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

## The Export Processing Zone, 1st Quarter 1994

### **Introduction**

This issue of the "Economic Indicators" presents the results of the "Quarterly Survey of Employment" carried out at the end of March 1994. Provisional figures of EPZ exports and imports are also included.

### **2. Employment evolution, 1st Quarter 1994**

At the end of March 1994, there were some 83,900 employees (24,250 males and 59,650 females) working in 520 enterprises in the EPZ compared to 85,600 in 536 enterprises at the end of December 1993. The decrease of around 1,700 is the net result of a total loss of 5,400 jobs (2,700 due to closures) partly offset by the creation of around 3,700 new jobs (mainly as a result of expansion in existing enterprises).

During the first quarter, 24 enterprises closed down accounting for 2,700 job losses, of which 2,100 in 7 enterprises employing between 100 and 900 workers. Eight new enterprises started operation with around 200 workers.

An analysis of employment by product group (Table 5) shows a significant decrease of 1,900 in "Pullovers" with the other sectors remaining at almost the same level except for "Textile yarn and fabrics" where a modest increase of around 250 was observed.

The number of foreign workers rose by 398 and stood at 4,493 at the end of March 1994.

### **3. Employment evolution, March 1993 - March 1994**

Compared to March 1993, there was a decrease of 34 enterprises of which 20 had been operating in the "Wearing apparel" sector. Employment dropped by around 3,900, from

87,800 to 83,900, mainly in "Wearing apparel" (3,600) and to a lesser extent in "Textile yarn and fabrics" (250). Male employment declined by around 700 and that of female by 3,200.

#### **4. EPZ Exports and Imports, January - March 1994.**

Provisional trade figures show that EPZ exports during the 1st quarter of 1994 reached Rs3,200 million against Rs2,800 million a year earlier, i.e an increase of around 14%. After allowing for price increases estimated at around 7%, EPZ exports, in real terms, grew by 7%.

Exports to the EEC during the period amounted to Rs2,100 million compared to Rs1,925 million in 1993. France with Rs882 million worth of goods remains the main buyer, in the European communities. Outside the EEC, the fast growing US market absorbed Rs823 million of goods representing more than 20% increase over the corresponding period last year.

During the 1st quarter, total imports, rose by 9% from Rs2,100 million in 1993 to Rs2,300 million in 1994. Imports of raw materials increased by 14% from Rs1,800 million to Rs2,100 million whilst those of "Machinery and spare parts" fell by Rs78 million to Rs213 million.

Net EPZ Exports, i.e total exports minus total imports, yielded Rs868 million during the 1st quarter as against Rs706 million for the same period last year. Consequently, the ratio of Net Exports to exports works out to 27%, slightly higher than the 25% for the corresponding period of 1993.

## **External Trade - 1st Quarter 1994**

### **1. Total value of trade and trade balance**

During the first quarter of 1994, total international trade for the country was valued at around Rs 11,900 million, 9 per cent higher than that of the corresponding period of 1993 but 21 percent below the previous quarter's level.

With exports amounting to Rs 5,000 million and imports to around Rs 6,900 million, the balance of visible trade for the first quarter of 1993 resulted in a deficit of Rs 1,800 million compared to Rs 1,700 million recorded in the corresponding quarter of 1993 and Rs 2,300 million in the previous quarter.

### **2. Terms of trade (Base year 1992 = 100)**

The terms of trade index shows the price movement of exports relative to imports. The terms of trade index for the first quarter of 1994 dropped further to 92 from 97 in the previous quarter and 98 for the year 1993. This unfavourable movement was the result of a 5 per cent drop in export prices whilst import prices were about 1 per cent higher.

Details on price indices for imports in the 1st quarter (Table 3(b)) show increases ranging between 6 per cent and 24 per cent in all product groups with the exception of fuel which registered a drop of 10 per cent.

### **3. Exports**

Total export proceeds for the first three months of the year 1994, stood at Rs 5,000 million about 10 percent above the corresponding quarter's figure of Rs 4,600 million in 1993. After allowing for price increases of around 4 percent registered between these two periods, exports grew by 6 percent, in volume terms.

The rise in exports is mainly attributable to a 14 percent increase in the export proceeds of the EPZ sector, which accounted for 67% of domestic exports. EPZ exports fetched some Rs 3,200 million compared to Rs 2,800 million a year ago. 127,000 metric tonnes of sugar were exported at slightly higher prices for Rs 1,376 million against 124,000 metric tonnes for Rs 1,294 million last year.

The table below summarises the main changes in exports between the first quarter of 1993 and 1994.

Exports by country of destination for the first quarter of 1994 shows that the country's main buyers remained the European Economic Community (EEC) which purchased 72 percent of our exports . The US market maintained its share of 17 percent.

#### 4. Imports

The import bill for the first quarter of 1994 increased in nominal terms by 9 percent to Rs 6,900 million compared to Rs 6,300 million registered in the corresponding quarter of 1993. As most of the increase was due to price effects, in volume terms,imports grew marginally by around one percent only.

Comparative figures for main imports in the first quarter of 1993 and 1994 are given hereunder.

As shown in the above table, with the exception of fuel and machinery and equipment which fell by Rs 90 million and Rs 247 million respectively, all other product groups have recorded increases ranging from Rs 80 million to Rs 400 million

The bill in respect of food, beverages and tobacco amounting to Rs 1010 million comprises both consumption and intermediate goods such as wheat and fish. Imports of manufactured goods which stood at Rs 3,243 million accounted for 47 percent of the total. The EPZ sector's bill was some 9 per cent higher with raw materials worth of Rs 2,081 million compared to Rs 1,818 million last year.

Table 9 on imports by country of origin shows that during the first quarter of 1994, the country's main source of imports remained the EEC which accounted for 31 percent of the total with France sharing 37 percent of the European share.On an individual country basis, the Republic of South Africa is now the main supplier with 15 percent of the total, the other major suppliers were: Japan (6%), India (7%) and Hong Kong (5%)

## 5. The EPZ Sector

During the first quarter of 1994, the EPZ enterprises exported some Rs 3,200 million worth of goods against Rs 2,800 million a year earlier. This figure represents a nominal increase of 14 percent over last year's achievement and is explained by increases in price (+ 7%) and quantity (+ 7%). Exports to USA increased to Rs 823 million from Rs 670 million a year earlier and to the EEC, Rs 2,100 million against Rs 1925 million a year earlier.

Imports increased by 9 percent to Rs 2,300 million compared to Rs 2,100 million with raw materials up by Rs 263 million (+14%) whilst machinery and equipment fell by Rs 78 million to Rs 213 million.

Consequently, Net EPZ exports for the first quarter of the year 1994 yielded some Rs 900 million against Rs 700 million earned in the corresponding period last year but the ratio of Net exports to Exports improved slightly to 27 percent from 25 percent last year.
