International Travel & Tourism, 1997

1. Passenger Traffic

(i) Total

Total passenger traffic for the year 1997 amounted to 1,405,000, made up of 705,000 arrivals and 700,000 departures. Compared to last year these figures represent increases of 10% in arrivals and 10% in departures. Movement by sea accounted for 3% of both arrivals and departures.

Total arrivals included 8,610 "excursionists", i.e. passengers arriving and leaving on the same day. Of these excursionists, 2,940 (34%) came from Reunion Island and 1,270 (15%) from France. In addition, 18 cruise ships had visited our port, bringing in a total of 13,300 "cruise excursionists" (8,100 passengers and 5,200 crews).

(ii) Mauritian Residents

The number of Mauritians travelling abroad has increased by 9% from 120,400 in 1996 to 131,600 in 1997. Reunion Island remained their favourite destination with 39,000 departures followed by France with 19,700 departures. However, substantial growths were noted on the following destinations: Seychelles(+81%), Canada(+63%) and Italy (+56%). A more elaborate distribution is presented in table 2.

(iii) Tourist Arrivals

Tourist arrivals for the year 1997 reached 536,125 against 486,867 in 1996, representing an increase of 10%. This increase was mainly due to growths from some major generating countries like France, Italy and United Kingdom. The contribution of some small generating markets, namely Australia, Sweden, Netherlands and Zimbabwe have also been important.

For the year under review, 92% of the tourists came on holiday while 4% came for business and 2% were in transit. On a comparative basis, the holiday segment rose by 10% while business tourists increased by 8%. But the highest growth rate was noted for the conference component (+46%) and sports (+48%). This is illustrated in table 4.

Arrivals from Europe has known a growth of 16% to reach 326,400 in 1997. The traditional markets, with the exception of Germany, which registered a 3% decline, have shown appreciable growths. France, our leading market representing 27% of total tourist arrivals and 44% of European market, posted an increase of 11%. Tourist arrivals from United Kingdom grew by 31% in 1997 to position itself as the second major generating country on this continent but the highest growth (61%) was achieved by Italy. Growths in some small generating countries were as follows: Sweden(+54%), CIS(+33%), Netherlands(+32%) and Spain(+13%).

Tourist arrivals from Africa has known a marginal growth of 1% in 1997. This is mainly due to lower growths from the major sources of this region. Arrivals from our leading market of this continent, Reunion has been at the same level as last year with a figure of 82,600 while South Africa witnessed a slight growth of 2%. The performance of the other African markets was as follows: Malagasy Republic (-11%), Seychelles (-4%) and Zimbabwe (+25%).

The Asian market recorded a growth of 4% in 1997. India remains the major source with an increase of 1% to reach 13,200. The highest growth (46%) was registered by Malaysia. Performances of the other Asian countries were as follows: Singapore (+8%), People's Republic of China (+8%), Japan (-2%) and Hong Kong (-21%).

The Oceanian market maintained an upward trend with a growth of 22%. Arrivals from Australia grew by 22% to reach 9,500 at end of year 1997.

Arrivals from the American market have increased by 29% influenced mostly by growth from USA (22%) and Canada (12%).

For further details on tourist arrivals, refer to tables 5 & 6.

2. Tourist Nights

The number of tourist nights spent in Mauritius in 1997 is estimated to be around 5,630,000, i.e. an increase of 14% over last year. The average length of stay of a tourist worked out to be around 10.5 nights.

3. Hotel Statistics

The deregistration of two small hotels during the fourth quarter of 1997 brought the number of registered hotels to 87 at the end of December, out of which 26 were considered "Large", i.e. well established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms. The total capacity for all registered hotels was 6,800 rooms with 14,100 bedplace. For "Large" hotels the room capacity was 4,600 with 9,400 bedplaces.

The overall room occupancy rates in 1997 was estimated to be around 72% for all hotels and 78% for large hotels only. The corresponding bed occupancy rates were 64% and 70%.

Tables 7 to 10 give further details of hotel statistics.

4. Gross Tourism Receipts

Gross earnings from tourism for the year under review is estimated at 10,068 million rupees, which is 11% higher than the figure of 9,048 million rupees registered for the year 1996. The average receipt per tourist was 18,800 rupees in 1997 compared to 18,600 rupees in 1996.

5. Employment

At the end of March 1997, direct employment in tourist establishments employing 10 persons or more stood at 15,400 which is 7% higher than last year. Of this number, 69% or 10,600 were engaged in hotels. Table 11 shows the distribution of employment in tourism sector.

Explanatory Notes

1. Tourist

A tourist is defined as a non-resident staying in the country for more than 24 hours but less than a year and is not involved in any gainful occupation during his/her stay.

2. Transit

Transit passengers are those who stop over in the country for flight connections to other destinations. There are two types of transit passengers:

- **Type I**: Passengers who do not leave the transit area of the airport or the port.
- Type II: Passengers who leave the airport or port and stay in the country for more than 24 hours for only flight connection purposes.

 Only Type II transit passengers, as defined above, are included in the definition of "Tourists".

3. Excursionist or Same-day Visitor

An excursionist is a non-resident who stays in the country for less than 24 hours, other than those who do not leave the airport. It also includes passengers as well as crews of *cruise ship*.

4. Tourist Nights

Tourist nights are the total number of nights spent in the country by tourists during the period under review.

5. Large Hotels

Large hotels are well established beach hotels with more than 80 rooms.

6. CIS

CIS denotes the Commonwealth of Independent States which consists of the states of the former Soviet Union.




Table 6: - Tourist Arrivals by Country of Residence, 1996/1997

Chart 2 - Tourist Arrivals from Top Ten Markets, January - December 1996/97


