THE EXPORT PROCESSING ZONE **3rd Quarter 1992**

Introduction.

The results of the "Quarterly Survey of Employment "(September 1992) carried out in the EPZ sector are presented in this issue of the "Economic Indicators". Provisional trade figures for the first nine months of the year are also given.

2. Employment evolution, 3rd quarter 1992

During the third quarter, 8 new enterprises were set up whilst 12 closed down and the EPZ workforce registered a net loss of some 2,600 workers, after declining by around 1,500 in the previous quarter. Male employment dropped by 1,000 and that of female, by 1,600.

Contrary to previous trends, when employment creation, particularly, through recruitment of additional workers by existing enterprises exceeded reductions in other firms, the period under review was marked by a relatively low intake of workers. During the 3rd quarter, only 1,700 additional workers were recruited by new and existing companies compared to 7,000 and 4,100 in the first and second quarter respectively. On the other hand, a reduction to the tune of some 4,300 was reported: 3,500, by existing firms which were operating with a reduced staff and 850, through closures.

As at September 1992, the EPZ Sector, therefore, comprised 564 enterprises which employed 87,300 workers (61,800 females and 25,500 males). This figure included 1,800 outworkers and 1,600 foreign workers.

A closer analysis by product group shows declining employment in almost all products with major losses of about 2,200 workers in the manufacture of wearing apparels.

3. Employment evolution, September 1991-September 1992.

During the 12-month period ending September 1992, 56 companies ceased operation which resulted in the loss of 6,800 jobs. As only 3,750 could be absorbed: 1,050, by the 35 new companies and 2,700, by existing enterprises, the net result was a loss of around 3,000

This reduction of 3,000 compares with an increase of about 2,000 workers in the corresponding period of 1990/1991.

It is to be noted that employment in the EPZ Sector which had registered a peak of 91,600 in June 1988 dropped to around 88,700 in September 1989 . Thereafter, employment gradually picked up , attained another record level of 91,400 in March this year and subsequently declined to 87,300 in September.

A comparison of September 1992 data, by product group, with those of September 1991 shows high losses of 1,500 and 1,000 in "Pullovers" and "other garments" respectively Other product groups adversely affected were: "Food" (-300), "Wood and paper products" (-170) and "Jewellery and related articles" (-120). On the other hand, two sectors, namely "Leather products and footwear" and "Electric and other electronic products" grew moderately by 200 and 100 respectively.

4. Exports and Imports

Although the employment level in the EPZ Sector has been going down during the last two quarters, provisional trade figures available for the first nine months indicate that EPZ exports have increased by around 11% to reach around Rs 9,600 million while the import bill went up by only 3%. and was valued at about Rs 5,500 million .


Consequently, net EPZ export earnings increased to Rs 4,100 million and represented 43% of exports against 38% recorded during the corresponding period of 1991.

On this trend, it is most likely that total EPZ exports for the year 1992 will attain Rs 13,500 million against Rs 12,100 million last year.
