

External Trade – 3rd Quarter 2001

Introduction

This issue of the Economic and Social Indicators presents external trade statistics for the third quarter of 2001 and for the years 1999 and 2000. While figures for 1999 are final, those for 2000 and 2001 are subject to revision in future issues.

Data on international trade are compiled as per the recommendations of the United Nations General Trade System. According to this system, all goods entering and leaving the national frontier (including transactions of the Freeport) should be accounted for. However, because of different processing systems at the Customs Department and at the Mauritius Freeport Authority, and also for the sake of comparability and continuity, data from the two sources are shown separately. Data pertaining to imports and re-exports of the Freeport are given in Table 2, whilst all the other tables refer to Customs data only.

Since mid-October 2001, transactions of the Freeport are being lodged through the Customs Management System (CMS), thus making it easier to integrate data of the Freeport Zone with those of Customs. As from January 2002, all external trade statistics will include imports and re-exports of the Freeport.

Detailed tables on imports and exports of the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) are given in the Indicator on "EPZ and Pioneer Status Enterprises", which appears in this same issue.

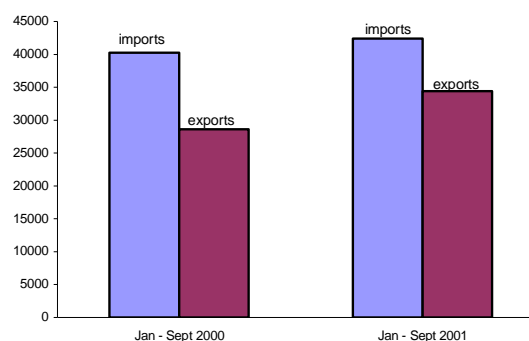
1. Total value of trade and trade balance

Total international trade for the third quarter of 2001 was valued at Rs 28,238 million, a figure which is 11.9% higher than that of the previous quarter and 8.6% higher than that of the corresponding quarter of 2000.

During the third quarter of 2001, total exports reached Rs 13,265 million compared to total imports of Rs 14,973 million, thus resulting in a trade deficit of Rs 1,708 million. When transactions of the Freeport are taken into consideration, this deficit amounts to Rs 1,958 million (Table 1).

Total exports for the third quarter of 2001 have increased by 25%, compared to the previous quarter and, by 14% compared to the corresponding quarter of 2000. On this trend, total exports for the year 2001 are expected to be of the order of Rs 46,500 million and imports, Rs 58,600 million (the imports figure include purchase of an aircraft worth Rs 1,100 million), the trade deficit will therefore be around Rs 12,100 million.

Inclusive of Freeport transactions, the trade deficit for 2001 will be lower at around Rs 11,500 million.

2. Terms of trade (base year: 1997 = 100)

During the third quarter of 2001, the terms of trade index, which shows price movements of exports relative to those of imports, increased by two percentage points to 92, from 90 in the second quarter of 2001 (Table 3). This favourable movement was due mainly to an increase of 3.5% in export prices while import prices increased by 1.6%. It should be borne in mind that these price movements are based on unit value indices which, unlike genuine price changes, are affected by changes in country of origin/destination, product mix and quality.

Details of price changes for exports and imports are given in Tables 4 and 5.

3. Exports

Total export proceeds for the third quarter of 2001, including domestic exports, re-exports and ship's stores and bunkers, amounted to Rs 13,265 million, showing an increase of Rs 1,607 million (or 14%) over the figure of Rs 11,658 million registered in the corresponding quarter of 2000.

Domestic exports, which represent about 92% of total exports, increased from Rs 10,813 million to Rs 12,246 million (13%) during these two periods.

Total exports for the first nine months of 2001 therefore reached Rs 34,393 million, showing an increase of 20% over the figure of Rs 28,603 million noted for the corresponding period of 2000.

