CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

1st Quarter 2002

1. Main movements in the Consumer Price Index – 1st Quarter 2002.

The Consumer Price Index (C.P.I) rose from 131.8 in December 2001 to reach 135.4 in March 2002 (*Table 1*), representing an increase of +3.6 points or 2.7% during the first quarter of 2002. As shown in *Table 2*, the main contributors to this rise were:

- price increases of meat, fish, milk, eggs fresh fruits, fresh vegetables and some other food products,
- higher rates for electricity and waste water,
- price increases of housecleaning supplies,
- higher fees for doctors, MBC Tv licence and private tuition.

2. Changes in Major Commodity Group Sub-indices.

Table 3 shows the evolution of the major commodity group indices (sub-indices) during the first quarter of 2002. Except for "Alcoholic beverages and tobacco", all sub-indices registered changes during the first three months of 2002.

The sub-index for "Food and non alcoholic beverages" increased by 4.6%. This was mainly due to increases in price indices of fresh vegetables (18.6%), fresh fruits (14.9%), eggs (31.1%), milk (2.2%), fish (1.5%) and meat (1.0%).

The sub-index for "Clothing and footwear" went up by 0.3% following price increases of some ready made clothing (0.4%).

The "Fuel and light" sub-index registered an increase of 8.2% as a result of higher rates for electricity (12.4%).

A rise of 2.3% was recorded in the sub-index for "Housing and household operations". This is attributable to an increase in waste water rates (47.5%) and higher prices of housecleaning supplies (4.1%).

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The sub-index for "Medical care and health expenses" increased by 1.6%, mainly

because of higher fees for doctors (3.9%) and price increases of some medicinal products

(1.0%).

The sub-index for "Transport and communication" decreased by 0.4%. This was the

net effect of lower prices of some types of cars (1.2%) and air tickets (4.8%), together with

higher charges for motor-vehicle repair (0.8%).

An increase of 5.6% was recorded in the sub-index for "Recreation, entertainment,

education and cultural services". This was mainly due to a rise in the fees for MBC Tv

licence (29.1%), private tuition (6.0%) and pre-primary schools (4.5%) as well as price

increases of school textbooks (2.2%).

The sub-index for "Miscellaneous goods and services" went up by 2.2% reflecting

price increases of some personal care goods (2.6%) and higher charges in bars and restaurants

(0.6%).

3. Rate of inflation

The rate of inflation for calendar year 2001 was 5.4% and that for financial year

2000/2001 was 4.4% (Table 4).
