet available but a provisional estimate shows that during the first three months of the year 1989, the EPZ enterprises have exported goods worth around Rs 1,850 million and the import bill was around Rs 1,600 million. These figures compare with exports of Rs 1,600 million and imports Rs 1,200 million for the corresponding period of last year.