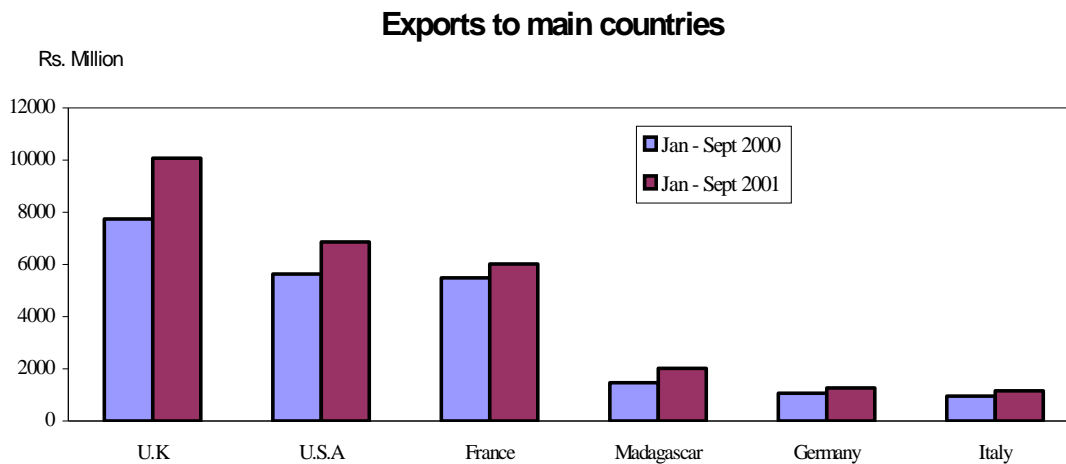

Total domestic exports increased by 18% in nominal terms in the first nine months of 2001, compared to the corresponding period of last year. Proceeds from sugar exports (including special sugars) were 64% higher, as a result of a 95% increase in volume coupled with a 16% fall in unit value. Exports of "Crude materials, inedible, except fuels", registered an increase of 19% in value, explained by 8% rise in price and 10%, in volume. Export receipts from "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by materials" improved by 23% in nominal terms, resulting from an increase of 16% in price and a 6% increase in volume. Similarly, exports of "Miscellaneous manufactured articles" registered an increase of 7% in value, the combined effect of a 4% increase in price and a 3% increase in volume.

Analysis by country of destination shows that countries of the European Union purchased some 66% of our exports for Rs 21,519 million, representing an increase of about 18% over the first nine months of 2000. The United Kingdom remained the main buyer with Rs 10,070 million, or 31% of total exports, followed by U.S.A with Rs 6,857 million (21%) and France with Rs 6,015 million (18%). The other major markets were Malagasy Republic (6%), Germany (4%) and Italy (4%). Table 7 shows further details.



4. Imports

Total imports for the third quarter of 2001 reached Rs 14,973 million, showing an increase of 2.3% over the second quarter of 2001 and 4.5% over the third quarter of 2000.

Total imports for the first nine months of 2001, which totalled Rs 42,389 million, was 5% higher than the value of Rs 40,275 million registered for the corresponding period of last year. Overall import prices for this period are estimated to have increased by around 8% while import volume fell by 3%.

A comparison of imports by S.I.T.C (Rev 3) sections for the first nine months of 2000 and 2001 is given below.

In nominal terms, the highest increase was registered in the group "*Food and Live animals*" whose imports value rose by 19% as a result of increases of 12% and 6% in prices and volume respectively. With the exception of "*Machinery & transport equipment*" and "*Animals & vegetable oils and fats*", all the other sections registered increases in value ranging from 2% to 19%.

Further details by section and commodity are given in Tables 8 and 9.

