## External Trade – 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2000

### Introduction

This issue of the Economic and Social Indicators presents external trade statistics for the first nine months of 2000 and for the years 1998 and 1999. While figures for 1998 are final, those for 1999 and 2000 are subject to revision in future issues.

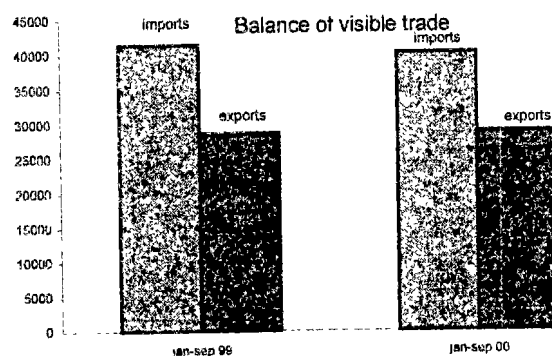
Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. As this system accounts for all goods entering and leaving the national frontier, trading activities of the freeport zone should in principle also be covered. However, for the sake of comparability and continuity in the series, data from the two sources, namely the Customs Department and the Mauritius Freeport Authority are shown separately. Data pertaining to imports and re-exports of the Freeport are given in Table 2. With the exception of this table, all the other tables refer to usual customs data and do not include transactions of the freeport.

Detailed statistical tables on imports and exports of the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) are published in the indicator on "EPZ and Pioneer Status Enterprises", which appears in this same issue of the "Economic and Social Indicators".

### 1. Total value of trade and trade balance

Total international trade for the third quarter of 2000 was valued at Rs.26,075 million, a figure which is 13.1% higher than that of the previous quarter and 7.0% higher than that of the corresponding quarter of 1999.

During the third quarter of 2000, total exports reached Rs.11,756 million compared to total imports of Rs.14,319 million, thus yielding a trade deficit of Rs.2,563 million. This deficit is 46% lower than that of the previous quarter (Table 1).



For the first nine months of 2000, total exports and imports amounted to Rs.28,773 million and Rs.40,177 million respectively, showing a trade deficit of Rs.11,404 which is 10% lower than the figure of Rs.12,705 million registered during the corresponding period of last year.

Based on the trend for the first nine months, total exports for the year 2000 are expected to be of the order of Rs.41,500 million, as against Rs.58,000 million for imports. The trade deficit will therefore be around Rs.16,500 million, which is 1% lower than that registered last year.

## 2. Terms of trade (base year: 1997 = 100)

During the third quarter of 2000, the terms of trade index, which shows price movements of exports relative to those of imports, fell by six percentage points to 93, from 99 in the previous quarter (Table 3). This movement was the result of a decrease of 4.4% in export prices and an increase of 1.7% in import prices. It should be noted that these price movements are based on unit value indices which, unlike genuine price changes, are affected by changes in country of origin/destination, product mix and quality.

Details of price changes for exports and imports are given in Tables 4 and 5.

## 3. Exports

Total exports which comprise domestic exports, re-exports and ship's stores and bunkers, amounted to Rs.11,756 million for the third quarter of 2000, showing an increase of Rs.2,594 million (or 28.3%) over the previous quarter.

During the same period, domestic exports, which represent 93% of total exports, increased from Rs.8,520 million to Rs.10,968 million (28.7%).

Total exports for the first nine months of 2000 reached Rs.28,773 million, slightly above the figure of Rs.28,655 million noted for the corresponding period of 1999.

The table below shows the main changes in domestic exports between the first nine months of 1999 and 2000.

