

## The Export Processing Zone (EPZ) - 1st Quarter 1992

### 1. Employment evolution, 1st quarter 1992

During the first quarter of 1992, the total number of active enterprises in the EPZ sector was reduced by 10 but total employment increased slightly by 500.

Between January and March 1992, 18 closures were reported and 8 new ones started operation, bringing the total number of enterprises to 576 from 586 at December 1991. The EPZ workforce attained 91,400 with 63,600 (or 70%) female workers and 27,800 male workers.

It is to be noted that the EPZ employment had registered a peak level of 91,600 in June 1988, thereafter, dropping to around 88,600 at December 1989. A gradual increase has been noted from 1991 onwards to attain 91,400 at March 1992.

Although, at aggregate level, the net increase works out to 500 only, detailed data show a high mobility of workers among EPZ firms: some 7,000 workers, representing 8% of the workforce have in fact changed jobs. The 18 companies which closed down, laid off some 3,800 workers; a reduction of 3,000 were reported by existing firms, which brought the total loss to 6,800.

This decrease was however more than offset by a total employment creation of 7,300 jobs, the majority of which were reported by existing firms expanding their activities. The 8 new enterprises contributed to the creation of 400 jobs only.

A new table compiled on the closures shows that 13 out of the 18 closures occurred in the textile sector as follows:-

*3 in the pullover sector,*

*9 in the garment sector and*

*1 in the textile yarn sector*

It is also noted that at March 1992, there were 19 enterprises employing more than 1,000 workers compared to 16 at December 1991.

### 2. Employment evolution between March 1991 and March 1992

A comparison of March 1992 employment data with those of March 1991 shows that the EPZ sector has recruited some 1,500 additional workers during that 12 month period. This increase compares with a negligible growth in the corresponding previous period, i.e between March 1990 and March 1991.

A constant increase has been noted in female employment which increased by 2,000 or 3%, whilst that of male continued to fall registering a further drop of 500.

Detailed figures by product group (Table 6) shows an increase of around 2,000 in the wearing apparel group bringing its total workforce to nearly 77,000 accounting for nearly 85% of total employment in the EPZ Sector. However it should be noted that in this group, the subgroup pull-over lost about 1,200 jobs which was more than offset by its other various components (+3,200). Other groups which recorded small decreases were 'food' (-136), 'textile yarn & fabric' (-254), and 'watches, electronic watches & clocks' (-144)

#### EPZ Exports & Imports

Provisional trade figures available for the first quarter 1992 shows that EPZ exports amounted to Rs 2,700 million compared to Rs 2,300 million for the corresponding period of 1991. The import bill was valued at Rs 1,750 million yielding a net EPZ export figure of Rs 950 million. The ratio of net exports to exports works out to 35% compared to 29% for the corresponding period of 1991 and 42% for the year 1991.