Imports from main countries

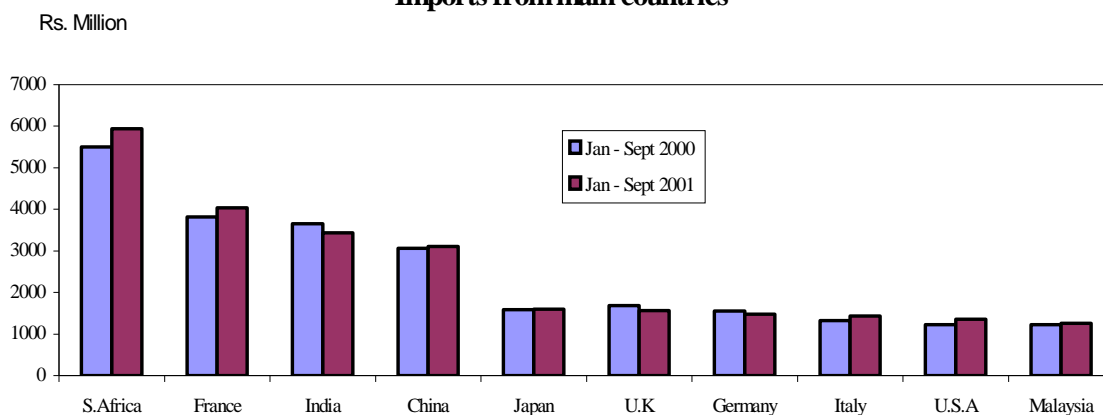


Table 10 shows imports by country of origin. During the period January - September 2001, imports from countries of the European Union totalled Rs 11,067 million, representing 26% of total imports for that period. Our main supplier countries were the Republic of South Africa (14%), France (10%), India (8%), China (7%), Japan (4%), United Kingdom (4%), Germany (3%), Italy (3%), U.S.A (3%), and Malaysia (3%).

5. Trade in Freeport Zone

A summary of data pertaining to activities in the Freeport compiled by the Mauritius Freeport Authority is given at Table 2.

During the third quarter of 2001, total imports in the Freeport Zone amounted to Rs 2,762 million while re-exports totalled Rs 2,346 million. The transactions include Rs 390 million worth of goods sourced locally and Rs 224 million sold locally.

6. Trade with Regional Organisations

ACP States

Total exports to African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) States during the third quarter of 2001 amounted to Rs 976 million showing an increase of 13% over the previous quarter. Total imports, however, fell by 19% when compared to the previous quarter, i.e, from Rs 626 million to Rs 508 million. During the first nine months of 2001, total exports to these countries were valued at Rs 2,604 million compared to Rs 1,577 worth of imports (Table 11).

COMESA States

During the third quarter of 2001, Mauritius exported goods to a value of Rs 939 million to COMESA countries. Imports from these countries amounted to Rs 513 million, resulting in a balance of Rs 426 million in favour of Mauritius. Compared to the second quarter of 2001, exports went up by 17% and imports, by 3%.

For the first nine months of 2001, total exports to COMESA countries amounted to Rs 2,481 million and imports Rs 1,448 million. The main partner was Malagasy Republic with a share of 81% of exports and 54% of imports (Table 12).

SADC States

Trade with SADC countries for the third quarter of 2001 showed a deficit of Rs 1,444 million, resulting from imports to a value of Rs 1,669 million and exports amounting to Rs 225 million.

For the first nine months of 2001, Mauritius imported Rs 6,380 million worth of goods from SADC countries while exports were of the order of Rs 619 million. The main supplier was the Republic of South Africa (93%). Our main buyers were Republic of South Africa (46%), Zimbabwe (22%), Seychelles (15%) and Tanzania (10%).

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External Trade

Notes

(1) Coverage

Trade figures are compiled according to the **General Trade System** as recommended by the United Nations. Using the national boundary as the statistical frontier, the General Trade System is a record of all goods entering (imports) and leaving the country (exports).

- Imports include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses
- Exports cover domestic exports and re-exports which include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses. Domestic exports are defined as goods of national origin. Re-exports are goods which are exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.
- Ships stores and bunkers are included in total exports and are shown separately.
- Trade by parcel post is also included in imports and exports

(2) Valuation

Imports are valued on a C.I.F. (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis whilst exports on a F.O.B. (Free On Board) basis.

C.I.F. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her imports of merchandise, other goods, etc. including all charges for transporting and insuring the goods from the country of exports to the given country but excluding the cost of unloading from the ship, aircraft etc. unless it is borne by the carrier.

F.O.B. value is the value in the market at the Customs frontier of a country of her exports of merchandise and other goods, including all costs of transporting the goods to the Customs frontier, export duties and the cost of loading the goods on to the carrier unless the latter cost is borne by the carrier.

(3) Classification

(i) Commodity Code

Commodities are coded according to the Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System Nomenclature (HS). However, for the purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate international comparison of trade by commodity data, the commodities are also classified according to the Standard International Trade Classification (Revision 3) or SITC Rev. 3. The HS and the SITC Rev. 3 are six and five digit codes respectively but have been extended to eight and seven digits to accommodate national requirements.

4. Terms of trade

The terms of trade index measures the price movements of exports relative to imports. It is the ratio of exports price index to import price index. A rise in this ratio indicates that the real purchasing power of exports has increased whilst a decrease indicates a drop in the purchasing power
