## **CONSUMER PRICE INDEX - 2001**

#### 1. Main movements in the Consumer Price Index in 2001

The Consumer Price Index (C.P.I.) which stood at 125.2 in December 2000, increased by +6.6 points (or 5.3%) during the year 2001 to reach 131.8 in December 2001 (*Table 1*). Monthly changes ranged between a fall of 0.2 point in March and an increase of 1.9 points in July 2001, averaging a monthly increase of 0.6 point over the year.

The net contribution of the main commodities that influenced the CPI in 2001 is given in *Table* 2. The main causes for the increase were:

- upward revision in VAT from 10% to 12% and increases in bus fares in July,
- higher rates for waste water as from the beginning of 2001,
- higher prices of meat, fish, milk, cooking oil, soft drinks, cigarettes, beer and stout, some medicinal products and cooking gas in the course of the year.

### 2. Changes in Major Commodity Group Sub-indices

*Table 3* shows the evolution of the major commodity group indices (sub-indices) from December 2000 to December 2001. All sub-indices registered increases between 1.6% and 10.6%.

The sub-index for "*Food and non alcoholic beverages*" went up by 5.5%. This is mainly attributable to price increases of beef (22.2%), frozen mutton (41.1%), chicken (7.2%), fish (5.9%), milk (11.1%), cooking oil (14.1%) and soft drinks (13.2%).

The sub-index for "Alcoholic beverages and tobacco" increased by 10.6%. The main reasons are higher prices of cigarettes (11.4%), beer and stout (15.6%), rum (5.6%) and wine (11.0%).

The "*Clothing and footwear*" sub-index rose by 1.6% largely as a result of price increases of footwear (4.8%).

The sub-index for "*Fuel and light*" moved up by 3.0% reflecting an increase in the price of cooking gas (10.1%) as from 15 November 2001.

The sub-index for "*Housing and household operations*" recorded an increase of 4.1%. This is attributable to higher rates for waste water (84.4%) and domestic services (5.7%), as well as price increases of household appliances (8.3%), housecleaning supplies (3.0%) and house repair materials (3.9%).

A rise of 5.3% was observed in the sub-index for "*Medical care and health expenses*" due to higher prices of some medicinal products (6.8%) and medical services (4.0%).

The "*Transport and communication*" sub-index increased by 5.1%. This was mainly the result of higher prices of gasoline (1.8%), due to an increase in VAT as from 1 July 2001, together with increases in bus fares (16.0%), motor vehicle insurance rates (12.8%) and repair charges (8.7%).

The sub-index for "*Recreation, entertainment, education and cultural services*" went up by 6.6%, mainly because of higher private tuition fees (8.5%), price increases of some recreational goods (5.1%) and higher prices of some newspapers (17.5%) during the first semester.

The sub-index for "*Miscellaneous goods and services*" rose by 2.0%. This is mainly attributable to higher prices of food consumed in bars and restaurants (2.1%) and personal care goods (0.6%).

#### **3.** Rate of inflation

The rate of inflation for calendar year 2001 works out to 5.4% compared to 4.2% for calendar year 2000. The rate of inflation for financial year 2000/2001 was 4.4% (*Table 4*).
