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

# **The Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises, 2nd Quarter 1995**

## **Introduction**

This report provides data on the Export Processing Zone for the 2nd Quarter of 1995. In this issue is also published for the first time, data on Pioneer Status Enterprises. This sector comprises "small and medium" enterprises engaged mainly on new technology as well as support and service industries.

## **I. The Export Processing Zone (EPZ)**

### **(i) Number of enterprises**

At the end of June 1995, 477 enterprises were in operation. This figure shows a decline of 13 over that of March 1995 and is 32 lower than that of June 1994.

The reduction of 13 in the number of enterprises is the net result of 16 closures and 3 new enterprises. Of the 16 enterprises which ceased operation during the 2nd quarter of 1995, 9 were in the "Wearing apparel" sector, the most important sector in the EPZ.

### **(ii) Employment evolution - 2nd quarter 1995**

The number of persons employed as at June 1995 totalled 81,823 showing a decrease of 1,337 or 1.6% over that of March 1995. Between March and June 1995 the work force in the "wearing apparel" sector alone went down by 1,360. Moderate decreases were also noted in "Textile yarn and fabrics" (-121) and "Electronic watches and clocks" (-87). On the other hand, moderate increases in employment were registered in "Toys and carnival articles" (+112) and "Optical goods" (+35). Details of net change in employment are shown in Table 1.6.

The number of foreign workers employed in the EPZ enterprises decreased by 243 from 5,985 (1,666 males and 4,319 females) to 5,742 (1,614 males and 4,128 females).

### **(iii) Employment evolution - June 1994 - June 1995**

The number of enterprises decreased by 32 between June 1994 and June 1995 and the workforce decreased by 2,039 during the same period.

In the "Wearing apparel" sector employment went down by 3,097 or 4.4% from 70,854 to 67,757. Moderate increases were registered in the following sectors "Food" (+253), "Leather products and footwear" (+273), "Jewellery and related articles" (+118), "Toys and carnival articles" (+148) and "Optical goods" (+152).

(iv) **Exports and Imports, 2nd Quarter 1995**

EPZ Exports totalled Rs 4,843 million showing a nominal increase of 15.4% over the same quarter last year. This nominal increase represents an increase of 9% in volume and 6% in price. Imports have risen by 5.4% only from Rs 2,536 million in the 2nd quarter of 1994 to Rs 2,676 million for the same period in 1995.

Net exports works out to Rs 2,167 million and represents 45% of EPZ exports, compared to 29% for the previous quarter and 40% for the corresponding period of 1994.

(v) **Exports and Imports - 1st Semester 1995**

Total EPZ exports for the first six months reached Rs 8,341 million compared to Rs 7,358 for the same period last year. The 13.4% nominal increase is explained by an increase of around 8% in volume and 5% in price. Imports which attained Rs 5,158 million were 6.8% higher than in 1994.

(vi) **Forecast**

On the basis of data available for the first six months and foreseeable trends for the next six months, EPZ exports may well reach Rs 18,500 million in 1995.

## II. **The Pioneer Status Enterprises (PSE)**

(i) **Number of enterprises**

The PSE sector started in 1991 with only 5 enterprises and has registered a steady expansion over the years with the result that the number of enterprises at the end of 1992, 1993 and 1994 were 24, 45 and 72 respectively. The number of enterprises in June 1995 was 80 compared to 77 in March 1995. The activities in which the PSE's are engaged are shown in Table 2.2.

(ii) **Employment, 2nd Quarter 1995**

The total workforce in the PSE sector at the end of June 1995 was 1,223, 5.5% above that of March 1995 (1,159). The average number of workers per enterprise in June 1995 was 15.9. 46 of these enterprises employed less than 10 persons with an average of 4.7 persons whilst 13 of them employed more than 25 persons with an average of 60 persons per enterprise. In the remaining 21 enterprises employment ranged between 10 and 24 with an average of 15.5 persons per enterprise.

The number of expatriates employed in June 1995 was 39 (36 males and 3 females) compared to 44 in March 1995 (41 males and 3 females).
