

The Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises,

3rd Quarter 1996

Introduction

This issue of the "Economic Indicators" presents the results of the "Quarterly Survey of Employment" carried out at the end of September 1996. Figures are given separately for the Export Processing Zone and Pioneer Status Enterprises. The latter are enterprises engaged mainly in activities involving high technology and providing support services to industries. The report also includes provisional figures of EPZ imports and exports for the 3rd quarter 1996 as well as revised figures for previous years.

I. The Export Processing Zone (EPZ)

(i) Number of enterprises

At the end of the 3rd quarter 1996, there was a total of 477 enterprises in the EPZ, a net gain of 2 enterprises over the previous quarter.

During the 3rd quarter, 13 enterprises closed down and 15 new enterprises started operation. In "Wearing apparel", the most important group in the EPZ, 6 closures were reported and 9 new enterprises came into operation bringing the number to 237 compared to 234 at the end of the 2nd quarter. Changes in the number of enterprises by product group is given in Table 1.5.

It should be noted that of the 477 enterprises, 432 were single-establishment enterprises and 45 were multi-establishment enterprises (i.e, with branches). The total number of establishments enumerated at the end of the 3rd quarter 1996 stood at 636.

(ii) Employment evolution, 3rd quarter 1996

Employment in the EPZ stood at 79,447 representing a slight increase of 178 when compared to the 2nd quarter of 1996. The number of male employees increased by 660 from 23,596 to 24,256 but, on the other hand, female employment fell by 482 from 55,673 to 55,191.

An analysis by product group shows an increase of 442 in "Wearing apparel". Moderate decreases of 204 and 155 were noted in "Textiles yarn and fabrics" and "Leather products and footwear" respectively. Details of net change in employment by product group are shown in Table 1.6.

During the 3rd quarter, a total of 3,130 jobs were created of which 407 by 15 new enterprises. On the other hand, 2,952 jobs were lost, 1,075 of which following the closure of 13 enterprises (Table 1.4).

The number of outworkers stood at 899, i.e., an increase of 211 over the previous quarter. Foreign workers, who numbered 6,119 at the beginning of the quarter, increased by 148 to reach 6,267 at the end of September 1996 (2,068 males and 4,199 females).

(iii) Employment evolution, September 1995 - September 1996

During the one-year period ending September 1996 employment fell by 1,251. This decrease was the net result of a drop of 1,822 in the number of female workers and an increase of 571 among male workers.

In the "Wearing apparel" sector, employment went down by 938 from 66,394 to 65,456. Within this group there was a decrease of 1,309 in "Pullovers" but an increase of 371 in "Other garments". Moderate decreases were also registered in the following sectors: "Leather products and footwear" (-210), "Optical goods" (-127) and "Food" (-121). The other sectors witnessed minor changes as shown in Table 1.6.

(iv) Exports and Imports

EPZ Exports, for the 3rd quarter of 1996, reached Rs 5,678 million against Rs 5,445 million for the previous quarter. The total for the first three quarters of 1996 works out to Rs 15,333 million and represents an increase of 15.4% when compared to the corresponding period in 1995. The nominal increase is explained by an 8% increase in volume and another 7% in price.

Imports for the first nine months of 1996, reached Rs 9,155 million compared to Rs 8,045 million (+13.8%) for the same period last year. Raw materials accounted for Rs 8,289 million whilst imports of machinery and equipment represent an increase of nearly 19% (Rs 866 million against Rs 730 million)

Net exports, i.e., exports minus imports, totalled Rs 6,178 million and its ratio to exports works out to 40% for the three quarters of 1996 (Table 1.8).

On the basis of available figures for the three quarters of 1996 and taking into consideration past trends, total exports for the year 1996 may well reach Rs 21,000 million.

II. The Pioneer Status Enterprises (PSE)

(i) Number of enterprises

Seven new enterprises of which 4 engaged in the group "Informatics" started operation during the 3rd quarter of 1996, bringing the total to 124 at the end of the quarter. Compared to the same quarter a year ago this represents an increase of 28 enterprises. The activities in which the enterprises are engaged are given in Table 2.2

(ii) Employment

The total workforce in the PSE sector at the end of the 3rd quarter 1996 was 1,892 (1,111 males and 781 females), an increase of 54 over the previous quarter. The "large" enterprises employed 1,581 compared to 1,531 at the end of June 1996 (Table 2.1).

During the 3rd quarter 1996, a total of 141 jobs were created: 35 by the 7 new enterprises and 106 following expansion in 31 existing enterprises. On the other hand, 21 enterprises reported a total reduction of 87 in their workforce (Table 2.3).

When compared to the 3rd quarter of 1995, employment in the PSE increased by 574 of whom 418 in the group "Informatics". Details of other changes in employment by product group is given in Table 2.5.

The number of expatriates employed as at end of the 3rd quarter 1996 stood at 58 (50 males and 8 females).