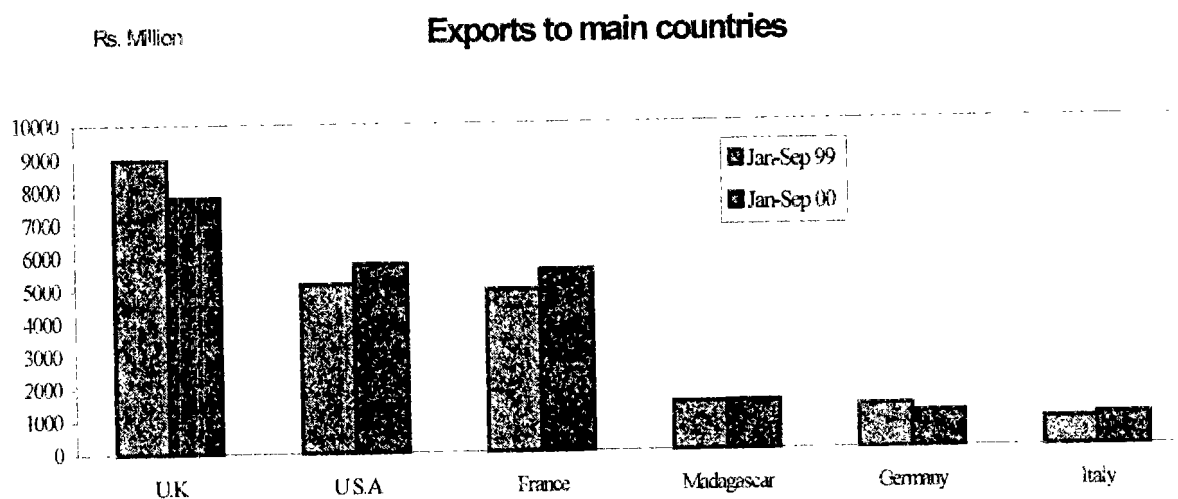

Proceeds from sugar exports were 31% lower in the first nine months of 2000 compared to 1999. This was the net result of a 37% decrease in volume and a price increase of 10%. Exports of "crude materials, except fuels", registered a decrease of 24% in value, as a result of a 4% fall in prices and a 21% fall in volume. Export receipts from "manufactured goods classified chiefly by materials" improved by 9%

in nominal terms, resulting from a 3% decrease in prices and a 12% increase in volume. Similarly, exports of "*Miscellaneous manufactured articles*", which represented 72% of total exports, increased by 7% in value as a consequence of a 4% fall in prices and an 11% increase in volume.

Tabulation by country of destination shows that our main buyers, i.e the European Union, purchased some 66% of our exports (Rs.18,374 million), that is 6% less than in the first nine months of 1999. The United Kingdom was the main buyer with Rs.7,800 million, or 28% of total exports. The other major markets were U.S.A (Rs.5,774 million), France (Rs.5,547 million), Malagasy Republic (Rs.1,469 million), Germany (Rs.1,071 million) and Italy (Rs.956 million). Table 7 shows further details.



#### 4. Imports

Total imports for the third quarter of 2000 increased by 3% over the previous quarter to reach Rs.14,319 million. This figure represents a similar increase (i.e 3%) over the corresponding period of last year.

Imports for the first nine months of 2000, which totalled Rs.40,177 million, was 3% lower than the value of Rs.41,360 million registered for the first nine months of 1999. Overall import prices are estimated to have increased by 4% while import volume registered no change.

Comparative figures for imports by S.I.T.C (Rev 3) sections are shown below. Further details by section and commodity are presented in Tables 8 and 9.

In nominal terms the highest increase was registered in the group "*Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials*" whose import value rose by 81% as a result of a 70% increase in prices and 6% increase in volume. The value of imports of "*Chemicals & related products*", increased by 14% while prices fell by 5% accompanied by an increase of 20% in volume. "*Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material*" imports value went up by 4%, consequent to a fall of 1% in prices and an increase of 5% in volume.

