

Introduction

The "Quarterly Survey of Employment" provides up-to-date data on the evolution of the workforce in the EPZ sector. This report presents the results of the survey carried out at the end of March 1995.

2. Number of enterprises, March 1995

The number of enterprises at the end of March 1995 stood at 490, 4 fewer than at the end of December 1994. The decrease is the net result of 10 closures, of which 7 in "Wearing apparel", and the coming into operation of 6 new enterprises. Among the new enterprises, 2 fall in "Food", 2 in "Wearing apparel", 1 in "Textiles yarn and fabrics" and 1 in "Electric and electronic products".

3. Employment evolution, 1st Quarter 1995

During the 1st quarter of this year, employment in the EPZ increased by nearly 1,000 to reach 83,160 despite a decrease in the number of enterprises from 494 to 490. The increase is mainly attributable to expansion in existing enterprises. In fact, 40 enterprises reported a total expansion of around 4,050 whilst 6 new enterprises contributed to the creation of 100 additional jobs. On the other hand, during the same period, slightly over 3,150 jobs were lost - 2,250 through contraction in the workforce of 17 enterprises and 900 through closures of 10 enterprises.

The "Wearing apparel" group, for the first time in 3 years, showed an increase, though minimal (80), in its workforce. There have, however, been significant changes within the group with "Pullovers" gaining nearly 700 jobs against losses of around 600 in the "Other garments" subgroup. All the other groups witnessed increases ranging between 18 and 267 except for "Flowers" and enterprises falling in the "Other" category where slight decreases of 15 and 85 were reported respectively.

The number of foreign workers employed by the EPZ enterprises stood at 5,985 (1,666 males and 4,319 females), an increase of nearly 500 over the previous quarter.

4. Employment evolution, March 1994 - March 1995

Compared to March 1994, there were 30 fewer enterprises in the EPZ of which 29 from enterprises operating in the "Wearing apparel" group. During the one-year period, total employment decreased by around 700 - the net result of losses of 2,000 in "Wearing apparel" and an aggregate increase of around 1,300 in the other product groups, the significant ones being "Food" (526), "Leather products and footwear" (249) and "Textile yarn and fabrics" (195).

5. Exports and Imports, 1st Quarter 1995

EPZ exports reached nearly Rs 3,500 million compared to Rs 3,200 million during the same quarter last year, a nominal increase of around 10%. The same percentage increase is noted in imports which amounted to Rs 2,500 million as against Rs 2,300 million during the 1st quarter 1994.

Net exports, that is exports minus imports, worked out to Rs 1,000 million and represents 28 % of exports.