### Imports from main countries

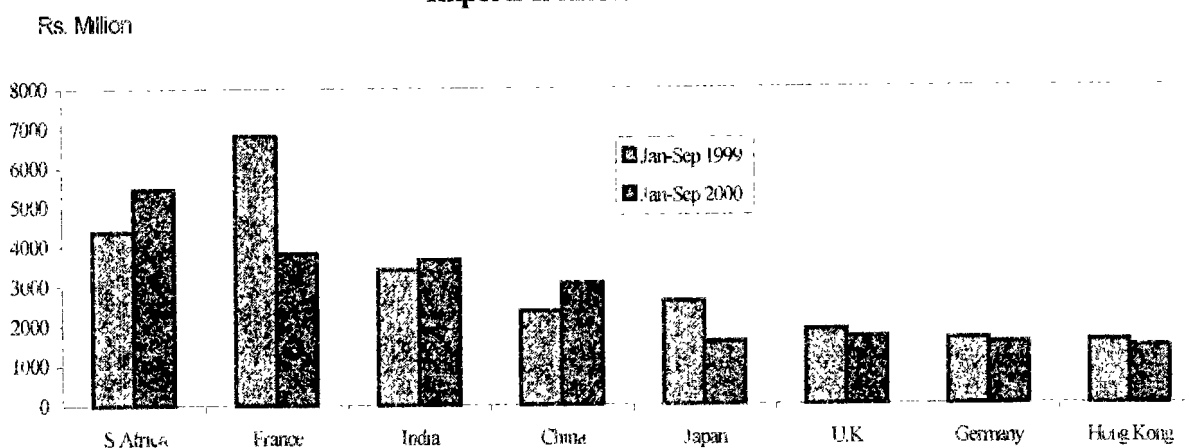


Table 10 shows imports by country of origin. During the period January - September 2000, our main supplier was the Republic of South Africa with a figure of Rs.5,457 million, representing 14% of total imports. Other major suppliers were France (10%), India (9%), China (8%), United Kingdom (4%), Japan (4%), Germany (4%) and Hong Kong (4%).

## **5. Trade in Freeport Zone**

A summary table on data pertaining to activities in the Freeport compiled by the Mauritius Freeport Authority is given in Table 2.

During the third quarter of 2000, total imports of the Freeport Zone amounted to Rs.1,611 million while re-exports totalled Rs.1,932 million. These include respectively Rs.163 million worth of goods sourced locally and Rs.96 million sold locally.

For the first nine months of 2000, total imports amounted to Rs.3,029 million compared to re-exports of Rs.3,865 million.

## **6. Trade with Regional Organisations**

Total exports to African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) States amounted to Rs.716 million during the third quarter of 2000, while imports stood at Rs.587 million, showing increases of 10% and 56% respectively over the previous quarter. During the first nine months of 2000, total exports to ACP countries were valued at Rs.1,985 million compared to Rs.1,337 worth of imports (Table 11).

During the third quarter of 2000, Mauritius exported goods to a value of Rs.692 million to COMESA countries. Imports from these countries amounted to Rs.453 million, resulting in a balance of Rs.239 million in favour of Mauritius. Compared to the second quarter of 2000, exports went up by 10% and imports by 52%.

For the first nine months of 2000, total exports to COMESA countries amounted to Rs.1,908 million and imports to Rs.1,039 million. The main partner was Malagasy Republic with a share of 77% of exports and 55% of imports.

Trade with SADC countries showed a deficit of Rs.1,609 million during the third quarter of 2000, resulting from imports to a value of Rs.1,795 million while exports amounted to Rs.186 million.

During the first nine months of 2000, Mauritius imported Rs.5,820 million worth of goods from SADC countries while its exports stood at Rs.494 million. The main supplier was the Republic of South Africa (94%). Our main buyers were the Republic of South Africa (31%), Seychelles (23%), Zimbabwe (22%) and Tanzania (8%).

# External Trade

## Notes

### (1) Coverage

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses
- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.
- Ships stores and bunkers are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

### (2) Valuation

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

### (3) Classification

#### (i) Commodity Code

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 3) or SITC Rev. 3. The HS and the SITC Rev. 3 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.



#### 4. **Terms of trade**

The terms of trade index measures the price movements of exports relative to imports. It is the ratio of exports price index to import price index. A rise in this ratio indicates that the real purchasing power of exports has increased whilst a decrease indicates a drop in the purchasing power
